At this time, I would like to invite Past National President Jeff

Gilmartin up to the roster to address the assembly.

MS. MARTIN: National President,

National Officers, Past National Officers, Regional Officers, Past Regional Officers, Shipmates, I was advised when I was doing this to be as pippy as possible to make sure everybody stayed awake during the late afternoon hours. So, I will do as directed, not necessarily my preferred but
to keep my supporters happy.
Shipmates, the FRA has a
$501(c)(19)$ business enterprise that is
both ineffective and inefficient but at
least it's expensive. We have a
bottomless, cumbersome, outdated set of
bylaws as was underscored by yesterday's
report by the Membership Retention
Convention Committee.

No Lofgren awards for
individuals were awarded because
although pertinent data had been
provided by iMIS in the past, the bylaws still test the branches to submit nominees. Clearly the bylaws have not been updated since the implementation of iMIS, which $I$ believe is about 15 years.

We have a budget bleeding cash
so great that the rate we financially
castrated our Americanism essay contest
and slashed our American's budget from
45,000 to 14,000 to ratify a $\$ 113,630$
salary for the office of NED. The NED
salary has gone from 100,000 in 2021 to
113 in 2022 to 116 in 2023.
If elected I will seek a salary
of $\$ 75,000$ commensurate with the GS-11,
which will save the Association $\$ 41,000$.
I will also find my second page.
Membership continues to plummet but root causes are neither acknowledged nor addressed. Membership declines because the Association fails to provide a reason to part with $\$ 40$ a year. We need to provide a good or service that a shipmate can only get from the FRA.

Before TRICARE, the FRA provided a health insurance supplemental only available to FRA. The FRA was the chief architect of CHAMPUS. The FRA hasn't had a successful legislative victory independent of the Military Coalition in almost 40 years.

Where is our call to end the mandatory COVID injections? The Commander in Chief declared the pandemic
over but DOD continues to design the
latest exemptions and process and
discharge shipmates even though none of
the services are achieving recruiting goals.
COVID injections have been
proven to cause fertility issues with
females and myocarditis in young fit
males. We would be the only BSO
defending active duty medical
protection.

Where is our call to end GMT,
General Military Training on the proper use of pronouns. We can't win a war like this. People that are eligible and in are being processed out and nobody wants to join what the military is offering.

Win or loss on this discussion,
if we were to advocate this and join
with the Freedom Caucus who on Capital
Hill said they will not support the DOD
funding bill if the COVID mandates are
still there.
Win or lose, we win. Because
the shipmates that are being processed out and the shipmates that are fighting the good fight are going to say hey, there is somebody fighting for us and that will give them a reason to spend $\$ 40$ to join us.

Shipmates, if elected I will strive to address those issues to astonish the redding of our budget as I have been advocating for the past 25 years while seeking to broaden our appeal to potential recruits.

Thank you for your consideration and I ask for your vote. (Applause.)

NP CAMPBELL: At this time, I will call up NED Chris Slawinski.

NED SLAWINSKI: Thank you, Shipmate National President, National Officers, Past National Officers, Regional Officers, Shipmates.

I joined Fleet Reserve
Association in August of 2004. I did it more to honor a friend of mine's dad
than anything else. He was a Pearl
Harbor survivor. While I was
researching the Fleet Reserve
Association, I found that the
Association was in search of a veteran service officers, someone who could step up and help veterans.

I applied for the job and I was accepted by National Executive Director meritorious Joe Barnes. I worked with him and the staff since October of 2004. In 2019 you honored me with taking this position of National Executive Director.

I came looking for a way for the Association to move forward not only to our centennial but beyond. I did not know I was going to face the mess that I did.

> I walked into the office of

National Executive Director to find
there was fraud in the Finance
Department. For those who have not
heard, that we could not get audits done
because the auditors were not satisfied
with documentation that associated with
credit card statements. And come to
find out later, those statements were
because the finance officer -- the
former finance officer was basically
stealing us blind. I worked very
diligently to correct that. I got a
forensic auditor. I contacted our legal
folks, got a forensic auditor that we could trust and got it started and got it completed. We are now working on the 2021 audit so we are current on our audits.

So, again, $I$ worked very
diligently to not only make sure that the Association is in good standing but we have a very good idea, a fiscal picture, of where we are and where we are going. As you know, because of that
fraud we pursued legal recourse against
that individual. He has now been
charged and is waiting trial in Virginia courts. We did our due diligence. We went to our insurance company for theft. We have recovered the majority of the money minus our deductible. So, we have been made good for the most part for the money that was taken. It was almost a half million dollars.

Again, I've been throughout my three years open and honest with you. I have tried my best to make sure that I got the message out of what was going on good and bad in headquarters. You heard this morning what we have to do budget wise. I am ready and prepared to take that on. I have been working very, very diligently on finding ways to make money for the Association, both membership wise and nonmembership wise.

We've worked with our friends at the former KVI, then Mercer, then Marsh
and now AMBA. I had dinner with Michele
Arnesto. We are starting to put a plan
together for membership development,
which they will assist us in helping pay
for the marketing. So, I am excited
about that portion. The $F O$ mentioned a
database that they have. They have more
than 60 million members in their
database, about a million of them would fit our category. That's what he was talking about.

My next three years, if elected, is recruit, recruit, recruit. Again, finding ways to get the message out of what is the value and what is the benefit of the Fleet Reserve

Association. It's not all gloom and doom. It's -- it's again we are -- we are the advocates for pay and benefits for those who serve and have served and are retired from the military, their spouses and families.

Fundraising, not only with our
centennial but also working with the new established Veterans Service Foundation Board, we are going to work very hard to find those corporate dollars and find a way to make sure that we can be physically sound, not only for centennial but beyond. It's going to be a difficult task to find a new headquarters. We purchased the building in 1990 and we have had it as our home since then. But as associations come and go, it's time for us to change. My staff that I have, I had a difficult decision to make on how it's going to look, not only in the next six months but the next three years. There are going to be some difficult choices that have to be made. I am ready to make them.

Finally, I know there has been a lot of rumors about my health, and I am going to address it right here. There is no doctor in this building that
basically can tell you what I have been going through. I have gone to Walter

Reed for my treatment for prostate
cancer. I have been given every
assurance by my doctors that everything
is stable and that I am physically sound
to work and sound to be here. If I wasn't, I wouldn't be here.

I want you to know that I am --
I am dedicated to you. I love you-all.
No matter what the decision is, I will
accept it and we will move forward and get this Association back on track to be the best organization, best association in the country. Thank you.
