1                   NP CAMPBELL: Shipmate  
2 Master-At-Arms, you will invite the  
3 shipmates to the meeting hall and close  
4 the doors.

5                   SMAA: Shipmate National  
6 President, the doors are closed.

7                   NP CAMPBELL: Uncover. National  
8 Chaplain, would you open the Bible,  
9 please.

10                  NCHAP LYMON: Shipmate National  
11 President, the Bible is open.

12                  NP CAMPBELL: Thank you. Shipmate  
13 at the mic.

14                  JPNP FULTON: Shipmate National  
15 President, let the record reflect the  
16 Junior Past is in the uniform of the day.

17                  NP CAMPBELL: Thank you.

18                               (Applause.)

19                  NP CAMPBELL: I now declare the  
20 Fourth Business Session of the  
21 94th National Convention regularly to  
22 convene.

23                   At this time I would like to

1 call up Theo Lawson. He has a  
2 correction on his report.

3 ADLP LAWSON: Hi, Shipmates.  
4 There is one quick correction. There was  
5 one submission for group one which  
6 automatically makes it first place, and  
7 that is Low Country Branch 269. Group  
8 one, Branch 269.

9 SHIPMATE: VSO, right?

10 ADLP LAWSON: Yes. Well, it the  
11 whole thing.

12 SHIPMATE: They're asking which  
13 one.

14 ADLP LAWSON: There is no  
15 competition, so it's both. They win the  
16 whole thing.

17 SHIPMATE: Which service?

18 ADLP LAWSON: Oh. Yeah, Veteran  
19 Service Committee.

20 NP CAMPBELL: At this time, I  
21 would like to call up the Public Relations  
22 Chairman to give his report.

23 NED SLAWINSKI: Thank you,

1 Shipmate National President. I left a  
2 list up here for the Regional President  
3 Elects and somebody said I should just  
4 friendly call them out that haven't signed  
5 it yet.

6 Regional President Elect  
7 Southeast, Regional President Elect West  
8 Coast, National Chaplain, I need to find  
9 out who your cap presenters are. So, we  
10 will do that at the next break so that I  
11 can have it in hand so we can start  
12 working on the installation script.

13 Thank you.

14 NP CAMPBELL: Now again, the  
15 Public Relations Committee Chairman will  
16 give his report.

17 PRPNW LAZZARETTI: Good afternoon,  
18 Shipmates. I hope everybody had a good  
19 lunch. This is the report of the Chairman  
20 of the National Convention Committee for  
21 Public Relations, which was held in the  
22 Hampshire Conference Room of the Hyatt  
23 Regency Wynfrey Hotel here in Birmingham,

1 Alabama at 0900, on yesterday, Wednesday,  
2 October 19, 2022.

3 In attendance were myself,  
4 Chairman Past Regional President North  
5 West, Pete Lazzaretti, of Seattle Branch  
6 18. Members of my committee this year  
7 included Past Regional President  
8 Southeast, JJ Thomas, West Jacksonville  
9 Branch 126; Past Regional President  
10 Northeast, New England, Floyd Hunt, from  
11 Staten Island -- no, excuse me, Iroquois  
12 Brach 214; Shipmate Stephen Mig --  
13 Shipmate Stephen from Delbert Branch  
14 117.

15 SHIPMATE: Miglionario.

16 PRPNW LAZZARETTI: Miglionario.

17 Sorry, Shipmate. I should know better by  
18 now, especially with my last name being  
19 what it is.

20 Shipmate John Tharp, Low Country  
21 Branch 269; and Shipmate Romeo Galeon,  
22 Carson City Branch 302. The guests were  
23 Regional President West Coast Bill

1 Hanzel from Branch 230.

2           Items for action: The Committee  
3 would like to remind the shipmates that  
4 with the midterm elections that as a  
5 nonparty and organizations member, and  
6 branches cannot endorse any one  
7 political candidate party or initiative  
8 on either the local or national ballots  
9 while exhibiting the FRA logo. This  
10 includes posts on any social media  
11 platform.

12           The following branches Public  
13 Relations Report were judged and placed  
14 for this year's convention. While first  
15 place reports were submitted by several  
16 regions, a report did not contain  
17 sufficient criteria to warrant an award.  
18 You will see that in a couple of the  
19 different groups.

20           Starting with group one: First  
21 place, Low Country Branch 269; second  
22 place, Imperial Beach Branch 289; third  
23 place, Annapolis Branch 24.

1           Going onto group two: First  
2 place, Highway Valley Branch 70; no  
3 other awards issued.

4           Group three: First place, West  
5 Jacksonville Branch 126; second place,  
6 Carson Valley Branch 302; third place,  
7 Chesapeake Branch 40.

8           Group four: Lakers New Jersey  
9 Branch 124; second place, Triangle  
10 Branch 182; no third place.

11           Group five: Tallahassee Branch  
12 34, first place; second place, Atlantic  
13 City Branch 13; third place, Ogden Utah,  
14 Branch 185.

15           The following shipmate is  
16 awarded the Shipmate of the Year for  
17 Public Relations: Shipmate Alexander  
18 Topicz of Tallahassee Branch 34 for his  
19 outstanding contributions to Public  
20 Relations throughout the greater  
21 Tallahassee, Florida area.

22           I would like to thank the  
23 National Presidents for this opportunity

1 to continue to serve the Association as  
2 the Public Relations National Committee  
3 Chairman. I would also like to thank my  
4 committee members and the national  
5 headquarters staff for their continued  
6 support.

7 I move that this report be  
8 received.

9 NP CAMPBELL: Motion.

10 PRPNC COMBS: Combs, Delegate  
11 Branch 161. Second.

12 NP CAMPBELL: Motion and second.  
13 All in favor of receiving this report, say  
14 aye.

15 (Chorus of ayes.)

16 NP CAMPBELL: Opposed.

17 (No response.)

18 NP CAMPBELL: Thank you.

19 Now we are going to do the  
20 fourth credentials report.

21 PRPNW LAZZARETTI: Shipmates in  
22 Tab Yoke, for the credential reports, this  
23 is the fourth and final credential reports



1 for the 94th Fleet Reserve Association  
2 National Convention.

3 This report is as of October 20,  
4 2022 at 1253 hours. Authorized voting  
5 strength is 891. Number of branches  
6 represented by delegates, 52. Number of  
7 votes represented by delegates, 485.  
8 Number of branches registered by proxy,  
9 86. Number of votes registered by  
10 proxy, 364. Number of branches not  
11 registered, 17 out of 149. The number  
12 of delegates registered for this  
13 convention are 103. Registered voting  
14 strength, 849. Number of votes not  
15 registered, 42. Two-thirds majority  
16 vote, 566. Simple majority vote, 425.

17 That concludes my report. I  
18 move that it be received.

19 NP CAMPBELL: Shipmate at the mic.  
20 Shipmate at the left mic.

21 SHIPMATE COLLINS: Yes. This is  
22 Penny Collins, Delegate Branch 24. I  
23 second.

1 NP CAMPBELL: Motion and second.

2 All in favor to accept the report, say  
3 aye.

4 (Chorus of ayes.)

5 NP CAMPBELL: Opposed?

6 (Brief interruption.)

7 NP CAMPBELL: Again, opposed?

8 SHIPMATE COLLINS: None.

9 NP CAMPBELL: Thank you. Yes,  
10 Shipmate at --

11 SHIPMATE COLLINS: Oh. That's not  
12 why I was here but I will repeat -- I will  
13 just state why I'm here. But anyway, this  
14 is Penny Collins, Delegate Branch 24.

15 I'm not sure where we are on the  
16 last part of the reports, but I would  
17 like to have a one-minute discussion  
18 concerning the membership awards for  
19 individuals. Yesterday we had a new  
20 resolution that was submitted. We  
21 rejected it.

22 However, I don't think we did  
23 the Association any good by leaving out

1 the Lofgren award for individuals. And  
2 the reason why I say that is this: In  
3 standing rule 5(c)(2), Charles E.  
4 Lofgren Membership Award for  
5 Individuals. These awards will be  
6 competitively awarded to one shipmate  
7 from among the branches within each  
8 membership group. That's one through  
9 five.

10 The determining criteria will be  
11 the reported FRA member who has  
12 recruited the greatest number during the  
13 proceeding 1 April through 31 March.  
14 Each branch will report to the Chairman  
15 National Committee on membership  
16 retention the name of its nominee and  
17 the number of members the nominees has  
18 recruited. This report shall arrive in  
19 the national headquarters prior to 31  
20 May.

21 My question is: Unless we have  
22 access to find out how many people have  
23 recruited a member in our branch, how

1 can we submit that information to  
2 headquarters by 31 May?

3 Anybody know? Anybody know?

4 SHIPMATE: On the membership  
5 member.

6 SHIPMATE COLLINS: So, I am going  
7 to make a motion for this time only -- or  
8 maybe not -- that we give an award to --  
9 the Charles E. Lofgren Membership Award  
10 for individuals for one from each group --  
11 and I know we are in a budget constraint.  
12 I understand that. It could be a  
13 certificate, it could be a small token  
14 gift or whatever. Because I do not want  
15 the individual shipmates to go  
16 unrecognized.

17 (Applause.)

18 NP CAMPBELL: Dies for the lack of  
19 a second.

20 SHIPMATE TOULOTTE: Delegate  
21 Branch 24, Valerie Toulotte, second.

22 NP CAMPBELL: It died for a lack  
23 of second.

1 SHIPMATE COLLINS: She just made  
2 the second.

3 SHIPMATE: It's already died.

4 SHIPMATE COLLINS: All right.  
5 Well, I hope you go back and tell your  
6 shipmates that did their top recruiting in  
7 their branch that they won't be recognized  
8 for this year.

9 Thank you very much.

10 SHIPMATE: Thank you.

11 SHIPMATE BLACKBURN: Shipmate  
12 National President, Shipmates, Blackburn,  
13 Delegate Branch 8.

14 If I may comment on our past  
15 director of membership's remarks on  
16 there. If the branch secretary who has  
17 access to membership resources can go  
18 up, pull up the shipmate's name and it  
19 has the number of delegate -- or number  
20 of members recruited right on his  
21 profile.

22 NP CAMPBELL: Thank you.

23 At this time, we are going to

1 start with the elections of the national  
2 officers.

3 PRPSE HANDZUK: Shipmate National  
4 President?

5 NP CAMPBELL: Shipmate at the mic.

6 PRPSE HANDZUK: Handzuk, Delegate  
7 126. I don't mean to interrupt but don't  
8 we typically do new business -- any other  
9 new business before elections?

10 NP CAMPBELL: After.

11 PRPSE HANDZUK: After? I stand  
12 corrected.

13 NP CAMPBELL: At this time, I  
14 would like to call Ambassador Executor  
15 Director to the podium -- roster, excuse  
16 me.

17 NED SLAWINSKI: Shipmates, the  
18 nominated resolution for national  
19 president can be found on Tab Victor and  
20 NR-1. I will just read the resolved.

21 (As read): "Resolved, West  
22 Jacksonville Branch 126, FRA,  
23 Jacksonville, Florida, at a regularly

1 scheduled meeting on 17 February, 2022,  
2 a quorum being present did vote  
3 unanimously to place the name of James  
4 E. "Robbie" Robbins in nomination for  
5 the office of National President of the  
6 Fleet Reserve Association for the year  
7 2022-2023; and be it further resolved,  
8 that the members of West Jacksonville  
9 Branch 126, Jacksonville, Florida,  
10 earnestly solicit the support and  
11 endorsement of each branch of the Fleet  
12 Reserve Association for the candidacy of  
13 the National Vice President James E.  
14 "Robbie" Robbins for the office of  
15 National President of the Fleet Reserve  
16 Association for the year 2022-2023.  
17 James J. Thomas, President, West  
18 Jacksonville Branch 126 and Martha  
19 Klinikowski, Secretary, West  
20 Jacksonville Branch 126."

21 Shipmate National President?

22 NP CAMPBELL: Are there any more  
23 candidates for the National President?

1 (no response.)

2 NP CAMPBELL: Are there any more  
3 candidates for National President?

4 (No response).

5 NP CAMPBELL: Are there any more  
6 candidates for the National President?

7 (No response.)

8 NP CAMPBELL: Shipmate at the mic.

9 JPNP FULTON: We are going to  
10 close nominations?

11 NP CAMPBELL: Oh. Nominations  
12 closed.

13 JPNP FULTON: Shipmate National  
14 President, Fulton, Junior Past move that  
15 the NED cast one ballot in unanimity for  
16 James "Robbie" Robbins National President.

17 (Applause.)

18 NP CAMPBELL: At this time, I  
19 would like to invite the National  
20 President Elect, Robbie Robbins.

21 (Applause.)

22 NVP ROBBINS: Shipmates, this is a  
23 great honor and a great responsibility



1     that I am undertaking. And the first  
2     thing I am going to say is I am not going  
3     to make any promises or guarantees. I am  
4     going to work for you and everything that  
5     we need to do, we've got a lot of hard  
6     work ahead of us. We've got to save this  
7     Association and that's where my heart is  
8     right now. After being on budget and  
9     finance and everything and understanding  
10    the situation that we are in, I am going  
11    to need the help of everybody in this room  
12    to help save this organization.

13               And I want to thank every  
14    shipmate out here that has got your  
15    faith in me, and I will do my best. And  
16    I guarantee you I know I will make a  
17    mistake and I've got people here that  
18    will correct me, slap my hand or  
19    whatever. But I am going to be asking a  
20    lot of help from you shipmates sitting  
21    out here in front of me. And I want to  
22    thank you-all very much.

23                       (Applause.)

1           NP CAMPBELL:  Congratulations,  
2 Shipmate.

3           Now we will move on to the  
4 elections of the National Vice  
5 President.  We have two candidates, Past  
6 Regional President Southeast John  
7 Handzuk; Past Regional President East  
8 Coast, Don Hoover.

9           I will ask the National  
10 Executive Director to read the resolves  
11 of both candidates.

12           NED SLAWINSKI:  For the office of  
13 National Vice President, resolved, that  
14 West Jacksonville Branch 126, FRA, at a  
15 regularly scheduled meeting on 17  
16 November, 2021, a quorum being present did  
17 with great pride and pleasure vote  
18 unanimously to place the name of John S.  
19 Handzuk in nomination for the office of  
20 National Vice President, Fleet Reserve  
21 Association for the year 2022-2023;  and  
22 be it further resolved, that West  
23 Jacksonville Branch 126 sincerely solicits

1 the support and endorsement of all  
2 branches of the Fleet Reserve Association  
3 for the candidacy of Past Regional  
4 President Southeast for the office of  
5 National Vice President 2022-2023, James  
6 J. Thomas, President West Jacksonville  
7 Branch 126 and Martha Klinikowski,  
8 Secretary, West Jacksonville Branch 126.

9 For the office of National Vice  
10 President, resolved, Annapolis Branch  
11 24, at a regularly scheduled meeting on  
12 February 8, 2022, a quorum being present  
13 did with great pride and pleasure render  
14 a majority vote to place the name Donald  
15 A. Hoover for nomination to the office  
16 of National Vice President, Fleet  
17 Reserve Association for the year  
18 2022-2023; and be it further resolved,  
19 Annapolis Branch 024 sincerely solicits  
20 the support and endorsement of all  
21 branches of the Fleet Reserve  
22 Association for the candidacy of Past  
23 Regional President East Coast, Donald A.

1 Hoover, for the office of National Vice  
2 President 2022-2023. Patrick Guibao,  
3 Second Vice President, Annapolis Branch  
4 24 -- I was going to call you Penny --  
5 Pleasala --

6 SHIPMATE COLLINS: Pleasala.

7 NED SLAWINSKI: Pleasala -- thank  
8 you. Thank you, Shipmate -- J. Collins,  
9 Secretary/Treasurer, Annapolis Branch 24.

10 Shipmate National President?

11 NP CAMPBELL: Are there any other  
12 nominations for National Vice President?

13 (No response.)

14 NP CAMPBELL: Are there any other  
15 nominations for National Vice President?

16 SHIPMATE POSEKANY: Shipmate  
17 National President?

18 NP CAMPBELL: Shipmate at the mic.

19 SHIPMATE POSEKANY: Posekany,  
20 Delegate Chair Branch 298 Grand Rapids,  
21 Michigan, where it is still snowing.

22 Shipmates in north central  
23 region agree they have a qualified

1 candidate for office of National Vice  
2 President, so I proudly nominate  
3 Regional President North Central Maria  
4 Beam for National Vice President.

5 RP BEHM: Shipmate President,  
6 Shipmates, I do honorably would like to --  
7 unfortunately would have to decline that  
8 at this point.

9 However, while I am speaking, my  
10 associates are handing out the  
11 resolution that had been voted on and  
12 signed by our branch. And you will be  
13 seeing me next year.

14 NP CAMPBELL: Thank you.

15 RP BEHM: Thank you.

16 NP CAMPBELL: Shipmate at the mic.

17 SHIPMATE LARSON: National  
18 President, Larson, Delegate, Branch 94.

19 Shipmates, I lay before you a  
20 candidate who is embedded in FRA's three  
21 cardinal principles: Loyalty,  
22 protection and service. Shipmate being  
23 Past Regional President Northwest,

1 Peter, AKA "Lazzaretti." Thank you.

2 PRPNW LAZZARETTI: Shipmate

3 National President?

4 NP CAMPBELL: Shipmate at the mic.

5 Go ahead, Pete.

6 PRPNW LAZZARETTI: Lazzaretti,

7 Delegate Chair, Seattle Branch 18.

8 Thank you, Shipmate Don, for the  
9 nomination. At this point in time I  
10 must decline in favor of running next  
11 year in Reno. I have my nominee  
12 resolution in hand to turn over to  
13 national headquarters.

14 Thank you for your  
15 consideration, Shipmates. And I will  
16 see you-all next year.

17 NP CAMPBELL: Any other  
18 nominations for National Vice President?

19 (No response.)

20 NP CAMPBELL: Hearing no others,  
21 nominations are closed.

22 At this time, I would like to  
23 invite Regional President Southeast John

1 Handzuk to come forward and spread some  
2 words of wisdom.

3 PRPSE HANDZUK: Good afternoon,  
4 Shipmates. I am going to make this short  
5 and sweet. I passed out resolutions this  
6 morning. My resolution is in your  
7 delegate kit. That is who I am. It's  
8 what I've done. I have been dedicated to  
9 the Association for 40 years. I am  
10 prepared, willing and ready to step up to  
11 serve you.

12 Forty years ago I joined the FRA  
13 on active duty training recruits which  
14 it says in the resolution. To this day,  
15 I remember my first three mentors. I  
16 remember what each of them told me  
17 individually and I have practiced it  
18 ever since. I always do what is in the  
19 best interest of the shipmates, their  
20 families and the FRA. That is my pledge  
21 to you.

22 Will I make mistakes? Yes. I'm  
23 human. I will own it. I will learn

1 from it. But I will do my level best to  
2 do what I just said, serve the  
3 Association, your families and you.  
4 Thank you.

5 NP CAMPBELL: Thank you, Shipmate  
6 John.

7 At this time, I would like to  
8 call up Past Regional President East  
9 Coast Don Hoover.

10 PRPEC HOOVER: Shipmates, my name  
11 is Don Hoover. I am a Past Regional  
12 President East Coast of Annapolis Branch  
13 24.

14 I am a candidate for National  
15 Vice President. I would like to ask you  
16 to remember three numbers. The first  
17 one is number one. The second one is  
18 number 103, and the third one is number  
19 29,948. You see me up here on the  
20 platform in front of everybody and the  
21 reason being, contrary to popular  
22 belief, is because I am the least  
23 important person in the entire room.



1 The people that are important and the  
2 reason I am raised on the platform is  
3 because it's important that I can see  
4 you and see what I have got to do for  
5 you. I can see your faces. I see your  
6 expressions. I see your knowledge.

7 I know that it's my obligation  
8 to support one of those numbers, 103  
9 delegates in this room. That's easy. I  
10 could stand up here and see that. The  
11 difficult part is you guys sitting down  
12 there in the room, all of the shipmates,  
13 because your obligation, along with me,  
14 is to support that 29,928 shipmates that  
15 are out there around the world.

16 We're not here because we want  
17 to be here. We're not here because it's  
18 important what we want. We are here  
19 because it's important what they want  
20 and what they send us here to do.  
21 That's our obligation. That's the  
22 reason we are here. And not only now  
23 but every day that we meet at a branch

1 meeting that we attend places around the  
2 world.

3 That's our obligation to take  
4 care of our shipmates. And that's what  
5 I promise to do for you if you elect me  
6 your next National Vice President. I  
7 appreciate your time. Thank you very  
8 much.

9 (Applause.)

10 NP CAMPBELL: At this time, we are  
11 going to take a 10-minute break so that  
12 you can as branches can caucus and talk  
13 over before we call for the roll call  
14 vote.

15 National Chaplain, would you  
16 please close the Bible.

17 NCHAP LYMON: Shipmate National  
18 President, the Bible is closed.

19 NP CAMPBELL: Thank you, Shipmate  
20 Chaplain.

21 (At which time, a recess was  
22 taken.)

23 NP CAMPBELL: National Chaplain,

1 will you open the Bible? Uncover.

2 NCHAP LYMON: Shipmate National  
3 President, the Bible is open.

4 NP CAMPBELL: Shipmate at the mic.

5 JPNP FULTON: Shipmate National  
6 President, the Junior Past remains in  
7 uniform of the day.

8 (Applause.)

9 NP CAMPBELL: Thank you.

10 I am going to have the  
11 Credentials Chairman come up for a  
12 moment.

13 PRPNW LAZZARETTI: Again, good  
14 afternoon, Shipmates. In the one hour  
15 between credential reports, there has been  
16 no changes in all numbers from the fourth  
17 credentials report with the time stamp of  
18 1256 still remains in play.

19 If there is any questions?

20 (No response.)

21 PRPNW LAZZARETTI: Thank you,  
22 Shipmates.

23 NP CAMPBELL: We will proceed on

1 with the election of the National  
2 Executive Director.

3 SHIPMATE: No.

4 NP CAMPBELL: At least I know you  
5 are paying attention. Thank you.

6 We are voting for the National  
7 Vice President. I am going to turn it  
8 over to the NED. We will be doing a  
9 role call vote starting from largest to  
10 smallest branch number wise.

11 NED SLAWINSKI: Shipmates, the  
12 tally can be found on Tab X-ray.

13 As the National President  
14 stated, this year's voting will commence  
15 with the largest number branch to the  
16 smallest number branch. Please, if you  
17 are a delegate, delegate chairman,  
18 identify yourself first and then state  
19 how many votes. I will call for the  
20 branch and the number of votes you have  
21 and then repeat it afterwards. Then the  
22 next branch comes up and I will call  
23 that branch.

1           So, let's commence. Branch 382,  
2 five votes.

3           SHIPMATE FAUBION: Faubion,  
4 Delegate from Branch 104 with proxy for  
5 382. Five votes for Handzuk.

6           NED SLAWINSKI: Branch 382, five  
7 votes Handzuk. Branch 377, one vote.

8           RP BEHM: Shipmate Behm, Branch  
9 32, proxy 377. How many votes did you  
10 say?

11          NED SLAWINSKI: One.

12          RP BEHM: One vote for Handzuk.

13          NED SLAWINSKI: Branch 377, one  
14 vote Handzuk. Branch 367, six votes.

15          PRPNW LAZZARETTI: Lazzaretti,  
16 proxy for Branch 367. All votes Handzuk  
17 per instruction.

18          NED SLAWINSKI: Branch 367, six  
19 votes Handzuk. Branch 364, two votes.

20          SHIPMATE BOYLL: Shipmate Boyll,  
21 Branch 364, two votes Handzuk.

22          NED SLAWINSKI: Branch 364, two  
23 votes Handzuk. Branch 342, two votes.

1 DLP DAVIS: Davis, Branch 38

2 Delegate, proxy for 342, two votes

3 Handzuk.

4 NED SLAWINSKI: Branch 342, two

5 votes Handzuk. Branch 335, two votes.

6 PNP BEESE: Beese, Branch 335, two

7 votes Handzuk.

8 NED SLAWINSKI: Branch 335, two

9 votes Handzuk. Branch 316, five votes.

10 SHIPMATE POSEKANY: Posekany,

11 Delegate Chair, Branch 298, Grand Rapids

12 proxy for Branch 316, five votes Handzuk.

13 NED SLAWINSKI: Branch 316, five

14 votes Handzuk. Branch 311, three votes.

15 final tally, 637 to 190 -- wait a minute.  
16 That doesn't mathematically come out --  
17 but it's close enough. It's missing one  
18 vote -- or three votes.

19 The new National Vice President  
20 Elect is Shipmate --

21 SHIPMATE: What was the vote  
22 again?

23 NED SLAWINSKI: 637 to 190

1 according to the calculation tally  
2 committee. That's the numbers that they  
3 provided us. So, 637 to 190, Shipmate  
4 John Handzuk.

5 (Applause.)

6 NED SLAWINSKI: Your new National  
7 Vice President Elect.

8 NP CAMPBELL: Shipmate John, your  
9 presence is requested.

10 (Applause.)

11 (Brief pause.)

12 (Voices.)

13 NP CAMPBELL: Let's show some  
14 respect for our new National Vice  
15 President.

16 SHIPMATE: Quiet, please.

17 SHIPMATE: Gavel them.

18 SHIPMATE: He just did.

19 (Brief pause.)

20 (Applause.)

21 PRPSE HANDZUK: Shipmates, my wife  
22 is going to laugh like the daylights, I'm  
23 at a loss of words.

1 (Laughing.)

2 PRPSE HANDZUK: I am truly  
3 humbled. I thank you for your confidence.  
4 And as I stated earlier before the vote, I  
5 believe in the three cardinal principals.  
6 I will work for you, your families and the  
7 Association. Thank you. God bless you.

8 Allow me to present my wonderful  
9 bride of 29 years, Ava Fulbright. There  
10 were some naysayers back in '93 when we  
11 got married, it wouldn't last,  
12 seriously. It has. We have had our  
13 bumps in the road, but I got to tell you  
14 this too, I couldn't have done what I  
15 have done since I married this lady  
16 without her. I am humbly indebted to  
17 her.

18 Shipmates, again, thank you.  
19 God bless you-all.

20 (Voices.)

21 (Brief pause.)

22 (Applause.)

23 NP CAMPBELL: All right, folks.

1 Shipmates, now we will proceed  
2 on with the election of the National  
3 Executive Director. I will call up the  
4 NED right now.

5 NED SLAWINSKI: Shipmates, this  
6 can be found -- the nominated resolution  
7 for National Executive Director under Tab  
8 Victor, page NR-4 and NR-5. Again, I will  
9 only read the resolved.

10 (As read): "Resolved, that Navy  
11 Department Branch 181, Fleet Reserve  
12 Association at a regularly scheduled  
13 meeting, 4 November 2021, a quorum being  
14 present, did with great pride and  
15 pleasure unanimously again nominate  
16 Christopher J. Slawinski for the Office  
17 of National Executive Director, Fleet  
18 Reserve Association for the Association  
19 years of 2022 to 2025; and be it further  
20 resolved, that Navy Department Branch  
21 181 sincerely solicits the support and  
22 endorsement of all branches of the Fleet  
23 Reserve Association for the candidacy of

1 Christopher J. Slawinski, for the Office  
2 of National Executive Director. Richard  
3 Lane, President, Branch 181.

4 Christopher J. Slawinski, Secretary,  
5 Branch 181."

6 Shipmate National President?

7 NP CAMPBELL: Are there any other  
8 nominations for National Executive  
9 Director?

10 (No response.)

11 NP CAMPBELL: Are there any other  
12 nominations for National Executive  
13 Director?

14 SHIPMATE MARTIN: Shipmate  
15 National president?

16 NP CAMPBELL: Shipmate at the mic.

17 SHIPMATE MARTIN: Delegate Martin,  
18 166. It is my distinct pleasure to  
19 nominate Past National President Jeffrey  
20 Gilmartin, Branch 207, to the office of  
21 NED.

22 SHIPMATE GILMARTIN: Shipmate  
23 National President, Gilmartin, 207

1 Delegate. I humbly accept the nomination.

2 NP CAMPBELL: Thank you, Shipmate.

3 Shipmate at the mic.

4 SHIPMATE: Shipmate National  
5 President, I have a resolve here from  
6 Branch 207 in support of Jeff Gilmartin  
7 for the National Executive Director  
8 position that I would like to read.

9 (As read): "The Potomac Branch  
10 207 Fleet Reserve Association at a  
11 regularly scheduled meeting held on  
12 September 3, 2022, a quorum being  
13 present, did vote unanimously to place  
14 the name of Shipmate Past National  
15 President Jeffrey A. Gilmartin in  
16 nomination for the office of National  
17 Executive Director, Fleet Reserve  
18 Association for the Association years  
19 2022 through 2025; and be it further  
20 resolved, that the shipmates from the  
21 Potomac Branch 207 earnestly solicit the  
22 support of each branch in the Fleet  
23 Reserve Association to endorse the

1 election of Past National President  
2 Jeffrey Gilmartin to the office of the  
3 National Executive Director for the  
4 Fleet Reserve Association."

5 NP CAMPBELL: Thank you.

6 Is there anyone else for  
7 nomination of National Executive  
8 Director?

9 (No response.)

10 NP CAMPBELL: Voting is closed --  
11 or nominations are closed. Excuse me.

12 At this time, I would like to  
13 invite Past National President Jeff  
14 Gilmartin up to the roster to address  
15 the assembly.

16 MS. MARTIN: National President,  
17 National Officers, Past National Officers,  
18 Regional Officers, Past Regional Officers,  
19 Shipmates, I was advised when I was doing  
20 this to be as pippy as possible to make  
21 sure everybody stayed awake during the  
22 late afternoon hours. So, I will do as  
23 directed, not necessarily my preferred but



1 to keep my supporters happy.

2 Shipmates, the FRA has a  
3 501(c)(19) business enterprise that is  
4 both ineffective and inefficient but at  
5 least it's expensive. We have a  
6 bottomless, cumbersome, outdated set of  
7 bylaws as was underscored by yesterday's  
8 report by the Membership Retention  
9 Convention Committee.

10 No Lofgren awards for  
11 individuals were awarded because  
12 although pertinent data had been  
13 provided by iMIS in the past, the bylaws  
14 still test the branches to submit  
15 nominees. Clearly the bylaws have not  
16 been updated since the implementation of  
17 iMIS, which I believe is about 15 years.

18 We have a budget bleeding cash  
19 so great that the rate we financially  
20 castrated our Americanism essay contest  
21 and slashed our American's budget from  
22 45,000 to 14,000 to ratify a \$113,630  
23 salary for the office of NED. The NED

1 salary has gone from 100,000 in 2021 to  
2 113 in 2022 to 116 in 2023.

3 If elected I will seek a salary  
4 of \$75,000 commensurate with the GS-11,  
5 which will save the Association \$41,000.

6 I will also find my second page.  
7 Membership continues to plummet but root  
8 causes are neither acknowledged nor  
9 addressed. Membership declines because  
10 the Association fails to provide a  
11 reason to part with \$40 a year. We need  
12 to provide a good or service that a  
13 shipmate can only get from the FRA.

14 Before TRICARE, the FRA provided  
15 a health insurance supplemental only  
16 available to FRA. The FRA was the chief  
17 architect of CHAMPUS. The FRA hasn't  
18 had a successful legislative victory  
19 independent of the Military Coalition in  
20 almost 40 years.

21 Where is our call to end the  
22 mandatory COVID injections? The  
23 Commander in Chief declared the pandemic

1 over but DOD continues to design the  
2 latest exemptions and process and  
3 discharge shipmates even though none of  
4 the services are achieving recruiting  
5 goals.

6 COVID injections have been  
7 proven to cause fertility issues with  
8 females and myocarditis in young fit  
9 males. We would be the only BSO  
10 defending active duty medical  
11 protection.

12 Where is our call to end GMT,  
13 General Military Training on the proper  
14 use of pronouns. We can't win a war  
15 like this. People that are eligible and  
16 in are being processed out and nobody  
17 wants to join what the military is  
18 offering.

19 Win or loss on this discussion,  
20 if we were to advocate this and join  
21 with the Freedom Caucus who on Capital  
22 Hill said they will not support the DOD  
23 funding bill if the COVID mandates are

1 still there.

2 Win or lose, we win. Because  
3 the shipmates that are being processed  
4 out and the shipmates that are fighting  
5 the good fight are going to say hey,  
6 there is somebody fighting for us and  
7 that will give them a reason to spend  
8 \$40 to join us.

9 Shipmates, if elected I will  
10 strive to address those issues to  
11 astonish the redding of our budget as I  
12 have been advocating for the past 25  
13 years while seeking to broaden our  
14 appeal to potential recruits.

15 Thank you for your consideration  
16 and I ask for your vote.

17 (Applause.)

18 NP CAMPBELL: At this time, I will  
19 call up NED Chris Slawinski.

20 NED SLAWINSKI: Thank you,  
21 Shipmate National President, National  
22 Officers, Past National Officers, Regional  
23 Officers, Shipmates.

1 I joined Fleet Reserve  
2 Association in August of 2004. I did it  
3 more to honor a friend of mine's dad  
4 than anything else. He was a Pearl  
5 Harbor survivor. While I was  
6 researching the Fleet Reserve  
7 Association, I found that the  
8 Association was in search of a veteran  
9 service officers, someone who could step  
10 up and help veterans.

11 I applied for the job and I was  
12 accepted by National Executive Director  
13 meritorious Joe Barnes. I worked with  
14 him and the staff since October of 2004.  
15 In 2019 you honored me with taking this  
16 position of National Executive Director.  
17 I came looking for a way for the  
18 Association to move forward not only to  
19 our centennial but beyond. I did not  
20 know I was going to face the mess that I  
21 did.

22 I walked into the office of  
23 National Executive Director to find

1     there was fraud in the Finance  
2     Department. For those who have not  
3     heard, that we could not get audits done  
4     because the auditors were not satisfied  
5     with documentation that associated with  
6     credit card statements. And come to  
7     find out later, those statements were  
8     because the finance officer -- the  
9     former finance officer was basically  
10    stealing us blind. I worked very  
11    diligently to correct that. I got a  
12    forensic auditor. I contacted our legal  
13    folks, got a forensic auditor that we  
14    could trust and got it started and got  
15    it completed. We are now working on the  
16    2021 audit so we are current on our  
17    audits.

18           So, again, I worked very  
19    diligently to not only make sure that  
20    the Association is in good standing but  
21    we have a very good idea, a fiscal  
22    picture, of where we are and where we  
23    are going. As you know, because of that

1 fraud we pursued legal recourse against  
2 that individual. He has now been  
3 charged and is waiting trial in Virginia  
4 courts. We did our due diligence. We  
5 went to our insurance company for theft.  
6 We have recovered the majority of the  
7 money minus our deductible. So, we have  
8 been made good for the most part for the  
9 money that was taken. It was almost a  
10 half million dollars.

11 Again, I've been throughout my  
12 three years open and honest with you. I  
13 have tried my best to make sure that I  
14 got the message out of what was going on  
15 good and bad in headquarters. You heard  
16 this morning what we have to do budget  
17 wise. I am ready and prepared to take  
18 that on. I have been working very, very  
19 diligently on finding ways to make money  
20 for the Association, both membership  
21 wise and nonmembership wise.

22 We've worked with our friends at  
23 the former KVI, then Mercer, then Marsh

1 and now AMBA. I had dinner with Michele  
2 Arnesto. We are starting to put a plan  
3 together for membership development,  
4 which they will assist us in helping pay  
5 for the marketing. So, I am excited  
6 about that portion. The FO mentioned a  
7 database that they have. They have more  
8 than 60 million members in their  
9 database, about a million of them would  
10 fit our category. That's what he was  
11 talking about.

12 My next three years, if elected,  
13 is recruit, recruit, recruit. Again,  
14 finding ways to get the message out of  
15 what is the value and what is the  
16 benefit of the Fleet Reserve  
17 Association. It's not all gloom and  
18 doom. It's -- it's again we are -- we  
19 are the advocates for pay and benefits  
20 for those who serve and have served and  
21 are retired from the military, their  
22 spouses and families.

23 Fundraising, not only with our



1 centennial but also working with the new  
2 established Veterans Service Foundation  
3 Board, we are going to work very hard to  
4 find those corporate dollars and find a  
5 way to make sure that we can be  
6 physically sound, not only for  
7 centennial but beyond.

8           It's going to be a difficult  
9 task to find a new headquarters. We  
10 purchased the building in 1990 and we  
11 have had it as our home since then. But  
12 as associations come and go, it's time  
13 for us to change. My staff that I have,  
14 I had a difficult decision to make on  
15 how it's going to look, not only in the  
16 next six months but the next three  
17 years. There are going to be some  
18 difficult choices that have to be made.  
19 I am ready to make them.

20           Finally, I know there has been a  
21 lot of rumors about my health, and I am  
22 going to address it right here. There  
23 is no doctor in this building that

1 basically can tell you what I have been  
2 going through. I have gone to Walter  
3 Reed for my treatment for prostate  
4 cancer. I have been given every  
5 assurance by my doctors that everything  
6 is stable and that I am physically sound  
7 to work and sound to be here. If I  
8 wasn't, I wouldn't be here.

9 I want you to know that I am --  
10 I am dedicated to you. I love you-all.  
11 No matter what the decision is, I will  
12 accept it and we will move forward and  
13 get this Association back on track to be  
14 the best organization, best association  
15 in the country. Thank you.

16 (Applause.)

17 NP CAMPBELL: Okay. We have heard  
18 from both candidates. We are going to  
19 take a 10-minute break so that you can  
20 caucus. Then we will come back in.

21 National Chaplain, would you  
22 please close the Bible.

23 (Voices.)

1           NP CAMPBELL: Keep it down, folks,  
2 please.

3           NCHAP LYMON: Shipmate National  
4 President, the Bible is closed.

5           NP CAMPBELL: Thank you.  
6 10-minute recess.

7                   (At which time, a brief  
8 recess was held.)

9           NP CAMPBELL: Shipmate  
10 Master-At-Arms, would you invite the  
11 shipmates in to the hall and close the  
12 doors, please.

13           SMAA: Shipmate National  
14 President, all the shipmates are in and  
15 the doors are closed.

16           NP CAMPBELL: Shipmate National  
17 Chaplain, would you open the Bible,  
18 please.

19           NCHAP LYMON: Shipmate National  
20 President, the Bible is open.

21           NP CAMPBELL: Thank you.

22                   (Discussion was held off the  
23 record.)

1 NP CAMPBELL: Shipmate at the mic.

2 JPNP FULTON: Shipmate National  
3 President, hopefully for the last time,  
4 the Junior Past President is in the  
5 uniform of the day.

6 NP CAMPBELL: Thank you.

7 (Applause.)

8 (Discussion was held off the  
9 record.)

10 NP CAMPBELL: At this time, I am  
11 going to call on the Finance Officer to  
12 come up and go through the voting process  
13 for the National Executive Director  
14 voting.

15 Thank you.
