Okay, I'll go ahead and at this time 14 15 we're going to ask the finance officer to show a video clip, it's about eight minutes long, of a 16 17 welcome message. 18 NFO REID: We're going to do the 135 19 today. 20 NP FULTON: Oh, the 135, okay. Go ahead 21 and start it back up again.

1 (Video playing.) 2 (Applause.) 3 I will tell you, and Shipmate Davis from the legislative office, Senator Tester means what 4 5 he says, he is 100 percent engaged. Okay. 6 The credentials chair is here and he is 7 ready. We will now have the report of the credentials chair, Shipmate Past Regional 8 9 President Northwest Lazzaretti. 10 PRPNW LAZZARETTI: Good afternoon, shipmates. Did everybody enjoy their boring 11 12 meetings this morning? 13 As of 1256 today, the 6th of October, 14 2021, this is the second credentials report for the 93rd FRA National Convention. Authorized 15 16 voting strength, 975. Number of branches 17 represented by delegates, 40. Number of votes represented by delegates, 394. Number of 18 branches registered by proxy, 91. Number of 19 votes registered by proxy, 481. Number of 20 branches not registered, 27 out of 159. 21

2	delegates have not checked in with no proxy
3	designated, Branch 188 with no delegate or
4	proxies listed on their credentials.
5	The number of delegates registered, 86.
6	Registered voting strength, 875. Number of votes
7	not registered, 100. Two-thirds vote is 584.
8	Majority vote is 436, excuse me, 438. The issue
9	with Branch 315 brought up yesterday, their
10	charter was surrendered per NBR 29-18.
11	I move that this report be received.
12	S/M THOMAS: Delegate J.J. Thomas,
13	Branch 126, second.
14	NP FULTON: Motion on the floor and a
15	second. Any discussion on the question of
16	approving hang on, I see Shipmate Blackburn.
17	S/M BLACKBURN: Shipmate National
18	President, Blackburn, Delegate, Branch 8. Did I
19	mishear what he stated, and we had, on the first
20	credentials report we had 975 registered, or was
21	the authorized strength, and it trimmed down to

1 800-something on this second one? 2 PRPNW LAZZARETTI: We only have 800-some authorized voting strength. The overall voting 3 strength based on March 31st numbers comes out to 4 5 975. 6 S/M BLACKBURN: No, I believe he had 903 7 was authorized. I should have brought my -registered, right, registered voting, there 8 9 was --10 PRPNW LAZZARETTI: There was an 11 adjustment made to that number due to the 12 discovery on the issue concerning Branch 13. 13 S/M BLACKBURN: Very good, thank you. 14 NP FULTON: Any further discussion? All 15 in favor? 16 (Chorus of ayes.) 17 Opposed? Carried. Thank you, Shipmate 18 Lazzaretti. 19 We will now commence receiving the 20 reports of the national convention committees. 21 Let me go down through my list. The first is

going to be the chairman's report of the national conventions's committee on constitution, bylaws and resolutions, and that committee was chaired because Shipmate Past National President Mucheck is not present at convention, was chaired by Past Regional President Northwest Charles McIntyre, or West Coast, Past Regional President West Coast Charles McIntyre. Are you ready for your report, Shipmate? You can come up here or you can deliver it from the rear mic, it makes no difference to me.

I would prefer that the folks come up here because I have a presentation to make after you deliver your report.

PRPWC MCINTYRE: Good afternoon,
shipmates. This is the report of the chairman,
93rd National Convention FRA national committee
on constitution, bylaws and resolutions, at the
Mirabeau Park Hotel and Convention Center,
Spokane Valley, Washington, October 6th, 2021, in
the Hawthorne Room.

1 The chairman is of course me, PRP West Coast Charles R. McIntyre, Santa Clara Branch 2 3 In attendance on the phone was PNP F. 101. 4 Donald Mucheck, Low Country Branch 269. Members 5 attending was Past Regional President East Coast Randy Phillips, Triangle Branch 182, Past 7 Regional President North Central Marty J. Poscani (phonetic), Wolverine Branch 298, Past Regional 8 President Southwest Donald R. Kelly, Branch 289, 10 and Junior Past Regional President Southwest John Quisnow (phonetic) Junior, Branch 289. 11 12 The same procedure as has been used in 13 the past several years will be followed. chairman will read the pertinent resolved portion 14 of the resolution at which time it becomes 15 16 pending automatically, no motion or second is 17 necessary. The chairman will read the 18 committee's recommendation and give the rationals 19 after the proceeding officer will call for 20 discussion. 21 Please remember, you will be voting on

the resolution itself and not the committee recommendations, so I have constitution and bylaws resolution number one:

Resolved, that Article II, Section 202, C&BL FRA, be amended to read as follows: Section 202, composition of associations. The FRA is an organization of all current and former personnel who have many years of honorable service in the United States Navy, Coast Guard and Marine Corps, including the reserve components. It is composed of the national association and subordinate branches chartered under and pursuant to its authority in the matter hereafter provided.

And be it further resolved -- I think I read the wrong one. Oh, crap. I read the wrong one, it's this one here.

NP FULTON: There's two resolved.

PRPWC MCINTYRE: It's this one here. I screwed up. Whereas, this is a resolution submitted to amend eligibility for membership in the FRA. This regulation is to amend C&BL

Article II, which identifies by name membership eligibility to be consistent with the eligibility stated in resolution that all personnel include personnel who are now serving or have served to be eligible for the FRA, and then I read the rest.

Resolved, that this amendment become effective January 1st, 2021.

It was read and certified and proposed at a regular meeting of Branch 70, Poway Valley, held on 12 December 2019, read, debated and adopted by a two-thirds majority vote at a subsequent regular meeting held on the 5th of February 2020.

Our committee recommended not in order. The rationale, our committee feels it is not in the best interests of the FRA to allow all sea service personnel as the long tradition, standing tradition of the FRA is current and former enlisted members of the sea services. Digging down deep, we believe that all personnel would

now include officers and other personnel like in that regards, and that's why we did that rationale.

NP FULTON: The presiding officer's opinion is the resolution is out of order based on the interpretation of the charter of the Fleet Reserve Association stating the enlisted personnel of the three sea services, and I so move.

PRPWC MCINTYRE: Constitution and bylaws resolution number two.

1 And be it further resolved that the Article VIII, Section 811, and other appropriate 2 sections where it reads national committee of 3 budget and finance shall be changed to national 4 committee on budget, finance and audit. 5 6 This is to certify resolution was 7 proposed at a regular national board of directors meeting held on Monday, June 28th, 2021, read, 8 9 debated and adopted by unanimous vote NBR 24-21. 10 11

PRPWC MCINTYRE: Resolved, that Article VIII, Section 811.A, C&BL FRA, be amended by adding Section 811.A, this committee shall consist of the junior past national president as chairman and six members appointed by the national president for a term of two years -- three years, two members being replaced or reappointed each year by the incoming national president. Members shall serve until relieved or replaced only with the concurrence of the national board of directors.

This is to certify the resolution was proposed at a regular national board of directors meeting held on Friday, October 16th, read, debated and adopted by unanimous vote, NBR 05-21.

C&BL recommendation, reject. It is not in the best interests of the FRA as it takes away power from the national president to appoint committee chairs. If the national president desires to appoint the junior past national

1 president, he can do that. The junior past national president may not be the best person for 2 3 the job. 4 The committee recommends the junior past national president be an advisor to the 5 committee. So reject. 6 7 NP FULTON: You've heard the recommendation of the constitution and bylaws 8 committee. Any discussion? You are allowed, you 9 10 are a shipmate. 11 PRPSE HANZEK: Shipmate National 12 President 13 Shipmate at the rear mic. NP FULTON: 14 PRPSE HANZEK: Hanzek, Delegate, 126, 15 member, budget and finance. This was brought up 16

PRPSE HANZEK: Hanzek, Delegate, 126, member, budget and finance. This was brought up at our spring meeting in Alexandria and the rationale being national president is in essence involved in the finances of the association over a period of three consecutive years, and that as a junior past his year's budget is being audited while he's junior past and he's readily available

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to the audit committee and any auditors to answer questions.

And I'm not speaking for, I believe I'm speaking for the chairman and the rest of the committee when I say we were unanimous in recommending this, so I as a delegate speak in favor of adoption.

NP FULTON: Shipmate Finance Officer also wants to say a few words.

NFO REID: Shipmate Finance Officer,
Headquarters, NAL. This is not something, one of
the things that this organization requires is
that we need additional financial oversight. As
I look at what's happened in the past, one of the
things that becomes perfectly clear is that the
consistency of individuals serving in certain
posts, financial posts is not necessarily there.
I can tell you right now that we are in a
situation where we're looking at numbers,
financial numbers from 2019 that were not
necessarily the proper numbers, and one of the

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things that I feel is that we did not have the initial people in place to make sure that these things didn't happen in the past.

This is not something that I proposed, this is being proposed by certified public auditors, the CPAs, the individuals who actually audit our books. One of the things that this organization has been hit with over and over again is the lack of internal control, lack of consistency on the individuals who are responsible for finances. One of the things that the auditor said to me was he had no one to go to when they came into the audit. By the way, the audit is done for the board of directors, not for me, it actually is an audit of me and the NAD. And one of the problems he has is at the level of the, I'm sorry, the board level, there's no one responsible.

By making the junior past the responsible person, you now have someone at the board level who is responsible. I appreciate the

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1 fact that the finance, that the incoming national president can appoint that position, but to me it feels like it should be an automatic position. Here's what's happening. You have a vice president who starts off and under normal circumstances that vice president is going to become the president of this organization, that's two years that he will have been in place. As junior, this is the third year that he will be in place and that he knows the finances of the organization that's happening in the last one, two and three years. When the auditors come in to audit, what they're auditing are the financial records of the national president who is now the junior past. So I can appreciate what we've done in the past, I can tell you that it's not necessarily, it hasn't necessarily worked. We've had crisis here, financial crisis here, and I

think part of the crisis is no one at the board

level has been responsible. What they've said is

well, that's the budget and finance committee.

Now under most circumstances the national president is the ex facto leader of all those committees, but by having the junior past in place, you have now a person who has three years of experience working with me, working with the finance, and his understanding or her understanding of what's going on financially with this organization is beyond anything that an

additional shipmate who's identified by the

Now it's true that that person who's identified by the president may have years and years of experience. One of the problems we have is that we're all getting older, and one of the things we've got to do is to make sure that there's always new blood. If I have a person who is running for national vice president, more than likely that person has not been in this organization as long as some of us have or some of you have, and so now we have that continuous

flow.

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The other thing is, everybody on the budget and finance committee has three years of experience, so in fact at the will of the national president, that's \$50, but whoever you put in, I mean, you could put anyone into that position, and so now I've got to work with that person to train them up, to say to them here's what we've done over the past three years. real thing is that the junior past is part of your board, so now when there's something going on and it's time to give reports, the junior past has got to stand up and say the finance office is not doing his job, he's not getting out the quarterly reports.

Now that could have happened under the budget and finance committee but the budget and finance committee person has to go to the national president and say that to him, and then the national president has to say that to the board. By the junior past being there, that

1	person is a board member and now you have direct
2	responsibility for what's going on.
3	Three minutes, I understand, thank you.
4	(Applause.)
5	NP FULTON: Shipmate at the rear mic.
6	PNP BLACKBURN: Shipmate National
7	President, Blackburn, Delegate, Branch 8,
8	chairman of the budget and finance committee. I
9	stand in support of this resolution.
10	PRPNC COMBS: Shipmate National

1 (Several nays.) 2 Motion carried. 3 PRPWC MCINTYRE: We have one standing 4 rules resolution. Oh no, two, sorry about that. Where is the resolved? Oh, right there. Geez, 5 6 that was a hard one to read. 7 Resolved that SR-9(D), Standing Rule 8 Number 9(D) is amended to remove the word "my" 9 and replace with "the". 10 And whereas, it's recommended from 11 SR-9(B)(iv) it should be changed from -- I'm 12 reading the wrong resolved, anyway. Okay, I'll 13 read it all, what the hell. 14 Why am I proud to be an American, to 15 change to what it means to be an American citizen. Justification, this is from another 16 17 committee, it has been observed that the school systems are now hosting first generation 18 19 Americans and soon to be naturalized American 20 citizens. This may also give American students 21 whose generation spans 200 years an opportunity

to reevaluate their heritage.

1 S/M FALU: Point of order. 2 NP FULTON: Point of order? 3 Shipmate National President, S/M FALU: 4 everyone in here may not be a delegate, so we need to do a roll count vote, because everybody 5 6 may not be eligible to vote in here. I'm sorry, 7 East Coast Regional Secretary Falu, Branch 99 8 delegate. 9 NP FULTON: Okay. Based on what I saw, 10 it's not going to meet the two-thirds threshold 11 any ways. Rainier Branch 104; National President Michael "Mick" Fulton, Imperial Beach 6 7 Branch 289. 8 All right. You all got your budget 9 All right. There are three pen and ink open? 10 changes need to be done to the existing budget. 11 On page two of your budget, on line item 55060050.I, elevators, the \$375 monthly which is 12 printed in small print right beside it should 13 14 read \$391 monthly. The \$5,200 is the correct 15 amount in the budget. Everybody clear on that 16 point? 17 Number two, page three, budget line item 18 55340050.A, Internet, the \$433.65 per month comes 19 to \$5,097, which is rounded up to \$5,200. 20 Page three, budget line item 553340050, 21 I'm sorry, I should have been more specific.

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\$5,200 is the total, vice 3,400. That is the 2 2022 budget, the final column on that page.

Unfortunately they didn't tell you what years it was; the first page it does, from then on out it's 2022 in the final column.

Page five, budget line item 57250070.A, budget and finance travel and per diem, the amount was reduced by \$1,500 with the expectation that the junior past national president will be the chairman and would already be in Alexandria for the national board of directors. However, then it was pointed out that in a normal year the national board of directors is held in March, not in June as it was this year, our new finance officer learning curve sometimes gets a little steep so things get corrected as we go. consequently, the budget and finance committee does not meet at the same time because they meet in June or early July, so consequently the \$1,500 expense that was reduced had to be replaced, making that line item back up to \$9,000 vice

1 7,500. 2 All right. This is an addition of \$3,300 of expense. On page seven, final page, 3 the budget which reads 3,487 -- \$3,487,256, I was 4 5 trying to save us a lot of money -- 3,487,256, 6 okay, is now 3,490,556. 7 No further business to be conducted, the 8 chair adjourned the committee at 1015. 9 Headquarters has a copy of my report.
