NP ROBBINS: Shipmates, let's keep the chatter down when somebody is talking, please. PRP HATLIFF: Shipmate National

President, the credentials worksheet is located in delegate kit $F$ Yankee.

Authorized voting strength, 876.
Branches represented by delegates, 48. Votes represented by delegates, 455. Branches represented by proxy, 70. Votes registered by proxy, 323. Branches not registered, 29. Number of registered delegates, 89. Registered voting strength is 778. Votes not registered, 98. Two-thirds voting strength is 519 and majority vote is 390.

NP ROBBINS: Are there any questions? I have a motion, I have a second. Are there any questions on the second credentials report? Is there any questions on the second credentials report? No questions on the second credentials report. Say aye.
(Chorus of ayes.)
Any -- I messed up on that. Any nays?
(No response.)
Okay. Shipmate chairman, reverse phone call.

We will now commence receiving regular reports of the national convention committees.

And before $I$ go into that, we forgot to
do something yesterday. I want every newcomer, that this is the first time they have been to a national convention, to stand up. Thank you very much.

Now shipmates, now you have your hands
full meeting these new shipmates and leading them around and helping them out.

Chairman of the steering committee will
update the following: Shipmate John, are you doing the steering committee? Well I guess you are now. Do you have anything you want to report, John? I know I caught you off guard, but you guys have my script in the office.

S/M DAVIS: John Davis, Branch 181. Can
you hear me okay? Can you hear me now? Okay.
I just want to let you all know, we
talked yesterday about us getting a continuing resolution passed. Since we talked last, the Senate is about to pass a continuing resolution to keep the government open up until November 17. It's a basically clean resolution except that $I$
believe it has disaster relief in it and also aid for Ukraine. So that looked really good. Just to add to the fire, after that the Speaker of the House came out and said that they will not, if that bill passes the Senate, they will not vote on it. That's the latest word. Thank you. NP ROBBINS: Okay. Thank you, Shipmate John.

The first is the chairman's report, national convention committee on constitution, bylaws and resolutions. PNP Shipmate George Highland. Shipmate, whoever's cell phone that was, be honest and raise your hand. Ten dollars. Master at Arms?

> PNP HIGHLAND: Shall I begin? NP ROBBINS: Yes, sir. PNP HIGHLAND: Good afternoon. Shipmate National President, shipmates, this is the report of the constitution, bylaws and resolutions committee. The national convention committee on constitution, bylaws and resolutions met in the

South Pacific Room A of the Nugget Casino Hotel, Sparks, Nevada, on Wednesday, September 27, 2023 at 0900. Members present, myself as chair, Shipmate Past Regional National President Southwest John Quesnel, Past Regional President East Coast, Randy L. Phillip, Junior Past Regional President North Central, Maria A. Beeme, Past Regional President East Coast Donald A. Hoover, Past Regional President West Coast Richard Fetra (phonetic).

Visitors, Past Regional President North Central Marty Posekany who is also the national parliamentarian; Jerry Anger, regional president southeast; Chris Chapman, regional president, southwest; Christina Hitchcock, director of membership development; Curt Baker; Jerry Miranda, secretary, Branch 70 .

Has everyone had a chance to read the resolution on amending Section 202? I put some on the tables, I didn't have a whole lot of copies. For those of you who were at the
pre-convention national board of directors meeting, that was read into the record by the national executive director. Do you want me to read this?

NP ROBBINS: Yeah.
PNP HIGHLAND: This resolution from the national board of directors is to amend Section 201 of the constitution and bylaws. To make everything shortened here without reading a couple of paragraphs, what they're doing is removing the reference to enlisted requirement for membership in the Fleet Reserve Association and opening it up to all members eligible for membership, that being from $0-1$ to CNO.

Resolved, that Article 2, Section 202, C\&BL FRA be amended to read at follows: Section 202, composition of association. The FRA is an organization of current and all personnel who have many years of honorable service in the United States Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard, including the reserve component. All personnel
who are now serving or have served, regardless of rank, to be eligible for FRA membership. It is composed of the association and its subordinate branches chartered under and pursuant to its authority in a manner herein provided.

The CB\&L committee recommends approval. The rationale is it's time to open up membership to increase our membership and increase our revenue.

You are not voting on the recommendation, you're voting on the resolution.

NP ROBBINS: I have a motion on the floor. I need somebody to second it.

SPEAKER: (Unintelligible) Branch 238, second the motion.

NP ROBBINS: I have a motion on the floor and $I$ have a second. Open for discussion. Shipmate at the mic.

SPEAKER: (Inaudible) 93 percent of
veterans have prior enlisted service, have enlisted service. Rebranding our paperwork,
forms, et cetera would be a significant cost to our organization in these lean financial times. While I have little opinion one way or another, I would recommend that this be considered by the membership and before we take a vote on it, we have a short recess so the delegates could caucus.

NP ROBBINS: Shipmate Chaplain, will you please close the Bible?

NCHAP BAILEY: Shipmate National
President, the Bible is closed.
NP ROBBINS: Shipmates, we're going to take a ten-minute break so you can caucus.
(Recess.)
NP ROBBINS: Shipmate National Chaplain, would you please reopen the Bible?

NCHAP BAILEY: Shipmate National President, the Bible is open.

NP ROBBINS: Thank you, Shipmate Chaplain.

JPNP CAMPBELL: Shipmate National

President, may the record show that the junior past is still in the uniform of the day.

NP ROBBINS: You're going to remain that way. Shipmate George, are you ready to continue or -- okay. You're right. I'm sorry.

Is there any discussion? Any
discussion? Any discussion? Shipmate at the mic.

RPSE ANGER: Anger, delegate, Branch 112. I have a few things I want to put out about this. I've hear various things --

NP ROBBINS: Put your mic up please, talk into it.

RPSE ANGER: I've heard if we let officers in, they're going to cause problems. Do we have problems now with enlisted, yes. You're going to have problems with every group, you're going to have the good, the bad and the ugly no matter what you're going to do.

If you don't do something, look at the numbers. These are right off four quarters,
membership stats for ten years ago. We started at 63,000, we're down to 29,000 now, with 10,000
life members. So that means we've only got 19,000 annual members.

SPEAKER: (Inaudible) delegate, Branch
161, seconds the motion.
PNP HIGHLAND: It was a recommendation. NP ROBBINS: It was a recommendation. Shipmates, were going to do a rollcall vote, so get ready. Go ahead. I'm sorry, finish, Jerry.

RPSE ANGER: All right. Listen up, guys, come on, seriously. Like I'm saying, we've got 19,000 annual members. We had 239 branches back in '13, we have 159 branches now. We've lost over 80 branches, and as of the report, I think we lost what, two or three more.

We need people in this organization. It doesn't matter if they're officers, enlisted or whatever, we need the revenue, we need things that can help us. Don't take it as just they're going to cause problems, they're going to do
this, we have problems with everybody. Think about it and do what this organization needs to last for longer than three or four years.

Because the way we're going right now with these numbers, we've got three or four years and we will not have an FRA, we won't have to worry about it anymore. Thank you.

NP ROBBINS: Is there any more discussion? Shipmate at the mic.

S/M CORNELL: Shipmate national
president, Cornell, Branch 289, delegate. One thing I wanted to mention because it was brought up on our side, this resolution was not part of the original packet. There was only eight resolutions that were going to be discussed at this convention. This one was a last minute add on from the pre-board.

For those of you that are instructed by branches as proxy, remember, this was not part of that package, so that is not part of the proxy instructions that can be voted on whichever way
you want to go.

PNP HIGHLAND: Shipmates, I'd like to make a point on that. This is a companion resolution to 301, Constitution and Bylaws Resolution 301. Without one, the other one dies, vice versa. So keeping that in mind, how you were instructed to vote proxy or by your branch for Constitution and Bylaws Resolution number one, you may want to consider that as how you want to vote for this one. If they didn't want 301, well, they won't want this one. If they did want 301 , well, they do want this one. Without one or the other, it's a conflict of the constitution and bylaws and would be ruled out of order.

NP ROBBINS: Shipmate at the mic.

NED REID: NED Phillip Reed, Branch 181.

What $I$ just wanted to speak on is what we first heard, and that's about potentially the cost of rebranding. And true, there would be a cost, but keep in mind that it's a one-time cost, not a
continuing cost, and so the assumption is that by approving this and letting it go forward, the additional revenue that we would receive would completely cover that cost, and once that cost, that one-time cost is done, that would be the additional revenue to the FRA.

If you want to vote for it for some other reason one way or the other, that's fine, but from a financial point of view, the income, the potential income will cover the cost.

NP ROBBINS: That you don't know yet. Shipmate at the mic.

S/M SPENCER: Spencer, delegate, Branch 182. I've been a member of this organization for over 30 years, and I've always been taught that this organization represented enlisted personnel of the United States Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard, okay? Officers have an organization of their own called NNOA, okay? Can we join NNOA? No, we can't, but --

SPEAKER: Yes, you can.

NP ROBBINS: Hang on, folks, point of order. Continue.

S/M SPENCER: I don't see why we should, I honestly don't see why we should. We were founded as an enlisted organization representing Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard.

NP ROBBINS: Okay, thank you. Any other discussion? Any other discussion? Any other discussion? You're the last one.

S/M FLETCHER: Fletcher, delegate, Branch 59. We're one of the newer branches while we have a lot of old timers here. We had 103,835 members when we came in in 2003, 20 years ago. We're down to 29,000. I thought when I founded the branch in Wyoming that $I$ was doing it for all Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard, but I realized it was enlisted.

But I'm a realist and I would like to see the FRA continue, and I'm seeing personally, we do have officers within our branch, I don't see any difference, they want to be a shipmate
regardless of rank or which service they're in, and I think we ought to look at that right now. We're going to die on what we used to be, or we're going to keep going on what we could be. Thank you.

NP ROBBINS: Thank you, Shipmate. We will now proceed with the rollcall vote. NED?

Resolution number three. Be it resolved
that all prices, something, pertaining to dues for new members be held in suspension or held in abeyance or temporarily set aside for the period 11 November 2023 to 10 November 2025 for the purpose of celebrating the FRA Centennial under the heading of It's Our Birthday, But We Have a Gift for You. At the date 10 November 2025, all members' dues will automatically return to the rates in effect at the 2023 schedule prior to this resolution being accepted by the membership of FRA.

Now therefore, be it further resolved that Article 4, Section 401.B. 4 be amended as follows: Exception for the years 11 November 2023 to 10 November 2025, membership for first time new members for the first year of their membership will be awarded free on condition that new members pay $\$ 24$ for the second year to coincide with the centennial year 2024. Failure to completes the payment of $\$ 24$ will result in the applicant not being accepted into the membership of the FRA.

Recommendation from the committee.
We're asking the national president to rule this resolution is not in order at this time. The rationale is you cannot suspend a bylaw, you must amend it or delete it. Resolution number three is out of order. John?

NVP HANDZUK: Resolution number four, from the membership retention committee.

NP ROBBINS: Folks, let's keep the chatter down.

NVP HANDZUK: Resolved, that Article 4, Section 401.E, constitution and bylaws Fleet Reserve Association, be amended to read as follows: Section 401.E, members may be excused from payment of dues when payment would inflict significant financial hardship. Branches shall judge for their membership. The director membership development shall make the decision for membership at large role members. Branch secretary shall make an annual report in the month of March to the director of membership development listing the names and membership numbers of all eligible members affiliated with the branch. If no report is received, members previously reported as qualifying under this section will be terminated effective 30 June unless payment of dues has been received by the finance officer.

The member services department shall notify the branch secretary during the month of July of those terminated members. The branch
shall be assessed an administrative fee for each shipmate in this category, starting March 31st, 2024. The amount of the assessment will be half of the annual dues in effect each year.

Recommendation from the committee. We recommend disapproval and returning this to membership for better clarification.

My question being a dumb ship's cook when I read this is, the branch shall be assessed an administrative fee for each shipmate in this category. You're talking about dropping somebody, then you're talking about an administrative fee. I know I'm confused. Is the fee for somebody who has been dropped or because they're still carrying somebody who is considered having a hard ship?

Again, the recommendation is to disapprove, return this to membership for better clarification, and I so move.

NP ROBBINS: Resolution number four will be returned to membership for better
clarification.

NVP HANDZUK: Okay. Thank you.
Resolution number five, membership and retention committee.

Resolved, that this amendment become -oops, I'm sorry.

Resolved, that Article 4, Section 401.M be deleted, and those members already classified as 8540 members will be grandfathered to maintain their current status.

Recommendation from the committee is to approve. The rationale is that the reduced cost of longevity pins at national headquarters.

Budget and finance committee recommends approval.
NP ROBBINS: Resolution number five --
did you move it?
NVP HANDZUK: I recommended approval.
NP ROBBINS: I have a recommendation.
(Inaudible comments from the floor.)
Okay, thank you. I have a motion and I
have a second. Is there any discussion?

Discussion? Any discussion? All those in favor, say aye.
(Chorus of ayes.)
All those opposed? So be it, passes.
NVP HANDZUK: Resolution number six.
Resolved, that Article 4, Sections 405.A through G be amended to read as follows: That's a lot of stuff to read; do you want me to read it all, or have you read it? Okay.

Recommendation from the committee is to approve. The rationale is that the increased revenue will sustain the life membership program, and I so move.

SPEAKER: (Inaudible) second.
NP ROBBINS: I have a motion on the
floor and I have a second. Any discussion? Any discussion? Being there is no discussion -shipmate at the mic.

S/M SELTER: Joy Selter, Branch 236, I
have a question. Currently it says active duty members, but with the new resolution there's no
active duty, so it just depends on their age when they join?

NVP HANDZUK: Under the IRS life
longevity which is based on age, active duty is not an age, so it cannot stand.

S/M SELTER: Thank you.
NP ROBBINS: All right. Last call. Any discussion? All those in favor, say aye. (Chorus of ayes.)

All those opposed? Oh well. It passes.
NVP HANDZUK: Resolution number seven. Resolved, that Article 7, Section 701.F, Section 701.G, Section 701.H in C\&BL FRA be added, as follows:

Section 701.F, the national board of directors of the Fleet Reserve Association may put forward nominations for national office. Nominations or endorsements shall be forwarded to and received by the national executive director in accordance with the provisions of Section 611 and subject to altered processing in the event
the NED recuses him or herself due to potential conflicts of interest in evaluating nominees. Nominees for national executive director may include members or nonmembers of the Fleet Reserve Association. Candidates for NED shall have demonstrated relevant professional experience and skills commensurate with
performing senior executive administrative and management functions at national headquarters, and in maintaining relationships with the national board of directors and other national officers.

Section 701.H. In the event of two or more equivalently qualified candidates for NED, and in consultation with the external professional advisors retained for the purposes of finding and reviewing candidates for NED, the candidate eligible for or already maintaining membership in the Fleet Reserve Association shall be favored.

Recommendation from the committee, the
national president rules that it is not in order. Rationale is that it is in conflict with Article 7, Section 701.B.

NP ROBBINS: Shipmate at the mic.
RVPSC TALBOT: Talbot, delegate, Branch
159, future planning committee chair.
The future planning committee supports
this resolution because we're looking to the
future and with our current trend in losing membership, we see a day where we may not have a qualified person amongst our ranks to be the national executive director. Therefore, we proposed this amendment.

We currently have a national executive director that's a shipmate. This is not an urgent case this year. We also understand that our bylaws revision process is very complex and even though you do a lot of diligent research to help you wind the revision through various levels for approval, sometimes somebody finds a glitch and it's returned for correction by the committee
at the national convention. We will see this next year with this loophole cleared up. The future planning committee supports this rejection.

NP ROBBINS: Okay, don't throw the mic on the floor. Shipmate at the front mic.

SPEAKER: Shipmate National President, I believe we need a second before we have the discussion.

NP ROBBINS: No, there is no motion on the floor. It was recommended as -- you're not in order. I ruled it not in order, but I'll -you're up again.

NVP HANDZUK: Resolution number eight. The national board of directors is authorized to advertise the position of national executive director no more than one year prior to the end of the national executive director's term. In the even of a vacancy or upon receipt of information that a vacancy in the office of national director will occur, the national board
of directors shall appoint a designated
representative to advertise the position, review resumes and make a recommendation to the national board of directors. The national board of directors is empowered to hire the best qualified candidate.

Recommendation from the committee is the national president should rule this as not in order because you just ruled the other one out of order, and this is a conflict with 701.D.

NP ROBBINS: Resolution number eight is out of order.

NVP HANDZUK: Shipmate national president, that concludes my report. I thank you for the opportunity to serve our shipmates. I want to thank the committee for a job well done. I also want to thank those shipmates who came to the meeting and helped us reach conclusions opined on these things, they did a fine job, all of them, and this has been fun. Thank you.

NP ROBBINS: Thank you, Shipmate. Yes,
sir? Would you like the opportunity?

SPEAKER: No, I just don't want Virgil getting near that microphone.

NP ROBBINS: Well, it would be nice if
you turned your microphone on so people could here you. All right.

Cynthia Banks, an honorary member; Shipmate John Fox, Branch 137; Shipmate Paul Rogers, Branch 174; and Shipmate Robert Olivera, Regional President Elect, 293.

Of the eight regions, we only had two reports for hospital, welfare and rehabilitation, from the branches, or those regions rather.

> Hours spent visiting, assisting ill or
incapacitated members, 555 hours. Miles driven visiting, assisting ill or incapacitated members, 3,780.5 miles. Hours spent assisting needy families or shipmates, 70 hours. Miles driven assisting needy families of shipmates, 179 hours, excuse me, 179 miles. Hours of volunteer work performed at hospitals by shipmates, 76.5 hours. Widows assisted, 12. Number of shipmates donating blood, 21. Number of rituals performed by shipmates, 110. There was a lot of discussion about rituals and we'll get into that a little bit later.

Contributions made to the FRA disaster
relief fund from branches, \$2,750 and from members there was none. The national president and national board approved zero requests for disaster relief expenditures.

That's the reports I got, there were none, from two regions. The other six, where's the other six, and they're the areas that got disaster relief, right? Okay.

And the national president, national board approved zero requests for welfare and rehabilitation expenditures, totaling zero. Okay.

Moving on to the last page of the book: First place. Group one, Branch 91. Group two, first place, 302. Group three, Branch 293. Group four, Branch 17. Group five, Branch 34.

Second place. Group one, 289. Group two, Branch 22. Group three, 163. Group four, 382. Group five, 251.

Third place. Group one, Branch 60.

Third place, group two, 97. Third place, group three, Branch 89. Group four, third place, Branch 112. Group five, third place, Branch 62.

The committee selected the following shipmate for national shipmate of the year, Shipmate Joseph Bland, Branch 163, Valley of the Sun. Okay.

The following recommendations from the committee: Regional presidents need to insure that first place winners in each -- excuse me. First place winners in each membership group in each region are forwarded to the national committee on hospital, welfare and rehabilitation immediately following the regional conventions. Do not hand carry the reports to the national convention, although there were some that were hand carried.

Other things we found, right when you're writing up the reports -- wait a minute, excuse me. Write up, when you're recommending a shipmate it's for what they've done that year,
not what they've done for the last ten years, okay? It's for every year that they're doing things, all right? If you write somebody up for shipmate of the year, make sure it's for the year.

Regional total mileage for all branches, we've already discussed that, we've only got two regions out of eight that submitted reports.

Branch chairmen need to fill in all the blanks on the paper. Even if it's a zero, fill it in.

Recommend updating of the manual for hospital, welfare and rehabilitation. The names and the numbers on the top of the form, otherwise they get disqualified. There was one branch that didn't put their group number in.

Lastly, proper documentation, photographs, that kind of thing can be submitted. Okay.

I mean, I hated to do this to the four people that I did today, but I had no choice. I had to get somebody to pick the ball up and finish the job. And I thank you, Paul, because yours was the hardest. I burned off 180 pages on my computer in the room. So I want to thank you
again, okay?

then we'll adjourn, or recess until tomorrow.
Shipmate NED, would you come up and please make your remarks?

NED REID: Shipmates, I just didn't want anyone to miss this opportunity. The individuals from VA have been set up. If you recall yesterday we talked about actually having one-on-one conversations.
