1 NP FULTON: Shipmate Chaplain.

2 NCHAP GUNTHER: Shipmate National  
3 President, the Bible is open.

4 NP FULTON: Thank you. I will now  
5 announce the convening of the fourth business  
6 session of the 93rd Convention of the FRA. Is my  
7 credentials chairman here? Not yet. All right,  
8 good. We we'll get these knocked out right now.  
9 All right, shipmates, the finance officer is  
10 going around the room, or actually he's going to  
11 give them to the master at arms. The one are the  
12 2020 resolutions or NBRs that were acted on last  
13 year and never had the opportunity to be ratified  
14 at a national convention, we will take these up  
15 under business. The presiding officer needs to  
16 have one.

17 Okay. While those are being passed out,  
18 the credentials chairman is here and I am going  
19 to request him, not only do you have the fourth  
20 credentials report, but I also need any changes  
21 to branches that have registered since you gave

1 the initial branch report on the first  
2 credentials report as far as who's represented  
3 and who's not, any change to that.

4 PRPNW LAZZARETTI: Good afternoon,  
5 shipmates, this is the fourth credentials report  
6 for the 93rd National Convention. As of today at  
7 1300, all the numbers from the third stay the  
8 same. Authorized voting strength is 975. The  
9 number of branches represented by delegates, 41.  
10 Number of votes represented by delegates, 397.  
11 Number of branches registered by proxy, 91.  
12 Number of votes registered by proxy, 481. The  
13 number of branches not registered, 26, with an  
14 addendum of Branch 188 without delegates or  
15 proxies on their credentials, out of 159  
16 branches. The number of delegates registered for  
17 this convention is 88. The registered voting  
18 strength is 878. Number of votes not registered,  
19 97. Two-thirds vote is 586. Majority vote is  
20 440.

21 When you are ready, I will begin listing

1 off the branches that are not registered  
2 whatsoever.

3 NP FULTON: This will reflect changes to  
4 the initial branch listing report that was done  
5 with the first credentials report.

6 PRPNW LAZZARETTI: Branch 12, Branch 29,  
7 these are not registered or represented. 63, 73,  
8 74, 102, 103, 118 -- 118, shipmates. 123, 145,  
9 162, 171 -- Shipmate Gunther, should I go any  
10 slower? 147, don't exist, I'll bring up an NBR  
11 on that one, I believe. All right. Shipmate  
12 Paul, are you caught up with 188? Okay. 186,  
13 registered, no, not registered. Okay. All  
14 right, after 171 we have 186 and 188. Flip the  
15 page.

16 210, 219 -- I will double check 219.  
17 Apologies, shipmates, that is a typo, it should  
18 be 217 versus 219. 227, 247, 248, 250, 259, 263,  
19 273 -- 273, I just turned the page. All right,  
20 292. 307, 339, 346. And just remember, Branch  
21 188 has no delegates or proxies. Branch 315

1 surrendered their charter per NBR 29-18. And 13  
2 is not registered. No.

3 S/M CUNNINGHAM: Cunningham, Branch14.  
4 I'm trying to figure out, I went through all the  
5 ones that I crossed out on the very first day.  
6 Who showed up? I mean --

7 PRPNW LAZZARETTI: We did have the  
8 delegates from Branch 13 show up, they had not  
9 signed a proxy form according to the ones I had  
10 on hand. That changed between reports because I  
11 was presented with a signed copy, so it went to  
12 delegates, from delegates to proxy, and when the  
13 shipmate arrived it went back from proxy to  
14 delegates for Branch 13. There has been very  
15 little changes, it's just been switching between  
16 delegates and proxies and it's just been minor  
17 numbers back and forth. I will have my master  
18 list with me when we start votes if there are any  
19 additional questions.

20 Shipmate National President, shipmates,  
21 I move that the fourth credentials report be

1 received.

2 NCHAP GUNTHER: Shipmate National  
3 President, Gunther, Delegate, 182, seconds.

4 NP FULTON: There's a motion and a  
5 second to receive the fourth credentials report.  
6 Any further discussion? All in favor?

7 (Chorus of ayes.)

8 Opposed? Carried.

9 Okay. Does everybody have a copy of the  
10 national board resolutions? Can we make sure  
11 that we get at least one per table, so that --  
12 okay.

13 As we did with the 2021 NBRs, we will go  
14 down through these on a proceed basis and  
15 remember, I was only vice president that year so  
16 if you have any questions, Junior Past will be  
17 glad to answer them. All right.

18 NBR 1-20, 2-20, 3-20, 4-20, 5-20, 6-20,  
19 7-20, 8-20, 9-20, 10-20, 11-20, 12-20, 13-20,  
20 14-20, 15-20, 16-20, 17-20. 17-20 revised to  
21 ratify the appointments of the chairman and the

1 members in the national committee on budget and  
2 finance.

3 18-20, 19-20, 20-20, 21-20, 22-20,  
4 23-20, let's not go there. 24-20, 25-20, 26-20,  
5 27-20, 28-20, 29-20, 30-20, 31-20, 32-20, 33-20,  
6 34-20, 35-20, 36-20, 37-20, 38-20, 39-20, and  
7 40-20. Those were all of the 2020 NBRs.

8 Shipmate at the rear mic.

9 PRPNC COMBS: Shipmate National  
10 President, Combs, Delegate, Branch 161, moves  
11 that these be approved.

12 NP FULTON: Ratified.

13 PRPNC COMBS: Ratified rather.

14 NP FULTON: Absolutely. If there's a  
15 motion on the floor, I need a second.

16 S/M DEAN: National President, Dean,  
17 Branch 32, I second it.

18 NP FULTON: All right, we have a motion  
19 on the floor and a second to ratify the NBRs from  
20 2020 due to lack of having a national convention.  
21 Any further discussion? All in favor?

1 (Chorus of ayes.)

2 Opposed? Motion carried.

3 All right. We will now have the report  
4 of the chairman from veterans service, Shipmate  
5 Huffer. This should take care of all the  
6 standing committee reports.

7 S/M HUFFER: Good afternoon, shipmates.  
8 The national committee on veterans service  
9 convened earlier in this room and I have their  
10 results.

11 For group one, there was none. Oh,  
12 present was myself, Agino (phonetic) in place of  
13 David Sharp, Russell Miller, William Matthews,  
14 Thomas Flanik, and we had three visitors, Dave  
15 Lord, Paul Gunther and Paula Falu.

16 For group one, there was none. Group  
17 two, first place, Branch 22. Group three, first  
18 place, Branch 115; second place, Branch 161;  
19 third place, Branch 117.

20 Yes, for group one, there were no places  
21 at all, first, second or third. Group two, first



1 place was Branch 22, no second or third place.  
2 Group three, first place was Branch 115; second  
3 place, Branch 161; third place, Branch 117. For  
4 group four, first place was Branch 382; second  
5 place, Branch 31; third place, Branch 298. For  
6 group five, first place, Branch 281; second  
7 place, Branch 295; no third place.

8           Everybody get that? And the shipmate of  
9 the year, Tom Flanik. Excuse me? Oh yes, Branch  
10 382, Tom Flanik, Branch 382, shipmate of the  
11 year, F-L-A-N-I-K. I move that this report be  
12 received.

13           NCHAP GUNTHER: Shipmate National  
14 President, Gunther, Delegate, 182, seconds.

15           NP FULTON: Okay, the chairman requested  
16 the report be received, it's been seconded.  
17 Thank you, Shipmate Huffer, and that's all we  
18 need. Thank you.

19           (Applause.)

20           The recommendations from the committee,  
21 there wasn't any. Oh, recommendations, was there

1 recommendations? Yeah, you need to -- shipmates,  
2 Shipmate Huffer is amending the report because  
3 there was recommendations from the committee and  
4 she is getting those.

5 Do you have any other correspondence to  
6 read, FO?

7 Okay, I have an announcement from the  
8 convention committee. The bus leaving for the  
9 casino trip tonight will leave at 1700 from out  
10 in front of the lobby, and return at 2100. The  
11 bus is a 23 capacity bus and I believe right now  
12 there's only about 12 or 13 people signed up so  
13 if you're interested, once it achieves capacity,  
14 that's it.

15 Shipmate at the rear mic.

16 PNP BLACKBURN: Shipmate National  
17 President, Blackburn, Delegate, Branch 8,  
18 chairman, budget and finance committee. I have a  
19 couple of questions that do impact the finances  
20 of the association, though they may be minimal.

21 My question is, when we ratified NBR

1 26-20 with the contract with Crazy Cal's Graphics  
2 by the shipmate whose product you buy, et cetera,  
3 are ship's store. My question is, what type of  
4 return is the association receiving on the funds  
5 that are expended to the ship's store and are we  
6 receiving any.

7 And the second question is, and I  
8 understand the problems that have been coming  
9 around from Keystone for our covers, and I  
10 understand that, what is it, American Heroes is  
11 now an authorized provider for the association.  
12 I don't know if I missed it, and if so, I would  
13 like to be informed when was that approved by the  
14 national board, what resolution is that and where  
15 was it ratified.

16 NP FULTON: The American Heroes Company  
17 has been authorized to do FRA hats for back when,  
18 from back when I was a regional president in  
19 2012-2013, because that's where I got my hat  
20 from.

21 PNP BLACKBURN: Unfortunately, I, the

1 one that I am wearing is also from there because  
2 the one that I had originally had been stolen and  
3 they were able to provide it, but they were still  
4 not authorized, and like I said, when and where  
5 were they ever authorized to be an authorized  
6 vendor for the association, and we need to, we  
7 actually need to investigate that, because for  
8 many many years they really were not.

9 (Comment off microphone.)

10 I understand, but American Heroes  
11 replaced Lancaster, who was also a provider, but  
12 after Lancaster went out of business, American  
13 Heroes showed back up but they were never  
14 authorized by the board of directors to provide  
15 association covers.

16 NP FULTON: All right. What we're going  
17 to have to do there, because this is unbeknownst  
18 to me and obviously occurred way before my regime  
19 as national president, is the national  
20 headquarters needs to prepare an NBR to authorize  
21 American Heroes Manufacturing in addition to

1 Keystone for permission to use the logo, the FRA  
2 triangle to make covers.

3 Shipmate at the front mic.

4 PRPNW BURKE: Peg Burke, committee  
5 cochair. As to the information somebody was  
6 asking on the shuttle bus to the Northern Quest,  
7 since it doesn't cost us anything and I have  
8 misplaced my sheet, it holds 23, so show up with  
9 a receipt ticket.

10 NP FULTON: Okay. On your first  
11 question, Shipmate Blackburn, the ship's store  
12 proceeds, there is no proceeds going to the  
13 national headquarters for items sold from the  
14 ship's store. The items that are on sale in the  
15 ship's store are being sold at cost from the  
16 vendor, national headquarters is not making  
17 anything, and that was approved when the board  
18 resolution, that was part of the discussion in  
19 the board resolution, was that there -- isn't  
20 that right, Junior Past, that there was no markup  
21 on prices being sold by the vendor when we

1 authorized them to sell out of the ship's store.  
2 The company itself is making profit, the FRA is  
3 not marking up their costs as part of the ship's  
4 store, and that is Shipmate Blackburn's question,  
5 was the FRA making any money on it.

6 PNP BLACKBURN: Shipmate National  
7 President, Blackburn, Delegate, Branch 8.  
8 Further on this, what you stated is the listing  
9 in the ship's store for the FRA and the prices  
10 that the vendor has established and you're saying  
11 that there is no, granted that the FRA is not  
12 rising the prices, but I still feel that if they  
13 are doing business with them and our shipmates  
14 are purchasing from this individual, the FRA  
15 should receive something back even if it is a  
16 minimal amount, say five percent off of whatever  
17 the cost is. We can't guarantee that what he is  
18 charging us is actual wholesale price.

19 NP FULTON: When that resolution was  
20 passed, it was the NBR, the board acted on it and  
21 the fact that the price list was the price list

1 provided by the vendor and there was no markup  
2 from the FRA.

3 PNP BLACKBURN: Yes, I understand that  
4 the FRA does not mark that up. However, we are  
5 still not, you know, as I state, the shipmates,  
6 you're putting it out there for the shipmates to  
7 do business with this person; however, he is not  
8 in, he is not rescinding anything back to the FRA  
9 for our business, this is the point I'm trying to  
10 make.

11 NP FULTON: There's no royalty payments  
12 and the board knew that. All we did was agree  
13 with the vendor to open or provide materials for  
14 a ship's store as a convenience to the members.

15 PNP BLACKBURN: Shipmate National  
16 President, Blackburn, Delegate, Branch 8. I want  
17 it on record that I oppose the ratification of  
18 that NBR. I understand, but I still can stand on  
19 the record saying I opposed.

20 NP FULTON: Yep, noted.

21 Shipmate Credentials Chair, he is going

1 to make sure that everybody has the correct  
2 information branch wise.

3 PRPNW LAZZARETTI: All right, shipmates,  
4 a couple things ran weird with me when we talked  
5 about 219 earlier so I ran up and grabbed my  
6 printout. I'm going to start at the top of the  
7 page and we're going to go quickly down through  
8 any branches that were affected by NBRs or we did  
9 not have credentials received.

10 Branch 6 merged with Branch 212 per NBR  
11 16-20. Branch 12, Chicago, no credentials. Do  
12 you have 25 and 28 on your lists? Okay. 29,  
13 Bremerton, Washington, no credentials received.  
14 Do you have Branch 46 on there? Charter revoked  
15 per NBR 22-21. 51, charter revoked per NBR  
16 19-21. Branch 63, Lewisport Valley, no  
17 credentials received. You do not have 64 or 71  
18 on your list. 63, no credentials received. 73,  
19 no credentials received. Branch 74,  
20 Olongapo, PI, no credentials received. You do  
21 not have 77 on your lists. Branch 102, Sunshine,



1 no credentials received. Branch 103, Yokosuka,  
2 Japan, no credentials received. Branch 109  
3 merged with Branch 102 per NBR 20-21. 118,  
4 Southwest Florida, no credentials received.  
5 Branch 123, Morganton, no credentials received.  
6 You do not have 132 on your list, correct? 141,  
7 charter surrendered per NBR 20-20. Branch 145,  
8 Lincoln, Nebraska, no credentials received.  
9 Branch 147, charter surrendered per NBR 24-20.  
10 Branch 162, New Orleans, no credentials received.  
11 Branch 171, Southern Luzon, Philippines, no  
12 credential received. Do you have Branch 175  
13 listed? Okay. Branch 186, Citrus, no  
14 credentials. Branch 210, Milton, Florida --  
15 yeah, 188, we received it; however, there was no  
16 delegates or proxies listed. Branch 210, Milton,  
17 Florida, no credentials received. 215 was  
18 surrendered per NBR 17-19. Branch 217, charter  
19 surrendered per NBR 20-21. Branch 219, no  
20 credentials received. I do not have a proxy on  
21 hand right now, I will double check the binder.

1 I will check. 227, no credentials received. You  
2 should not have 229 or 234. All right. 245,  
3 charter surrendered per NBR 23-21. 247, Dogopan  
4 City, Philippines, no credentials received.  
5 Branch 248, Hampden County, no credentials  
6 received. Branch 250, Sarasota, no credentials  
7 received. 255 merged with Branch 269 per NBR  
8 38-20. 257, you should not have. 259, Cape Fear  
9 Region, no credentials received. 260, merged  
10 with Branch 90 per NBR 40-20. 263, Cape  
11 Canaveral, no credentials received. 273, Fargo,  
12 North Dakota, no credentials received. 282,  
13 charter surrendered per NBR 39-20. You should  
14 not have 285. 291, charter surrendered per NBR  
15 12-21. 292, Walter Hatch, no credentials  
16 received. Branch 307, Old Naval Home, no  
17 credentials received. 315 was per NBR 28-18, or  
18 29-18 -- 29-18. 324, you should not have. Okay.  
19 339, Albany, no credentials received. 346,  
20 St. Andrews Bay, no credentials received. I will  
21 assume that you do not have Branches 358 and 369

1 on your list. Okay.

2 Charter suspended for 369 per NBR 24-19.

3 And Baton Rouge, Wabash Valley and Gem State,

4 which is the three last ones have, are here,

5 either by proxy or delegate.

6 Does this answer all your questions

7 outside of John Chapelle Branch 219?

8 PNP BLACKBURN: Shipmate National

9 President.

10 NP FULTON: Shipmate at the rear mic.

11 PNP BLACKBURN: Blackburn, Delegate,

12 Branch 8. If there is a delegate or a proxy here

13 for Branch 219, have them stand. If they're not

14 in the room, there's nobody to vote for it, so

15 that should resolve your issue on the branch

16 having any votes.

17 NP FULTON: Shipmate at the rear mic.

18 RPEC JONES: Jones, Delegate, Branch 93,

19 East Coast Regional President. I did not receive

20 a credential report from Branch 219.

21 NP FULTON: 219 has no votes. The

1 regional president doesn't have a proxy on them.

2 PRPNW LAZZARETTI: I move that my  
3 amended report be received.

4 S/M BEEME: Shipmate National President,  
5 Beeme, Branch 32, second.

6 NP FULTON: Moved and seconded that the  
7 amended report of the credentials chair for the  
8 fourth credentials report with a complete listing  
9 of active or proxy branches be received. Any  
10 further discussion? All in favor?

11 (Chorus of ayes.)

12 Opposed?

13 VOICE: No.

14 NP FULTON: Noted.

15 All right. With that business  
16 conducted, we are -- oh, Noel, Shipmate Huffer,  
17 are you ready to issue your amended VSO report?  
18 Good, let's get it done and then we can move on  
19 to the final order of business, new business.

20 S/M HUFFER: I have the recommendations.  
21 Shipmate Huffer, National Headquarters, Branch

1 24. I have the recommendations for the amended  
2 report. We discussed separating the grading  
3 categories for the VSO and the VAVS because  
4 they're two different reports, and to create a  
5 grading rubric for the grading process so it's  
6 more transparent.

7 NP FULTON: Go ahead.

8 NCHAP GUNTHER: Gunther, Delegate, 182.  
9 I would like to second that move as amended.

10 NP FULTON: All right, motion on the  
11 floor and seconded to accept the amended report  
12 of the VSO/VAVS chair. Any further discussions?  
13 Shipmate at the rear mic.

14 RPNENE ZINO: Zino, Branch 23, Delegate.  
15 We also talked about at our committee, if you  
16 remember, that we should have a template for all  
17 the committees so that we get a fair grading  
18 sheet and there's a grading standard. Paula,  
19 Shipmate Paula has one and I think if all the  
20 committee chairs had one and we had a standard  
21 format, everything would be graded equally at the

1 same level, same plane. Thank you, Shipmate  
2 National President.

3 NP FULTON: Noted, thanks. Thank you,  
4 Shipmate Huffer.

5 Shipmate at the front mic.

6 S/M VOGEL: Delegate Vogel, Branch 294.  
7 On the last shipmate that proposed those  
8 standardizations of the committee evaluations, if  
9 you could get those standardized and pass them  
10 down to the regions, we would appreciate that  
11 because we're having a little bit of debate in  
12 the region over everybody making up their own  
13 grading sheet.

14 NP FULTON: Historically from my point  
15 of view is the committees themselves and the  
16 chairs of the committees should be the ones that  
17 establish the grading criteria for that  
18 committee. I don't know whether or not the same  
19 criteria is going to work from one committee to  
20 the next based on the requirements of the  
21 committee, so a standardized rating sheet because

1 of the differences in the committees, I don't  
2 believe is going to be something that, each  
3 committee is going to have to operate separately.

4 S/M VOGEL: I completely understand  
5 that. Each committee will have their own grading  
6 sheet and criteria, but there should be a  
7 standard with each committee to be passed down to  
8 the regions.

9 NP FULTON: Yes, and if the committees  
10 can get together and work and come up with a  
11 standardized grading sheet for that committee and  
12 get it approved, then that's the way we should be  
13 going with this. Thanks.

14 All right, is there any other new  
15 business? Oh, the FO has something. Hang on.

16 PRPEC PHILLIPS: Point of order.

17 NP FULTON: Shipmate at the rear mic.

18 PRPEC PHILLIPS: Phillips, Delegate,  
19 Branch 182. National President, there's still a  
20 motion on the floor.

21 NP FULTON: No. It was receiving an

1 amended report. It was motioned and seconded;  
2 there's no vote required, for receiving a report  
3 there's no vote, and it was just an amended  
4 report.

5 PRPEC PHILLIPS: Thank you.

6 FO REID: Finance Officer Reid. Just a  
7 quick note. On the schedule it shows 1630 to  
8 1830 a convention wrap-up workshop, that is  
9 cancelled. What we're going to do instead is  
10 send out surveys and we will send them out both  
11 hard copy and through email, and what we would  
12 like you to do is to just grade things, and have  
13 an area for comments, and I think that that's a  
14 better way to do it than to sit down and talk  
15 about it. So that's cancelled, 1630 to 1830.

16 NP FULTON: Is there any other new  
17 business? We will proceed to elections.  
18 Shipmates, we will now proceed to the election of  
19 the national president. Shipmates, National Vice  
20 President James W. Campbell's will be read, and  
21 I'm only going to read the resolved portions.



1                   Nominating resolution for national  
2 president from Chesapeake Branch 40.

3                   Resolved, that Chesapeake Branch 40,  
4 FRA, at a regularly scheduled meeting on 17 March  
5 2021, a quorum being present, did with great  
6 pride and pleasure vote unanimously to place the  
7 name of James Campbell in nomination for the  
8 office of National President, Fleet Reserve  
9 Association, for the association year 2021-2022.

10                  And be it further resolved that  
11 Chesapeake Branch 40 sincerely solicits the  
12 support and endorsement of all branches of the  
13 Fleet Reserve Association for the candidacy of  
14 National Vice President James Campbell for the  
15 office of National President, FRA.

16                  Signed, Richard DeHaven, President,  
17 Chesapeake Branch 40, George Smith, Secretary.

18                  You have heard the resolution.  
19 Everybody knows that Shipmate Campbell is not  
20 present at the convention. I am in receipt of a  
21 letter from Shipmate Campbell which I will read

1 now.

2 September 20, 2021, James Campbell, FRA  
3 NVP. National President Mick Fulton: I am  
4 writing you this letter to state that if I am  
5 elected as the new national president, 2021-2022  
6 association year, that it will be my honor to  
7 accept the position of national president. Yours  
8 in loyalty, protection and service, James  
9 Campbell, FRA National Vice President.

10 Are there any other nominations for  
11 national vice president, or national president?  
12 Are there any other nominations for national  
13 president? Are there any other nominations for  
14 national president? Nominations are closed.

15 The parliamentarian would like to say  
16 something.

17 NPAR BEEBE: I move that Shipmate  
18 Campbell be elected by acclamation.

19 (Applause.)

20 NP FULTON: All right. For the  
21 installation ceremony, Shipmate Past Regional

1 President East Coast Randy Phillips is going to  
2 be Shipmate National President Elect Campbell's  
3 proxy.

4 (Applause.)

5 Okay. I want to remind everybody that  
6 nominating speeches are limited as per Standing  
7 Rule 3.S to five minutes. Seconding speeches are  
8 limited to two minutes. Number of seconding  
9 speeches for each candidate may not exceed three.

10 We will now proceed to national vice  
11 president. We have one nominating resolution for  
12 national vice president. I will read the  
13 resolved portions.

14 Resolved, Annapolis Branch 024 at a  
15 regularly scheduled meeting on June 16th, 2021, a  
16 quorum being present, did with great pride and  
17 pleasure render a majority vote with one vote  
18 withheld to place the name of Donald A. Hoover  
19 for nomination to the office of National Vice  
20 President, Fleet Reserve Association for the year  
21 2021-2022.

1                   And be it further resolved, Annapolis  
2   Branch 024 sincerely solicits the support and  
3   endorsement of all branches of the Fleet Reserve  
4   Association for the candidacy of Past Regional  
5   President East Coast Donald A. Hoover for the  
6   office of National President, 2021-2022, or  
7   National Vice President, I missed the vice.  
8   Thanks for the correction.

9                   John Goff, President, Annapolis Branch  
10   24, Pleasala "Penny" Collins, Secretary and  
11   Treasurer, Annapolis Branch 24.

12                  Are there any other nominations for  
13   national vice president?

14                  PNP BLACKBURN: Shipmate National  
15   President.

16                  NP FULTON: Shipmate at the rear mic.

17                  PNP BLACKBURN: Blackburn, Delegate,  
18   Branch 8, Past National President. It is my  
19   honor to nominate Past Regional President

1 PNP JOHNSON: Shipmate National  
2 President, Johnson, Delegate, I'll second that  
3 one.

4 NP FULTON: All right, we have a motion  
5 and a second. Shipmate Hanzek, do you accept the  
6 nomination?

7 PRPSE HANZEK: Shipmate National  
8 President, at this time I respectfully decline.  
9 However, I appreciate the confidence, I will be  
10 back next year.

11 (Applause.)

12 NP FULTON: Thank you, Shipmate Hanzek.  
13 Are there any other nominations?

14 PRPSE THOMAS: Shipmate National  
15 President.

16 NP FULTON: Shipmate at the front mic.

17 PRPSE THOMAS: Shipmate J.J. Thomas,  
18 Branch 126, Delegate. I wish to nominate James  
19 Robbins for the office of National Vice President  
20 for the year 21-22 for this organization. Thank  
21 you.

1                   S/M VOGEL: Vogel, Delegate, Branch 294,  
2 second.

3                   NP FULTON: We have a motion and a  
4 second. Shipmate Robbins, do you accept the  
5 nomination?

6                   PRPSE ROBBINS: Yes, I do.

7                   NP FULTON: Okay. We have a second  
8 nominee for the office of national vice  
9 president, Shipmate Past Regional President  
10 Southeast James "Robbie" Robbins.

11                   Are there any other nominations for  
12 national vice president? Are there any other  
13 nominations for national vice president? Are  
14 there any other nominations for national vice  
15 president? Nominations are closed.

16                   At this time I am going to give the  
17 opportunity for both candidates to address the  
18 assembly, remember the time limit of five minutes  
19 per candidate, and then we will recess following.

20                   The tally committee chair for this  
21 convention is Past Regional President North

1 Central Marty Posekany. Each candidate, each  
2 candidate needs to identify to the tally chair  
3 who their tally candidate is going to be.

4 Shipmate Past Regional President East  
5 Coast Hoover, I will give you the first  
6 opportunity since your nominating resolution was  
7 submitted.

8 PRPEC HOOVER: Thank you, Shipmate  
9 National President. Shipmates, I've been in this  
10 association for 31 years and my first four years  
11 I didn't do anything, I sat and watched what  
12 everybody else was doing and tried to learn how  
13 this association operates. And finally I decided  
14 it was time to get involved and I worked with  
15 committees and I worked with the committee on  
16 youth activities, that only lasted about 20  
17 years, and then I went, started attending  
18 conventions.

19 I've been to every convention since I  
20 joined the association with the exception of four  
21 over 31 years. I have been to all but two

1 regional -- actually all but four regional  
2 conventions, Soapbox Derby got in the way of a  
3 few more, but I've done my job.

4 I have been the branch president twice,  
5 I've been a vice president, I've been the vice  
6 regional president, regional vice president,  
7 regional president. I've traveled through my  
8 region and outside my region, I've worked on  
9 committees at national conventions and regional  
10 conventions. I've worked with the national  
11 office headquarters building committee and I've  
12 learned from the people out here, my fellow  
13 shipmates.

14 I would appreciate your support. I can  
15 do this job, I can do it well, I work very well  
16 with Jim Campbell, he was my vice president when  
17 I was regional president, and again, I would  
18 appreciate your support.

19 I got, when I went out to the west coast  
20 region I got to visit the ladies, to talk to the  
21 west coast folks out there, and then I went over



1 to talk to the auxiliary, and I was told by one  
2 of the national presidents that was right there  
3 with me that, because after I talked to them I  
4 told them, I said most of you know me as Diane  
5 Hoover's husband. But I said, you know, I  
6 appreciate your support, and I was quickly  
7 reminded hey, they can't vote for you. And as I  
8 told them, because I've learned from observation,  
9 they influence the vote a whole hell of a lot  
10 more than he did, so thank you.

11 (Applause.)

12 NP FULTON: Shipmate Past Regional  
13 President Southeast James "Robbie" Robbins.

14 PRPSE ROBBINS: Good afternoon,  
15 shipmates. I'll tell everybody my real name and  
16 it's James E. Robbins Junior, everybody knows me  
17 as Robbie. I've been in the Fleet Reserve for  
18 almost 37 years, Fleet Reserve Association,  
19 excuse me, I'm sorry. And I have been a branch  
20 president for 17 years at Branch 91. You know,  
21 nobody wanted to do the job.

1 I got involved with the convention, I  
2 have held three national conventions, we have  
3 done several southeast region conventions. I do  
4 as many committees that I can get involved in  
5 with stuff like that. And I travel. I am a  
6 hundred percent retired, I am a hundred percent  
7 disabled, so I don't have nothing holding me at  
8 the house. I mean, I just grab my wife and say  
9 we got to go, so I am here to support everybody  
10 that is out there, this whole FRA association is  
11 my family. I'm there to help and do anything I  
12 can for everybody, and I would appreciate your  
13 support and your vote.

14 And I will stand here and say Don, we  
15 shook hands and we're going to shake hands at the  
16 end, so may the best man win. Thank you,  
17 shipmates.

18 (Applause.)

19 NP FULTON: Shipmate National Chaplain.

20 NCHAP GUNTHER: Shipmate National  
21 President, the Bible is closed.

5 committee came up with the number they came up  
6 with total, okay? The tally came out 528 votes  
7 Robbins, 349 votes Hoover. Shipmate Robbins,  
8 congratulations.

9 (Applause.) Tally committee, you are  
10 released from your duties.

11 Shipmate Robbins, please approach the  
12 podium and then right after that, shipmates, we  
13 have the auxiliary members.

14 PRPSE ROBBINS: First of all, I want to  
15 say thank you to all the shipmates in the  
16 audience. You know, the stars are written, the  
17 third time's a charm. I ran against a good  
18 opponent, me and Don have been friends for a long  
19 time. I thought about it and I thought about it  
20 and I said you know, a good race is a good race,  
21 and we will still remain friends, but I will be



1 calling on people out here from the west coast to  
2 the east coast to New England, all the way around  
3 to The Philippines, I don't care. If I need help  
4 I'm going to call for it because I don't know  
5 everything, and I'm kind of lost for words  
6 because it really got -- I really want to say  
7 thank you, shipmates, and I appreciate it. And  
8 that's it.

9 (Applause.)

10 NP FULTON: Shipmate Master at Arms,  
11 shipmates, the ladies await our pleasure, or the  
12 Auxiliary awaits our pleasure. There is one guy  
13 in the auxiliary.

14 LAPNP ROBBINS: I haven't done that in  
15 14 years, okay. Hi, I'm a little out of breath.  
16 I'm Sandra Robbins, I'm past national president  
17 in the year 2006-2007, my running mate was Gary  
18 Sweeney and I miss him terribly, he's doing well  
19 but I don't get to see him much. And somehow in  
20 this year of COVID I've turned out to be the  
21 senior PNP of our community. That shouldn't

1 happen, that should not, I'm way too young as a  
2 PNP to have that happen to me.

3 I have a little something to say and I  
4 don't mean any disrespect, so please don't think,  
5 I love you, you know, that's okay. A Navy seaman  
6 was in a bar and he leans over to the bartender  
7 and says, want to hear a Marine joke? The  
8 bartender replies well, before you tell that  
9 joke, you should know something, I am six-foot  
10 tall, 200 pounds and I am a former Marine. The  
11 guy sitting to your left is six-foot-two tall, he  
12 weighs 225 pounds and he is a Marine. And the  
13 fellow sitting to your right is six-feet-five  
14 inches tall and weighs 250 pounds, and he also is  
15 a Marine. A little quiet, he said now, do you  
16 still want to tell that joke? The seaman says  
17 no, I don't want to have to explain it three  
18 times.

19 (Laughter.)

20 LAPNP RODHAM TUCK: Ain't no way I'm  
21 going to try to top that. I'm Cindy Rodham tuck,

1 I'm past national president, Unit 31, 2009-10,  
2 Gary Blackburn was my running mate, and I'm sure  
3 you've all heard the stories of our travels  
4 around the country. I've had a wonderful time, I  
5 hope you guys had a great convention, and thank  
6 you.

7 (Applause.)

8 LAPNP FRI: My name is Doris Brown,  
9 National President 2014-15, my running mate was  
10 John Ippert from what used to be Branch 46. John  
11 always told the joke on me because he's  
12 originally from Kansas, I lived in Kansas, I'm  
13 not from Kansas, but he was always telling jokes  
14 about Kansas people being kind of dumb. Well,  
15 John, you were born there, so. But I was born in  
16 Kentucky and married a guy from Kansas, and  
17 that's how I live in Kansas.

18 Congratulations to the new officers of  
19 the FRA and I like Cindy, I hope you had a  
20 wonderful convention, ours went very smoothly,  
21 and thank God, because I was the convention

1 chairman, and it won't be too bad, you know, they  
2 won't be talking for the next six years about how  
3 lousy a convention we run. But it's been nice  
4 being here and seeing everybody, and I tell my  
5 neighbors, they're elderly folks like me, that I  
6 go to conventions so I can see, hear sea stories,  
7 although I'm pretty sure after 34 years, I'm  
8 pretty sure there's not too many sea stories  
9 haven't heard, but that's my point of going to  
10 the conventions, I miss being around sailors, we  
11 don't have a lot of you guys in Kansas, and so I  
12 enjoy coming to conventions and seeing all your  
13 smiling faces and hearing your voices, and what  
14 can I say, I love sailors.

15 (Applause.)

16 LAPNP HOOVER: Howdy, I'm Diane Hoover  
17 from Unit 24 and I served 2012 to 2013, my  
18 counterpart was Mark Kilgore. Mark battled  
19 cancer from the time we were installed in Reno  
20 until he passed. Mark knew everybody, he's going  
21 to be a big loss to our association and he'll be

1 very much missed.

2 I'm not sure my joke is as good as  
3 Sandy's, but let's try it. Two hunters are out  
4 in the woods when one of them collapses, he's not  
5 breathing and his eyes are glazed. The other guy  
6 looked down at his phone and called 911, he says  
7 help, I think my friend is dead, he yells, what  
8 can I do? The operator says calm down, first  
9 let's make sure he's dead. There's a silence,  
10 then a shot, and back on the phone the guy says  
11 okay, what's next?

12 (Applause.)

13 LAPNP MURRAY: Good afternoon,  
14 shipmates. My name's Christina Murray, I was  
15 past national president from 2018 to 2019. I am  
16 not going to even try to say a joke because I  
17 can't deliver them as well as Diane, and I always  
18 forget the punch line. My running mate was  
19 Mr. Bob Washington, who is not with us today, but  
20 it is my privilege and honor to introduce to you  
21 the officers for next year and our national

1 president elect, Pat Suko (phonetic) cannot be  
2 with us because of medical reasons, but she was  
3 elected and we will duly install her by Zoom, so  
4 we have it arranged and she sends her greetings  
5 to you as well.

6 I would also like to introduce to you  
7 our national vice president elect Nadine Fulton.

8 (Applause.)

9 LANVP-Elect FULTON: Good afternoon,  
10 shipmates. So here I am, I'm going to make this  
11 short because I don't have any stories and I  
12 don't have any jokes, but now I know what I have  
13 to do for my next time I'm here. Oh no, okay,  
14 I -- what's that? No. Oh, you're welcome. I  
15 sent over some candy for you guys, yes. I look  
16 forward to working with you all, thank you.

17 (Applause.)

18 LAPNP MURRAY: And it is also my  
19 pleasure to introduce to you the national  
20 treasurer for 2022 to 2024, Ms. Lee Beringer out  
21 of the new Unit 31 in Northeast/New England.

1 (Applause.)

2 LANT-Elect BERINGER: Good afternoon,  
3 shipmates. I have no counterpart but I do want  
4 to say hello to Donna Jansky, a new housekeeper  
5 at my house sort of. Yes, this is my first  
6 convention, I am very excited to be joining you  
7 and I look forward to working with you all.  
8 Thank you.

9 (Applause.)

10 LAPNP MURRAY: And this concludes us,  
11 and we wish you all very safe travels as you, if  
12 some of you are leaving before tomorrow evening  
13 and those that leave later, please be safe going  
14 home.

15 (Applause.)

16 NP FULTON: Shipmates, is there any  
17 further new business to be brought in front of  
18 the assembly? No further new business, we will  
19 proceed to the good of the order.

20 Shipmate at the rear mic.

21 S/M TALBOT: Talbot, Delegate, 159.

1 National President, we were forced to pay a  
2 \$16,000 penalty to the Portland venue for  
3 cancellation. Due to the delta variant and the  
4 wildfires, we might well have had to cancel this  
5 convention also. The finance officer purchased a  
6 cancellation insurance for this convention, I  
7 believe he should be commended for his foresight.

8 (Applause.)

9 NP FULTON: Shipmate at the front mic.

10 PNP JOHNSON: Johnson, Delegate, 104.  
11 Everybody knows we're having a silent auction in  
12 the room back there, hospitality room. All that  
13 stuff is going to be moved out into the  
14 registration area so you can get a better look at  
15 this stuff, and a lot of you haven't even been in  
16 there yet to look at what you can buy. And we're  
17 going to close that out -- would you let me  
18 finish? We're going to close that out tonight  
19 because there's people, I understand, that are  
20 going home tomorrow, so if you're going to buy  
21 something, get it tonight, and we'll be out there



1 probably until seven, eight o'clock, and if  
2 you're going on the casino run, get somebody to  
3 watch what you're bidding on so if somebody  
4 overbids you while you're gone, they can do  
5 another bid for you, okay? Everybody got that?  
6 Any questions?

7 And we're going to also have another  
8 50-50 tonight, starting tonight and it's going to  
9 run through tomorrow night at the banquet, and  
10 that's when we'll do the drawing on the ticket.  
11 Tomorrow night if no one wins it or if they lose  
12 their ticket between now and tomorrow night we're  
13 going to draw again, we're not going to hang the  
14 thing in the hospitality room so everybody can  
15 look at their numbers, we'll get rid of the money  
16 tomorrow night at the banquet, okay? Any  
17 questions? Okay.

18 NP FULTON: Shipmate at the rear mic.

19 S/M HUFFER: Huffer, headquarters. I  
20 just wanted to say if I called your branch for  
21 awards, if you could come see me after for your

1 ribbons.

2 NP FULTON: Before the end of the  
3 business session this afternoon, please get with  
4 the convention, or the committee chairs, and make  
5 sure that the regional presidents get the ribbons  
6 for their branches.

7 Shipmate Lazzaretti?

8 PRPNW LAZZARETTI: Shipmates, for those  
9 branches that won public relations awards in  
10 2020, please pick up your ribbons, they are  
11 spread out on the table with the leftover  
12 reports. Regional presidents, please make sure  
13 you get all of these extra piles, or you may  
14 round file it as appropriate. Thank you,  
15 shipmates.

16 NP FULTON: As we all know, there's a  
17 lot of work that must be done in putting on a  
18 national convention. At this time I would like  
19 to ask the convention committee chairman and his  
20 committee staff to please stand and be  
21 recognized.

1 (Applause.)

2 All of the shipmates from 38 please, you  
3 did your fair share.

4 (Applause.)

5 And I believe we got the general  
6 announcement for tonight as far as the bus and  
7 everything taken care of. Is there any other  
8 shipmate wishing to be recognized under the good  
9 of the order? Shipmate Junior Past, I see you  
10 standing.

11 RVPWC HOFFMAN: Shipmate President, Bob  
12 Hoffman, Branch 197, Vice President West Coast  
13 Region. This is my first national convention, I  
14 really enjoyed it, I enjoyed the comradery of all  
15 the shipmates, and I wish to thank you for a  
16 great convention.

17 (Applause.)

18 NP FULTON: Thank you. Shipmate Junior  
19 Past?

20 JPNP JANSKY: Shipmate National  
21 President, I just want to let you to know one

1 last time, I am still in the uniform of the day,  
2 but not for long.

3 (Applause.)

4 NP FULTON: Is there any other shipmate  
5 desiring to be recognized under the good of the  
6 order?

7 S/M CARRIER: Carrier, Branch 94, and  
8 that hat reminds me when I first got in the Coast  
9 Guard, you know, for the old timers, they know  
10 what that is. I enjoyed myself, I want to  
11 encourage the leaders, we know what you've done,  
12 a lot of us do, but we want to hear from the  
13 future. I mean, I worked in the scullery, I  
14 worked in the deck force, and I will help with  
15 ideas or whatever to move this forward. We don't  
16 need to look at the past, we do need to respect  
17 our history, but I want to see if I can help get  
18 us moving a little forward, you know, even if it  
19 takes putting video games in the units for the  
20 younger kids to come in. That's something a lot  
21 of us don't understand, but it might be a little

1   trickery or whatever, but you know, we've got to  
2   go to them for them to come to you, you've got to  
3   meet them somewhere, and that's all I'd like to  
4   say. Thank you for your convention, I enjoyed  
5   it.

6                   (Applause.)

7           NP FULTON: Shipmate at the rear mic.

8           S/M PERRY: Claudio Perry, Branch 4.

9   I'd like to piggyback on his statement. I think  
10 all past national presidents should be the big  
11 time of this association, it's not just coming  
12 here every year, think of something to do to make  
13 it better. I'm helping the chairman of the  
14 centennial committee and a new president to  
15 create a new culture in FRA. I'm volunteering my  
16 company to be the sponsor for now until 2024.  
17 I'm creating jobs, if you get something for me,  
18 you get \$500.

19           NP FULTON: Speak into the microphone,  
20 Shipmate, so that you can be heard.

21           S/M PERRY: Okay. There's this good

1 looking lady here gave me a referral for solar  
2 energy, I give her \$500 and \$500 goes to the  
3 centennial committee for Ms. Jansky. So it's  
4 time that we all do it, let's help. If we just,  
5 after your term you just sleep, let us be the  
6 future, you guys, like he said, the future, the  
7 future, the big time, the national presidents.  
8 Thank you.

9 NP FULTON: Thank you, Shipmate.

10 (Applause.)

11 Shipmate at the rear mic.

12 PNP LARSON: Larson, Delegate, Branch  
13 94. Due to the instruction on Tuesday of  
14 National Convention 101, all the new shipmates  
15 that are here, I'd like for you to get with me to  
16 give feedback on what I did say, what I didn't  
17 say, what applied, what didn't apply, what I need  
18 to do in the future. Thank you.

19 (Applause.)

20 NP FULTON: Okay. Shipmates, it is  
21 1535. I will be standing by up here to receive

1 checks for disaster relief and the education  
2 foundation on behalf of your branches, and that  
3 will last until 1600.

4 Current national board of directors, we  
5 will meet in executive session at 1630 in the  
6 Dahlia Room right next to the headquarters  
7 office. That is the current national board of  
8 directors. Shipmate Chaplain?

9 NCHAP GUNTHER: Shipmate National  
10 President, the Bible is closed.

11 NP FULTON: Thank you, Shipmate  
12 Chaplain.

13 Shipmates, salute the ensign. Two.

14 This convention now stands in recess  
15 until 1800 Friday night when we will reconvene  
16 for the purpose of joint installation of the  
17 2021-2022 FRA and LAFRA national officers in the  
18 Ponderosa-Juniper Rooms.

19 (Whereupon, the fourth business session  
20 adjourned.)
