1 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: This
2 assembly will now come to order.

3 Shipmate Master-At-Arms, will you
4 invite the Shipmates to enter the convention
5 hall and close the doors, please.

6 Shipmate National Chaplain open the
7 Bible.

8 NMAA LYMON: Shipmate National
9 President, the Bible is open.

10 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Thank
11 you Shipmate Chaplain.

12 Join me in saluting the flag.
13 Flag salute.

14 Do you want to sit down? Now you
15 want to sit down. Shipmate at the mic?

16 Hold down the chatter.

17 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Shipmate
18 National President, let the report reflect the
19 Junior Past National President is in uniform
20 today.

21 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Now I
22 declare that the Second Business Session of
23 the 94th National Convention convened.

1 At this time I would like to
2 request a credentials report, second
3 credential.

4 CHRMN CREDENTIALS LAZARETTI: Good
5 afternoon, Shipmates.

6 (Chorus of good afternoon.)

7 PRPNW LAZARETTI: Under tab x-ray
8 on tally sheet four, I do have
9 amendments there. Under branch 67, the NBR is
10 36-22 for the suspension of their charter.

11 Tally page four under tab x-ray,
12 branch 67, 0 votes. NBR 36-22 for the
13 suspension of their charter. On page five,
14 branch 4, 0, votes NBR 30-22 for the
15 revocation of their charter.

16 For those Shipmates familiar with
17 Past National President Kilgore, he reached
18 out from the ethers and popped me upside the
19 head for having those reversed.

20 Here is the second credentials
21 report for the 94th FRA National Convention.
22 On tab "Joe," column two, authorized voting
23 strength is 891. Number of branches

1 represented by delegates, 52. Number of votes
2 represented by delegates, 485. Number of
3 branches registered by proxy, 86. Number of
4 votes registered by proxy, 364. Number of
5 branches not registered, 17 out of 149. The
6 number of delegates registered for this
7 convention is 103. Registered voting strength
8 is 849. The number of votes not registered,
9 42. Two-thirds majority, 566. Majority vote
10 is 45.

11 I call for a motion, please.

12 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: So move.

13 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Comes
14 Lickteig 161 2nd, I think you're supposed to
15 make the motion yourself there, Pete.

16 PRPNW LAZARETTI: I did.

17 SHIPMATE LICKTEIG: I second.

18 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: We
19 have a motion and a second. Shipmate at the
20 mic, Hanzel, 230, Glensdale, what time is this
21 report?

22 RPWC HANZEL: For those individuals
23 who have a hard time figuring things out,

1 Mickey's hand --

2 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: Come on.

3 RPWC HANZEL: Okay. The
4 credentials report was effective at 1256
5 hours, for those individuals who want the time
6 stamp. And Shipmate Bell, if you don't know
7 what today's date is, it's today. You are in
8 Alabama.

9 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: He was
10 asking what time it was as of 1256 hours
11 today.

12 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: All
13 right. We have a motion and second. All in
14 favorite?

15 (Chorus of ayes.)

16 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
17 Opposed?

18 (No response.)

19 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: So be
20 it. Thank you. At this time I'd like to call
21 out Shipmate Posekany for his committee on
22 Constitution and Bylaws.

23 Keep the chatter down.

1 PRNPC POSEKANY: Good afternoon,
2 Shipmates. If I can see what I wrote.

3 The National Convention Committee
4 and Constitution Bylaws, and Resolutions met
5 in the Dorset Room of the Hyatt Regency
6 Wynfrey Hotel in Birmingham, Alabama, on
7 Wednesday, 19 October 2022, at 0900 this
8 morning.

9 The National Convention Committee
10 on Constitution Bylaws, and Resolutions met in
11 the Dorset Room with the following present:
12 Myself, PRPNC Marty Posekany, Wolverine Branch
13 298, as Chair.

14 Members present: Past Regional
15 President East Coast Donald Hoover, Annapolis
16 Branch 24; Past Regional President Southwest
17 Donald Kelley, Imperial Beach Branch 289; Past
18 Regional President Southwest John F. Quesnel,
19 Jr., Imperial Beach Branch 289; Past Regional
20 President West Coast Charles R. McIntyre,
21 Santa Clara Valley Branch 101; Past Regional
22 President East Coast S.D. Martin, Virginia
23 Beach, Virginia Branch 166.

1 Another member we've been in
2 contact with this year Randy Phillip, Past
3 Regional President East Coast was excused for
4 a family emergency.

5 Advisor present was Past National
6 President Jeffrey Gilmartin from Potomac
7 Branch 207.

8 Visitors that stopped in and
9 spoke with us: Past National President Larry
10 Boudreaux, Hangtown Branch 275 -- somebody put
11 PRP -- Past Regional President North Central
12 Maria Behm Branch 32; and Past National
13 President George Hyland, Branch 20.

14 Shipmates, we're going to use the
15 same procedures that's been used for the past
16 several years. I will read the pertinent
17 resolved portion of the resolution at which
18 time it becomes pending automatically. No
19 motion or seconding is necessary. I will then
20 read the committee's recommendation and give
21 the rationale after which the presiding
22 officer will direct traffic and call for a
23 discussion.

1 We will either recommend, the
2 President rule it out of order, or we will
3 recommend adoption; we will recommend
4 rejection; we will recommend to amend and
5 adopt as amended, et cetera.

6 Please remember, any time you're
7 voting, you will be voting on the resolution
8 itself, not the recommendation of the
9 committee.

10 Let's start with general
11 resolution number one, submitted by GEM State
12 branch 382. Resolved: The following
13 resolution be submitted to the 2023 FRA
14 National Convention. FRA National
15 Headquarters hold a minimum of a one-year
16 moratorium on withdrawing any funds,
17 distributing life membership PCT funds to all
18 branches, and National FRA bank accounts until
19 the Life Membership Program is in compliance
20 with the FRA Constitution and Bylaws section
21 913 and 914. A report of the status of the
22 compliance shall be made by the FRA National
23 President 60 days prior to the 2023 National

1 Convention. It was signed by Danny Hunt and
2 Roger Christopher.

3 The Constitution Bylaws and
4 Resolutions recommendation: This committee
5 recommends to amend and adopt. Amend by
6 striking out, in line three, PCT funds to all
7 branches and -- inserting the word "to" in its
8 place. So the amended resolved reads:
9 Resolved, the following resolution be
10 submitted to the 2023 FRA National
11 Conventional.

12 FRA National headquarters hold a
13 minimum of a one-year moratorium on
14 withdrawing any funds, distributing life
15 membership and national -- to national FRA
16 bank accounts until the Life Membership
17 Program is in compliance with the FRA National
18 Constitution Bylaws Section 913 and 914. A
19 report of the status of compliance shall be
20 made by the FRA National President 60 days
21 prior to the 2023 National Convention.

22 The rationale for this: This
23 committee feels that withholding PCT funds for

1 Life Membership to branches for the upcoming
2 year will unduly punish branches and cause
3 monetary hardship for them. Many branches
4 rely on the Life Membership PCT as operating
5 revenue.

6 Shipmate National President.

7 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:

8 Shipmate at the mic?

9 NED SLAWINSKI: Slawinski,
10 delegate, Branch 181, National Executive
11 Director.

12 I request this resolution be
13 ruled not in order in that it should have been
14 presented to the budget and finance committee
15 since they have oversight on reserve funds and
16 operating funds and that they should have made
17 the recommendation and this recommendation
18 again is going to put a financial burden on
19 not only the branches but the National
20 Association.

21 And we also have had a moratorium
22 on taking funds out of the life membership for
23 the past -- at least past twelve months. So

1 we've already done a majority of that. And we
2 believe that it does need to be reviewed and
3 we will probably make a recommendation for
4 making a life membership for the future -- for
5 the future of members. So I strongly
6 recommend that you rule this not in order.

7 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:

8 Shipmate at the mic.

9 PRPSE HANDZUK: Handzuk.

10 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:

11 Handzuk, I'm sorry.

12 PRPSE HANDZUK: Shipmate, National
13 President Handzuk, delegate 126. As a member
14 of the budget finance committee, I concur with
15 the recommendation. CDL says that all money
16 issues come before the budget and finance
17 committee and if need be, I will make this a
18 motion that it be ruled not in order.

19 (Chatter.)

20 SHIPMATE RANDALL: Charlie Randall,
21 branch 201, delegate. I second the motion to
22 table this thing or say no.

23 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: I

1 rule this resolution not in order.

2 PRPSW KELLY: Donald Kelley, 289.
3 Can you please make another notification about
4 the sidebar conversations because it's getting
5 very loud in this corner.

6 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: If
7 the sidebar continues, I will have the Master-
8 At-Arms escort whoever might be causing a
9 disruption. Thank you.

10 PRNPC POSEKANY: Okay. So the next
11 one: Constitution and Bylaws Resolutions
12 number one. Resolved. That's section 309(b)
13 revised to read: Section 309(b,) transfers
14 may be accomplished by a signed letter
15 requesting a transfer or an electronic message
16 requesting a transfer or a phone call to FRA
17 Member Services by the member. Request of
18 transfer shall be accepted from branch
19 secretaries as well as individual members
20 desiring to transfer.

21 Constitution Bylaws Committee
22 Recommendation: This committee recommends
23 adoption. The Rationale: This procedure has

1 been used now for many years. This change
2 simply reflects the process currently being
3 used and has no impact on membership
4 transfers. It simply makes them easier.

5 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Any
6 discussion on the resolution?

7 RPNC CUNNINGHAM: Cunningham,
8 Branch 14, delegate. The wording is kind of a
9 weird -- I would say transfers may be
10 accomplished by a signed letter requesting a
11 transfer by electronic message to transfer and
12 electronic message? I don't know. If
13 somebody else has something better, let me
14 know.

15 PRNPC POSEKANY: That would be a
16 grammatical and administrative. So that could
17 be taken care of during the editing portion of
18 it.

19 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: All
20 in favor aye.

21 (Chorus of ayes.)

22 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
23 Opposed?

1 (No response.)

2 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:

3 Adopted.

4 PRNPC POSEKANY: Constitution
5 Bylaws Resolution number two. Resolved: That
6 Article 6, section 606(b,) be deleted and
7 remaining sections of 606 be -- 606 be
8 renumbered, and section 607(a) Constitution
9 Bylaws Resolution shall be amended as:

10 607(a), each branch shall have
11 five votes regardless of members in good
12 standing as of 31 March. Branches instituted
13 on or after 1 April shall have one vote until
14 the following March 31st.

15 Constitution Bylaws
16 recommendation: This committee recommends
17 rejection.

18 Rationale: This blurs the line
19 between equality and equity. We have always
20 been a representation controlled by the
21 distributing votes in proportion to membership
22 numbers in each branch. This decreases the
23 desire to recruit and can ultimately hurt the

1 association's bottom line on members
2 recruited.

3 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
4 Discussion on resolution?

5 All in favor?

6 (Chorus of ayes.)

7 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
8 Opposed.

9 (Chorus of nos.)

10 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: So be
11 it, no.

12 Excuse me. That motion was
13 rejected. No resolution.

14 PRNPC POSEKANY: Constitution and
15 Bylaws Resolution number 3.

16 Resolved: That section 810(b) be
17 amended to read: The chairman of standing
18 committees shall make an annual report of
19 their activities to the National Board of
20 Directors and to the National Convention with
21 such recommendations as they deem proper.
22 Recommendations requiring action by National
23 Convention shall be submitted in accordance

1 with Section 612. The chairman may schedule
2 meetings via teleconference, video conference
3 or in person to discuss the recommendations.

4 The Constitution Bylaws and
5 Resolutions recommendation: This committee
6 recommends to amend and adopt as amended,
7 amend by inserting "or" in place of a comma
8 between teleconference and video and striking
9 "or in person" on the last sentence.

10 The amended resolve shall read:

11 Resolved: that Section 810(b) be
12 amended to read: The chairman of standing
13 committees shall make an annual report of
14 their activities to the national Board of
15 Directors and to the National Convention with
16 such recommendations as they deem proper.
17 Recommendations requiring action by the
18 National Convention shall be submitted in
19 accordance with Section 612. The Chairman may
20 schedule meetings via teleconference or video
21 conference to discuss recommendations.

22 The rationale for a
23 recommendation of adopt as such an amend --

1 amend and adopt as such in -- amend and adopt.
2 The rationale: There's no budget for
3 in-person meeting or travel expense. This
4 also does not preclude the committee members
5 from agreeing to meet in person and doing so
6 at their own expense.

7 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Going
8 to vote on the amendment? All in favor of the
9 amendment?

10 (Chorus of ayes.)

11 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: All
12 opposed?

13 (No response.)

14 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
15 Amendment passed.

16 Now, we'll vote on resolution as
17 amended. All in favor?

18 (Chorus of ayes.)

19 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
20 Opposed? So passed.

21 (No response.)

22 PRNPC POSEKANY: Constitution
23 Bylaws Resolution number five -- excuse me,

1 number four. They run from one page to the
2 other.

3 Constitutional, Bylaws
4 Resolutions number four from National Board of
5 Directors Resolved: That Section 813(a), FRA
6 and C&BL be amended to read: Section 813(a),
7 the committee shall consist of the National
8 Vice President serving as Chairman and each of
9 the Regional Vice Presidents as members with
10 the Director of Membership Development serving
11 as advisor.

12 Constitution Bylaws
13 recommendation: This committee recommends
14 rejection.

15 The rationale is: This is in
16 conflict with Constitution Bylaws Article 8,
17 Section 803(e). This takes away from the duty
18 or power of the National President to appoint
19 committee members as he desires, especially
20 when there may be a Shipmate with more
21 knowledge that would be a better fit for
22 appointment to this committee.

23 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:

1 Discussion on the resolution? All in favor --

2 (Chorus of ayes.)

3 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: -- of
4 the resolution? Opposed?

5 (Chorus of nos.)

6 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
7 Reject. Resolution is rejected.

8 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: Thank
9 you.

10 (Chatter.)

11 PRNPC POSEKANY: Okay. Now, we are
12 on Constitution Bylaws Resolution number five?

13 (Chatter.)

14 PRNPC POSEKANY: Shipmate National
15 President.

16 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
17 Shipmate at the mic? I'm sorry.

18 PRPNE/NENG ZINO: Zino delegate
19 Branch 23. To the chair, I apologize. I
20 couldn't get to the mic fast enough for the
21 past one. So point of order, in addition to
22 the past resolution that was just passed
23 regarding standing committees, future

1 planning; for example, we have monthly
2 meetings and it's important that we send
3 reports monthly or quarterly to the National
4 President so the National President can
5 interact and give us feedback in addition to
6 the annual report. Otherwise we can't get any
7 work done.

8 So it would be beneficial if we
9 amend that to say, "reports at least monthly
10 or annually or when we meet" so we can provide
11 feedback to the National President from the
12 chair of the standing committees. That should
13 apply to all committees.

14 (Chatter.)

15 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: That
16 was finished business. We can't go back into
17 it.

18 PRPNE/NENG ZINO: Thank you,
19 National President.

20 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
21 Shipmate Abe, that would -- start working on a
22 resolution for next year. If your branch
23 feels that strongly, submit a resolution for

1 that and we can encompass that.

2 PRNPC POSEKANY: Are we on five?

3 Did we just do five? We just did four. Okay.

4 Constitution Bylaws Resolution
5 five. Section 819(a) -- resolved: Section
6 819(a) FRA C&BL be amended to read:

7 Section 819(a,) the committee
8 shall consist of a chairman and eight members,
9 one from each region.

10 The Constitution Bylaws and
11 Resolutions Committee recommendation: This
12 committee recommends to amend and adopt, amend
13 by adding "if possible" to the end of the
14 resolve so the resolve reads:

15 Resolved: Section 819(a) FRA and
16 C&BL to be amended to read:

17 Section 819(a), the Committee
18 shall consist of a chairman of eight members,
19 one from each region, if possible.

20 The rationale for that is: There
21 may be some regions that don't have enough
22 people that are willing to attend conventions
23 or can attend conventions, and so nobody is

1 going to be available from that commission.
2 Some will obviously attempt to have somebody
3 from each region, but that's not always
4 possible and we can't mandate to them.

5 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
6 Discussion on the motion?

7 RPWC-E NASH: Nash, delegate Chair
8 of Branch 192, Chairman of Future Planning.
9 Marty, I believe what you're trying to amend
10 is something we would end up having to go back
11 and amend every standing rule in the
12 association with the same amendment, if
13 possible.

14 You're basing that on members
15 making it to National Convention so they can
16 partake in the meeting. How many members did
17 you have absent from your committee and other
18 committee chairmen today that were assigned
19 and were not picked -- capable of being here.

20 I think it's a redundancy to put
21 that in there. If a member is not capable of
22 being there, if he is going to be excused by
23 the National President, Vice President or

1 Committee Chair, I don't think that needs to
2 be amended.

3 PRNPC POSEKANY: By not amending
4 that, then you're directing the National
5 President must appoint somebody from each
6 region.

7 RPWC-E NASH: Correct.

8 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: That
9 was our rationale by not wanting to do that.
10 And this is the only amendment -- the only
11 section being addressed at this time. This
12 amendment -- this C&BL Resolution wasn't
13 submitted for all-encompassing. It was just
14 this one here we're talking about now.

15 PRPSE RICHMOND: Richmond,
16 delegate Branch 22. I agree with the change
17 to the Constitution Bylaws. There should be
18 one person from each region required. It
19 could be six people; you could have four
20 people from one region on that committee in
21 the past.

22 So I agree with the resolution
23 the way it's written in the delegate kit, but

1 I disagree with the adding the amendment, if
2 possible.

3 NED SLAWINSKI: Shipmate National
4 President, Slawinski, National Executive
5 National Director, I concur with the comments
6 made.

7 The thing to remember with
8 standing committees is that they do the
9 business basically for that committee
10 throughout the year. So we've already kind of
11 taken care of placing them meeting throughout
12 the year by electronic means or whatever so
13 that when we get to National Convention, if we
14 don't have the appropriate number of people
15 for the convention committee, then that's
16 where we get appointments or get individuals
17 to be there.

18 What we're trying to do,
19 especially with Future Planning is that we are
20 looking at everything from region size, region
21 development and such and we want to make sure
22 that there's a voice from each region that's
23 present during that discussion so we don't run

1 into a situation like we did several years ago
2 where the recommendation was to reduce regions
3 and the other regions never had a chance to
4 speak and basically be part of the discussion.
5 So that's why I think the -- if possible is
6 going to basically be detrimental to that.
7 Thank you.

8 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: As a
9 reminder to the Shipmates, if you desire not
10 to have our amendment, just vote the amendment
11 down and then vote on the original resolution
12 as submitted in this original format.

13 PRPNC COMBS: Shipmate National
14 President, any time you put -- Combs, delegate
15 Branch 161.

16 Any time you put "if possible,"
17 you slip an artisan in there and they could
18 interpret that to mean that you could -- this
19 one -- you want -- this one, the way it's
20 worded, you would have a member from each
21 region. And every year someone -- like you
22 say, someone from a region cannot make it.
23 Well, you can still -- the committee can still

1 meet and do their business.

2 It keeps the artisans out of our
3 Bylaws, please.

4 PRPNE/NENG ZINO: Shipmate National
5 President --

6 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
7 Shipmate at the mic.

8 PRPNE/NENG ZINO: Zino delegate 23,
9 I support the comments from the National
10 Executive Director. I think we need to have
11 at least one member if not more than one
12 member from each region to be on these
13 committees, especially Future Planning so
14 everybody equally has a voice and not any one
15 region is left out. So I support that. Thank
16 you.

17 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Thank
18 you.

19 Shipmate at the left mic.

20 SHIPMATE SISSOR: Shipmate Sissor
21 (phonetic) 166 delegate, on the amendment
22 part, why can't it be something like .6 not
23 the CA? That encompasses everything. That's

1 just a thought.

2 It's original thing but up to
3 eight. If you can't get eight, then stay six.

4 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: On
5 the amendment -- on the amendment, all in
6 favor -- I'm sorry. one more shipmate.

7 SHIPMATE CORNELL: Shipmate
8 Cornell, Branch 39 delegate. I have one
9 comment. If they vote to go with the original
10 writeup, does that mean if two or three of the
11 eight members do not show up, then that
12 committee cannot conduct business?

13 (Chatter.)

14 SHIPMATE CORNELL: So those that
15 don't show up have a voice still?

16 (Chatter.)

17 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
18 Shipmate at the mic.

19 All right. Calling for a vote on
20 the amendment. All in favor of the amendment?

21 (No response.)

22 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: All
23 oppose?

1 (Chorus of nos.)

2 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: The
3 amendment does not pass.

4 Now we'll vote on the original
5 resolution. All in favor, aye?

6 (Chorus of ayes.)

7 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
8 Opposed?

9 (No response.)

10 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
11 Resolution passed.

12 PRNPC POSEKANY: Constitution
13 Bylaws Resolution number 6 from the National
14 Board of Directors. Resolved, that Article 15
15 Section 1508 FRA cap regulations should be
16 amended to read: The purchase of an FRA
17 member uniform cap is optional, in parenthesis
18 (Section 1511) by members of the Fleet Reserve
19 Association and its wear shall be as follows:

20 It is further resolved that
21 Article 15 Section 1508(d) replace the word
22 "authorized" with the word "issued."

23 And be it further resolved that

Article 15 Section 1508(f) Guideline/Etiquette
be added, reading: "The uniform cap shall only
be worn by members only when in attendance at
official FRA meetings or ceremonies as far as
official guests at patriotic or other civil
functions or by individuals when officially
representing the Fleet Reserve Association on
public occasions. The wearing of any
political paraphernalia, obscene or
distasteful or demeaning items is forbidden.

Constitution and Bylaws
recommendation: This committee recommends
that the National President rule this
resolution is not in order.

Rationale: Resolution is in
violation of Article 4, Section 1404(d) by not
properly citing Article 15, Section 1508(d) by
restating the entire section.

NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
Discussion?

PRPSE RICHMOND: Richmond, delegate
Branch 22.

NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:

1 Shipmate at the mic.

2 PRPSE RICHMOND: Oh, sorry. I
3 jumped in there. Okay. So, yeah, I agree. I
4 think we should table this also because, you
5 know, we're not very specific at all as far as
6 what we wear on our covers. I mean, it
7 doesn't delineate anywhere. And educate me if
8 I missed it, but nowhere in the Constitution
9 and Bylaws does it say you wear this pin or
10 you wear this pin.

11 You've got people that if they're
12 on the board of directors, they have -- if
13 they were there for 20 years, they've got
14 twenty ship wheels on their hat or you've guys
15 that have one ship wheel and then have a
16 pendant that says 19 or however many years.

17 We have people wearing military
18 insignias on their hats. You know, just like
19 a uniform regulation, we should have: This is
20 all you're authorized to wear on your cover.

21 So I think it needs to to go back
22 and have a little more discussion, my personal
23 opinion.

1 PRNPC POSEKANY: Shipmates,
2 National President, I request you make the
3 ruling of not in order or proceed by ignoring
4 that.

5 At this time it's not open for
6 discussion until the National President makes
7 his ruling.

8 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: I
9 rule this resolution is out of order.

10 SHIPMATE FROST: So I don't get to
11 say anything? It's just shipmate at the mic?

12 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Out
13 of order.

14 SHIPMATE FROST: I would like to
15 ask a question if I may. I don't understand
16 --

17 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
18 Shipmate delegate Branch 23, Frost.

19 SHIPMATE FROST: I don't understand
20 how this whole thing is working. I would like
21 to understand it. To me it's ass-backwards.
22 I mean, I worked on this resolution, so did a
23 lot of other people. The bottom line is: It

1 should have been screened by the committee and
2 Bylaws Committee before it gets here. And now
3 you're screening it after it's here.

4 So please inform me where I'm
5 wrong. Your committee should be screening
6 stuff before it gets here, not afterwards. So
7 that's my opinion, and if I'm wrong, I would
8 like to -- I could use some training. I
9 appreciate your comment.

10 PRNPC POSEKANY: Procedure is to
11 submit the Constitution Bylaws and
12 Resolutions. They don't have to be but should
13 be submitted to the Constitution and Bylaws
14 Committee as soon as they are formulated so
15 that they have enough time to review and then
16 send them back to the originator so they have
17 enough time to make any possible fore-writing
18 corrections prior to meeting the submission
19 deadline.

20 SHIPMATE FROST: This resolution
21 was submitted through channels. It went to
22 the Board of Directors. It was affirmed,
23 unanimously approved. It also went through

1 the Constitution and Bylaws Committee. That's
2 when it should have been tweaked if there was
3 any problem.

4 Now, right at the last minute
5 here, to me, which is ass-backwards, you're
6 shit-canning it.

7 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: The
8 Bible is open. Just finished business,
9 Shipmate Neal.

10 SHIPMATE FROST: Thank you.

11 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: Shipmate
12 National President, if I may comment.

13 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
14 Shipmate at the mic.

15 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: This
16 problem can be solved without all of this
17 hoopla. The National Board of Directors has
18 the authority to interpret the Bylaws. Now,
19 if the National Board of Directors wants to,
20 they can take a list of the pins. They can
21 interpret it to mean that article and that
22 section means these pins, and it goes in the
23 Bylaws right underneath that section that

1 says: Interpreted by the National Board of
2 Directors on such-and-such a date. Simple
3 solution, doesn't have to make everybody mad.

4 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Thank
5 you.

6 PRNPC POSEKANY: Standing Rules
7 Resolution one: Resolved. SR 5(a)(1) be
8 amended to read:

9 Reports shall be submitted on
10 forms provided by the National FRA website,
11 which is maintained by National Headquarters.
12 Committee report forms may be changed only by
13 action of the delegates registered at a
14 National Convention.

15 Constitution and Bylaws Committee
16 recommendation: This committee recommends
17 adoption.

18 The rationale is: This is cost
19 savings. This is the way it's been done for
20 many years. It's been a long time since they
21 mailed any reports out.

22 PRPSE THOMAS: National President?

23 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:

1 Shipmate at the mic.

2 PRPSE THOMAS: J.J. Thomas, Branch
3 126. This is all well and good, I believe.
4 But what about our Shipmates that are not
5 computer literate and do not want to be
6 computer literate but they are in a position
7 of being a branch secretary? How can they get
8 these forms? I know that in the past,
9 National Headquarters has been very nice.
10 They have mailed them to them when requested,
11 but there's nothing in writing that states
12 that I believe. Thank you.

13 PRNPC POSEKANY: If I may answer
14 for the National Executive Director. National
15 Headquarters has the listing of any branches
16 whose secretaries and presidents do not have
17 email and electronic capabilities and they do
18 mail those reports and forms to those branches
19 throughout the year.

20 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
21 Shipmate at the mic.

22 SHIPMATE RANDALL: Charley Randall,
23 Branch 20 delegate. I have a question about

1 the forms.

2 When are they going to get the
3 damn forms so that they can be put in a
4 printer and print them out? Right now you
5 have to go in and if you're going to do it on
6 a computer, you have to monkey with things so
7 it will print properly.

8 I've been asking that question
9 for years. Nobody has ever given me an
10 answer. That's the way I produced them in
11 Word and did them that way, but now it looks
12 like you're not going to accept them. Thank
13 you.

14 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: All
15 in favor with the resolution, aye.

16 (Chorus of ayes.)

17 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
18 Opposed?

19 (Nays.)

20 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
21 Proceed. It passes.

22 PRNPC POSEKANY: Standing Rules
23 Resolution Number 2, resolved. SR 5(a)(2)

1 shall be amended to read: Each branch shall
2 submit the following reports if the branch
3 president has reported such committee.
4 American-Patriotism, hospitals, welfare and
5 rehabilitation, public relations, youth
6 activities, and Veterans service to the
7 regional chairman of the appropriate
8 committees prior to the convening of the
9 National Convention. A copy of these reports
10 shall be submitted to the Regional President,
11 Vice President, FRA National Headquarters and
12 one copy retained in the branch files.

13 Constitution and Bylaws

14 recommendation: This committee recommends
15 amend and adopt as amended. Amend by striking
16 out FRA National Headquarters in the last
17 sentence.

18 Resolved reads: Resolved, SR
19 5(a)(2) shall be amended to read: Each branch
20 shall submit the following reports if the
21 branch president has appointed such
22 committees, Americanism-Patriotism, hospital,
23 welfare and rehabilitation, public relations,

1 youth activities and Veterans service to the
2 regional chairman of the appropriate committee
3 prior to the convening of the national --
4 regional convention. A copy of these reports
5 shall be submitted to the Regional President,
6 Vice President and one copy retained in the
7 branch files.

8 Our rationale is: Regional
9 Committee Chairs pass all of this information
10 on to the National Committee Chairs each year
11 when submitting reports. This would also
12 replace an undue burden on branches to submit
13 extra reports.

14 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: All
15 in favor of the amended -- Shipmate at the
16 mic?

17 SHIPMATE HANZUCK: Shipmate
18 National President, Hanzuck 126 delegate.
19 Just to clarify, I would suggest one more
20 amendment to clarify which Vice President,
21 Regional Vice President. I would recommend
22 inserting Regional before Vice President. It
23 clears up any misconception.

1 PRNPC POSEKANY: I will then change
2 the Constitution and Bylaws recommendation for
3 the amendment to also add the word Regional in
4 front of Vice President.

5 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
6 Shipmate at the mic.

7 JrPRPNE ZINO: Shipmate National
8 President, Shipmate Zino delegate Branch 23.
9 Also recommended these reports be sent to the
10 regional secretaries. It helps for tracking.

11 Also, there's a matrix that's
12 available from the FRA that's handed out in
13 the branch regional manual. The regional
14 manual needs to be updated to reflect that.
15 If the branch secretaries use that matrix and
16 it's current, they will stay out of trouble.
17 Thank you.

18 PRNPC POSEKANY: That's something
19 that can be taken care of on the regional
20 level. The attempt of this was to take out
21 the National Headquarters as a redundancy.
22 Since that information has already passed the
23 National Headquarters to the Regional --

1 excuse me, the National Committee Chairs if
2 the regional chairs do their job correctly.
3 But I do agree on the update.

4 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Vote
5 on the amendment. All in favor?

6 (Chorus of ayes.)

7 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
8 Opposed?

9 (No response.)

10 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: We'll
11 vote now on the resolution.

12 SHIPMATE RANDALL: Randall, Branch
13 201 delegate. I understood there were two
14 parts to the amendment. One was Regional in
15 front of Vice President and then adding
16 Regional Secretary. Is that --

17 (Chatter.)

18 SHIPMATE RANDALL: Is that the --

19 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
20 Secretary did not -- you do.

21 PRNPC POSEKANY: That's a
22 suggestion. That can be taken care of within
23 the regions. For example, this is the first

1 year that the North Central Region had a
2 regional secretary. There's no requirement
3 for the region to have a regional secretary.
4 We have never had one in the North Central
5 Region until this year. Regions may decide at
6 one time or another not to have a regional
7 secretary, but that's a local regional issue.

8 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Take
9 a vote on the resolution. All in favor?

10 (Chorus of ayes.)

11 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
12 Opposed?

13 (No response.)

14 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
15 Resolution passed as amended.

16 PRNPC POSEKANY: Standing
17 Resolution 3, Resolved Standing Rule 5(b)(1),
18 National Awards be amended to read: For the
19 purpose of computing awards addressed in the
20 standing rule, branches shall be assigned to
21 the competitive groups as follows:

22 A, Group one, 413 members or
23 more; B, Group two, 213 to 412 members; C,

1 Group three, 113 to 212 members; D, Group four
2 63 to 112 members; E, Group five, 10 to 62
3 members.

4 Constitution and Bylaws
5 recommendation: The committee recommends
6 adoption. The rationale for that is simply
7 common sense, to make changes to this
8 periodically as membership grows or declines.

9 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: All
10 in favor of the resolution?

11 (Chorus of ayes.)

12 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
13 Opposed?

14 (No response.)

15 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
16 Resolution passes.

17 PRNPC POSEKANY: Standing Rules
18 Resolution four, resolved. That Standing Rule
19 5(b)(3) be amended to read: Each Regional
20 President shall submit the action of the
21 regional convention to the chairman of the
22 appropriate national committee. Only first
23 place winners for each competitive group will

1 be forwarded to the appropriate National
2 Committee. Included with the recommendations
3 shall be a copy of the branch committee
4 reports of each membership group and the name
5 of the shipmate nominated for national
6 recognition if applicable. A copy of the
7 report shall be forwarded to the National
8 Executive Director.

9 Constitution and Bylaws Committee
10 recommendation. This committee recommends
11 rejection. Rationale: The preamble, which is
12 the whereas as written before the resolve,
13 makes no sense and does not support the
14 resolution.

15 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: All
16 in favor of the resolution? Shipmate?

17 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: I was kind
18 of passed last time, too. I just want to
19 comment on the last one we did. We went too
20 fast.

21 I do agree we need to lower the
22 numbers to get more competition, but on Group
23 five, this is a point of order here. In the

1 Constitution and Bylaws, to start up a branch,
2 you need 20 members, correct? Well, that's
3 saying ten members, you know.

4 PRNPC POSEKANY: Different
5 requirements for starting a branch versus
6 maintaining membership before the branch has
7 to surrender their charter.

8 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: So there is
9 something that says ten members you can still
10 be a branch? That's good. Thank you.

11 SHIPMATE RANDALL: Here we go
12 again, Charley Randall, Branch 201, delegate.

13 The only difference I find
14 between what's in the "whereas and resolved"
15 is missing the word convention down in the
16 resolved.

17 What are you changing that you're
18 objecting to, that you're saying is not in
19 order? I'm not saying that this is a good
20 thing.

21 PRNPC POSEKANY: It doesn't say it
22 was not in order. It says we recommend
23 rejection.

1 SHIPMATE RANDALL: Just rejection.

2 PRNPC POSEKANY: The preamble --
3 the preamble leading up to it is nonsensical.
4 It doesn't support the resolution, which is
5 now requirements for "properly found" in the
6 resolution.

7 SHIPMATE RANDALL: Okay.

8 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: All
9 in favor of the recommendation of the
10 resolution?

11 NVP ROBBINS: You're voting on the
12 resolution as written.

13 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: As
14 written. All in favor?

15 (Ayes.)

16 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
17 Opposed?

18 (Chorus of nos.)

19 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
20 Fails.

21 PRNPC POSEKANY: Standing Rules
22 Resolution Number five, resolved. Standing
23 Rule 5(b)(5) be amended to read: Each

1 national committee shall review the regional
2 chairman's reports and recommend it --
3 recommend a branch from each membership group
4 to receive national recognition and, if
5 desired, a shipmate can be named Fleet Reserve
6 Association Shipmate of the Year for that
7 committee. The award for the branch of each
8 membership group a streamer three inches long
9 and thirty-six inches wide and made from
10 ribbon material. The streamer shall contain
11 the FRA emblem and shall be lettered with the
12 committee name, membership group number,
13 placing within that group, and the year
14 awarded. The streamers shall be blue in color
15 for first place, red in color for second
16 place, and white in color for third place.
17 FRA National Headquarters shall provide these
18 streamers to the committee chairman prior to
19 the convening of the National Convention. The
20 shipmate approved by the delegates to receive
21 the Fleet Reserve Association Shipmate of the
22 Year award shall be awarded a plaque and a
23 certificate of appreciation signed by the

1 National President.

2 Constitution and Bylaws

3 recommendation: This committee recommends
4 adoption.

5 Our rationale for that is: This
6 resolution places the requirement where it
7 should be. This is not and never should have
8 been a function of membership, to provide the
9 streamers and awards.

10 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: All
11 in favor of the recommendation?

12 (Chorus of ayes.)

13 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
14 Opposed?

15 (No response.)

16 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Pass.
17 At this time we're going to take a
18 fifteen-minute break. I'm sure we all could
19 use it.

20 NCHAP LYMON: Shipmate National
21 President, the Bible is closed.

22 (Break taken.)

23 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:

1 Invite the Shipmates into the hall and close
2 the doors.

3 Shipmate Chaplain, open the
4 Bible.

5 NCHAP LYMON: Shipmate National
6 President, the Bible is open.

7 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Thank
8 you, sir.

9 (Chatter.)

10 PRNPC POSEKANY: We're going to
11 proceed with the last three resolutions. So
12 if you would take your seat, button up your
13 lips a little bit.

14 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
15 Quiet, please.

16 PRNPC POSEKANY: Glad to see me
17 back? I've only got three left. Standing
18 Rules Resolution Number six. I will try to
19 speak slower.

20 Resolved. SR 5(c) be amended to
21 read: Membership and retention. The National
22 Membership and Retention Committee shall make
23 a thorough review of the reported membership

1 progress of the various branches for the
2 preceding 1 April through 31 March. The
3 Committee shall take all available factors,
4 including games, losses, location, and annual
5 regional officers' reports into consideration
6 to recommend the winners of the National
7 Membership and Retention Awards.

8 The annual Membership and
9 Retention Awards will be Charles E. Lofgren
10 Membership Award for branches, The Abraham M.
11 Rosenberg Membership Award, and the Frank J.
12 McPherson Memorial Award.

13 Subparagraph one: The Charles E.
14 Lofgren Membership Award for branches. The
15 National Membership and Retention Committee
16 may recommend one branch from the submitted
17 reports within each membership group as a
18 recipient of The Charles E. Lofgren Membership
19 Award in recognition of excellence in
20 membership promotion and competition with the
21 branches within the same membership group.
22 Branch must show an increase in membership
23 over the previous year and shall include new

1 and reinstated members.

2 Subparagraph two: Abraham M.
3 Rosenberg Membership Award Plaque. The
4 National Membership and Retention Committee
5 may recommend and select one branch out of the
6 branches awarded the Charles E. Lofgren Branch
7 Membership Award as a recipient of the Fleet
8 Reserve Association Abraham M. Rosenberg
9 Member Award for outstanding membership
10 promotion.

11 Subparagraph three: Frank J.
12 McPherson Memorial Award. This award may be
13 competitively awarded by the National
14 Membership and Retention Committee to one
15 shipmate who exemplifies the three cardinal
16 principles of the Fleet Reserve Association,
17 especially in membership endeavors. The
18 Shipmates selected must have expended
19 extensive efforts towards the overall growth
20 of the Fleet Reserve Association. The
21 Shipmate selected must have expended extensive
22 efforts towards overall growth of Fleet
23 Reserve Association. The selectee need not

1 necessarily be a top recruiter but an
2 individual who has maintained a positive
3 public attitude as it affects the membership
4 and retention of members of the association.

5 Names of qualified nominees for
6 this award, accompanied by an affidavit
7 supporting the nomination, may be submitted by
8 branches to the respective Regional Chairman,
9 Membership and Retention Committee not later
10 than 30 June.

11 Regional presidents shall forward
12 their region's nominee along with supporting
13 documents to the Chairman National Committee
14 on Membership and Retention within seven days
15 of conclusion of their regional convention.

16 The constitution and Bylaws
17 Committee recommendation: This committee
18 recommends rejection.

19 The rationale: Getting rid of a
20 membership recruiting award for individuals
21 makes no sense. A new resolution in the
22 future should be submitted to make the Charles
23 Lofgren award for individuals a requirement

1 for membership and development to use the
2 database and submit individual names.

3 Currently it's the branch's
4 responsibility to submit those names when
5 they're going to turn right around and ask
6 Membership and Development to punch that
7 button and use the database for it.

8 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: All
9 in favor of the resolution as written, say
10 aye.

11 (Chorus of ayes.)

12 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
13 Opposed?

14 (Chorus of nos.)

15 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
16 Resolution fails.

17 NVP ROBBINS: Shipmate National
18 President, if I may, I would like to submit
19 the Past National Presidents of the Auxillary.

20 (Chatter.)

21 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
22 National Chaplain, would you close the Bible,
23 please?

1 NCHAP LYMON: I'm coming. Soon to
2 be Regional National President, the Bible is
3 closed.

4 (Past National Presidents enter.)

5 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Good
6 afternoon, Shipmates.

7 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATES: Good
8 afternoon, ma'am.

9 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: National
10 President, Jim (unintelligible.) I bring
11 greetings from National President Sue Demm
12 (phonetic). She wishes you a great and
13 successful convention and she told me to tell
14 you to behave yourself and conduct yourself
15 well.

16 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: She's
17 not here. So I have to.

18 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I really
19 came here because I wanted to check to make
20 sure that Dick had his hat on. I was afraid I
21 was the only one having to do this. I hope
22 you all have a great time.

23 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATES: Thank you.

1 PRNP PARTHALL: Good afternoon,
2 Shipmates. Thank you for everything that
3 you've done for us. And again, I want to
4 thank everyone from last year and the support
5 that I received, but I wish you all successful
6 year and my partner in crime was Donna Jansky.
7 Thank you.

8 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: Who are
9 you?

10 PRNP PARTHALL: Who am I? I
11 haven't figured that out yet. No, I'm Past
12 National President Dee Parthall (phonetic)
13 from Tucson, Arizona.

14 PNP MURRAY: National President
15 Jim, I want to wish you a very harmonious
16 convention. I'm Christine Murray. I was
17 National President in 2018-2019. My
18 illustrious running mate was Mr. Bob
19 Washington right there. And I'm supposed to
20 bring a joke for you all.

21 I got this great book. It said
22 "Dad's Jokes" on it. And I started reading it
23 and I didn't understand the punch lines. So I

1 had to leave it in the other room. I couldn't
2 bring it. So y'all have a wonderful
3 convention.

4 PNP WRIGHT: Doris Wright, Past
5 National President 2014-15. My running mate
6 was John Eipert (phonetic) who we miss, and I
7 just want to say I wish you a wonderful
8 convention, but I want to tell you, I live in
9 apartments where people are all old. Anyway,
10 I told my ladies that I was coming to Alabama
11 for this convention and they said, Well, who
12 is going with you? I said, I don't need a
13 date; I'm going to be in a room full of
14 sailors. And I can't tell you how happy it
15 makes me to walk into a room full of sailors.

16 (Chorus of "and Marines".)

17 PNP WRIGHT: And Marines and Coast
18 Guards, room full of military guys.

19 PNP WHITTAKER: I'm Carolyn
20 Whittaker. I was National President 2013-14.
21 My running mate was (unintelligible) who is
22 not here this year. Have a great convention.

23 PNP HOOVER: Howdy, Shipmates.

1 (Chorus of "Howdy Shipmate.")

2 PNP HOOVER: I'm Diane Hoover. I'm
3 from Unit 24 and I served 2012-2013 with Mark
4 Kilgore.

5 Here is a little joke: Two young
6 boys walked into a pharmacy one day, picked
7 out a box of tampons and took it to the
8 checkout counter.

9 The pharmacist at the counter
10 asked the older boy, Son, how old are you?

11 Eight, the boy replied.

12 The man continued, Do you know
13 what's in those boxes?

14 The boy replied: Not exactly,
15 but they aren't for me, they're for him. He's
16 my little brother. He's four.

17 Oh, really? The pharmacist
18 replied with a grin.

19 Yes, the boy said. We saw it on
20 TV that if you use these you would be able to
21 swim, play tennis and ride a bike. Right now
22 he can't do none of those.

23 Shipmates, have a fun rest of

1 your week and a productive convention.

2 PNP MISON: Good afternoon,
3 Shipmates. I am Jeannie Mison (phonetic). I
4 was National President 2011-2012. My running
5 mate was Jeff Gilmartin. I hope you guys have
6 a fabulous convention.

7 PNP RODENTUCK: Good morning, good
8 afternoon. I'm Cindy Rodentuck (phonetic),
9 Past National President 2009-10. I served
10 with Gary Blackburn and I hope you guys all
11 have a wonderful -- I'm sorry. I hope you
12 Shipmates have a wonderful and harmonious
13 convention.

14 PNP ROBBINS: Good afternoon.
15 I'm Sandra Robbins. I was National President
16 in 2006-2007 and my running mate is Jerry
17 Sweeney. Y'all keep him in your prayers.

18 I have a little funny. At this
19 time I decided not to pick on the Marines.

20 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: Thank you!

21 PNP ROBBINS: There's a three-car
22 accident. There's a soldier in the Army
23 driving from Ft. Jackson to the West Coast. A

1 sailor in the Navy was driving from Naval
2 Station Norfolk to the West Coast, and an
3 airman in the Air Force was driving from Polk
4 Air Force Base to the West Coast.

5 In the middle of the night with
6 no other cars around on the road, they hit
7 each other and all cars go flying in all
8 different directions. The sailor manages to
9 climb out of his car and survey the damage.
10 He looks around and he sees how twisted and

1 and says, You know, you're absolutely right.
2 We should be friends.

3 The airman also agrees.

4 The sailor then says: Let me see
5 what else survived this wreck. So he pops
6 open the trunk and finds a full unopened
7 bottle of Jack Daniels. The sailor says to
8 the soldier and airman: I think this is
9 another sign from God that we should toast to
10 our newfound understanding and friendship.

11 The soldier says: You're right,
12 and he grabs the bottle, starts sucking down
13 the Jack Daniels.

14 After putting away nearly a third
15 of the bottle, the soldier hands it to the
16 airman and says, Your turn.

17 The airmen sucks down the third
18 and hands the bottle back to the sailor. The
19 sailor puts the cap back on the bottle and he
20 says, I think I'll wait for the cops to show
21 up.

22 I wish you all a successful
23 convention.

1 PNP BOUDREAUX: Hi, y'all. I'm Pat
2 Boudreaux, Past National President 2005-2006.
3 My running mate was Big Ed Serr (phonetic) for
4 you all who remember him. I'm tired of
5 looking up at people. And my running mate was
6 Regional President in '95-'96-- '96-'97. He's
7 always correcting me on that one. It's my
8 husband, of course, Larry Boudreaux. Y'all
9 have a lot of fun.

10 PNP ROBERTS: My name is Loretta
11 Roberts. My running mate was the late Kyle
12 Fudge and I served 1996-1997. I do have a
13 joke.

14 This service person enrolled in
15 college under the GI bill. He went in and
16 this professor was saying, There is no God.
17 If there is a God, the way I feel, he should
18 strike me down. He said, I haven't been
19 struck down yet. So there must not be any
20 God. And by this time, this guy got up out of
21 his chair. He walked up and he said -- he
22 slapped the professor and knocked him up
23 against the wall. He said, God was busy so he

1 sent a Marine.

2 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Thank
3 you, auxiliary members.

4 (Past National Presidents exit the
5 room.)

6 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
7 Chaplain, would you open the Bible, please?

8 NCHAP LYMON: National President,
9 the Bible is open.

10 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Thank
11 you.

12 PRNPC POSEKANY: Ready to finish
13 this up yet? Glad to see me go?

14 Standing Rule Resolution number
15 seven, resolved. Standing Rule 5,
16 Constitution and Bylaws, FRA is amended by
17 adding standing Rule 5(g) Veterans Service.
18 The National Committee on Veterans Service
19 shall select two outstanding Shipmates. One
20 is Outstanding Veteran Service Officer VSO,
21 and one for Outstanding VA Voluntary Service,
22 VAVS, with one selected overall outstanding
23 member recognized as PRPNC Rosemary Posekany

1 Memorial Award for the National Veterans
2 Service.

3 Constitution and Bylaws
4 recommendation says: Committee recommends
5 this not in order.

6 Rationale: Committee reports
7 were separated without notice and without
8 delegate approval at convention. This
9 Committee recommends that the incoming
10 National President appoint a special committee
11 to review and provide a resolution that
12 clearly delineates requirements for these
13 forms and committee.

14 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
15 National rule is out of order.

16 PRNPC POSEKANY: Standing rule
17 resolution number 8. Resolved: That article
18 IX Section 909(d) Constitution and Bylaws FRA
19 to be amended to read as follows: Section
20 909(d) Welfare and Rehabilitation Reserved. A
21 maximum annual \$35,000 Welfare and
22 Rehabilitation Reserve is hereby established
23 to assist members of the Fleet Reserve

1 Association, the surviving spouse of a member
2 of the Fleet Reserve Association and/or
3 immediate family members who may be in dire
4 need of financial assistance.

5 National President, with the
6 advice of the appropriate, regional president,
7 is authorized to expend up to \$2,500. By a
8 two-thirds vote, the National Board of
9 Directors is authorized to expend an
10 additional \$2,500 for one maximum grant of
11 \$5,000 per fiscal year per recipient.

12 Resolved: That standing Rule 7,
13 SR 7(e) be changed to read as follows:
14 Standing Rule 7, SR 7(e), initial withdrawal
15 from the funds shall be limited to \$2,500 per
16 family. One additional withdrawal up to the
17 same amount may be authorized in the same
18 manner as the first.

19 Constitution and Bylaws Committee
20 recommendation is: The committee recommends
21 this is not in order. It's in violation of
22 Article 14, Section 1404 as it contains both
23 the Constitution and Bylaws section and

1 Standing Rules Resolution together in the
2 same. They are also two completely different
3 subjects.

4 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: I
5 rule this resolution out of order.

6 PRNPC POSEKANY: Okay. Shipmates,
7 we're going to try to take care of an
8 administrative error here that occurred in the
9 timeline of submission of resolutions.

10 If you will look at Standing
11 Rules Resolution Number 8, look at the second
12 resolved section of that. That deals with
13 Standing Rule 7.

14 Again, the reason that was ruled
15 out of order is because it talked about the
16 Constitution and Bylaws Section 9 resolution
17 -- resolution. That deals with the
18 rehabilitation fund, which is totally separate
19 and different from the disaster relief.

20 The Constitution and Bylaws
21 establishes a fund for the Hospitals, Welfare
22 and Rehabilitation Fund of X amount of
23 dollars. That is the fund, the budget item,

1 that that is drawn out of.

2 The Budget Committee wanted to
3 address only the disaster relief, which is
4 operated entirely directly out of Standing
5 Rule 7.

6 They did in return, after being
7 notified, submit within the time frame a clean
8 Standing Rule 7 resolution.

9 And the reason I pointed that you
10 ought to resolve the Standing Rule seven,
11 seven -- SR 7(e) to be changed to read as
12 follows: If someone wanted to complain about
13 not having the proper notification of it,
14 Constitution and Bylaws Committee, I believe
15 that that gives you that notification of what
16 we're asking -- what they're asking in
17 Standing Rule 7.

18 So the Constitution and Bylaws
19 Committee recommends adoption of this. The
20 rationale is: We agree completely that the
21 Disaster Relief Fund, which is through
22 donations only -- not a budget line item that
23 takes money from the FRA -- that's where you

1 see people lining up at the national
2 conventions and regional conventions to donate
3 money to the Disaster Relief.

4 That's where that money comes
5 from when disaster relief is needed, for
6 disasters, fires, hurricanes, tornados,
7 floods. It has nothing do with the Welfare
8 Rehabilitation Grant money which is a separate
9 budget line item.

10 National President, I am asking
11 if you would ask the National Parliamentarian
12 to accept this since it was submitted on time,
13 and we do in essence have the resolved section
14 available to them already, what was
15 distributed in the delegate kit, along with
16 the -- several months ago when the resolutions
17 for consideration were taken.

18 So I will go ahead and read this
19 complete resolution then: Whereas standing
20 rule 7(e) Constitution and Bylaws currently
21 authorizes an initial withdrawal of \$1,000 and
22 an additional withdrawal of up to \$1,000,
23 whereas, these amounts have been in effect for

1 many years, if not decades, and have not been
2 adjusted for inflation and increased cost of
3 goods and services for emergencies and whereas
4 it was long overdue to increase the maximum
5 grant amount to better assist our Shipmates
6 and their immediate family members and widows
7 in their time of need, now therefore be it
8 resolved, Standing Rule seven, 7R -- SR 7(e)
9 to be changed to read as follows: SR 7(e),
10 initial withdrawal from the fund shall be
11 limited to \$2,500 per family. One additional
12 amount may be authorized in the same manner as
13 the first. Resolved, that this amount becomes
14 effective 1 January, 2023. This is to certify
15 this resolution was proposed and distributed
16 to all committee members and advisors on 23
17 May 2022, via email, debated and voted upon 20
18 April 2022, and 27 May 2022 and adopted by
19 unanimous vote. It was signed by Mick Fulton,
20 Junior Past National President Chairman Budget
21 Finance and Audit Committee. Constitution and
22 Bylaws Committee recommends adoption of this
23 Standard Rules amendment.

1 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:

2 Shipmate at the mic?

3 All in favor of adopting the new
4 resolution say aye.

5 (Chorus of ayes.)

6 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:

7 Opposed?

8 (No response.)

9 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:

10 Passed.

11 PRNPC POSEKANY: Other remarks from
12 this Committee to the delegates? This
13 Committee recommends that changed pay sheets
14 be used for the Constitution and Bylaws
15 Standing Rules and Rituals sections. The
16 changed pages will be placed in each section
17 and list the article, paragraph, page subtopic
18 and date amended.

19 This concludes the report of the
20 National Convention Committee on the
21 Constitution and Bylaws resolutions. I ask
22 that the committee be discharged.

23 SHIPMATE FIELD: Shipmate National

1 President, Field delegate branch 162. I have
2 a question concerning resolution --
3 Constitution and Bylaws Resolution number
4 three. And the question is: Are we going to
5 be doing video conferencing in perpetuity?

6 (Chatter.)

7 PRNPC POSEKANY: That is the
8 Constitution and Bylaws submitted for this
9 convention.

10 SHIPMATE FIELD: Did you answer my
11 question?

12 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: One
13 moment, Shipmate.

14 NVP ROBBINS: Thank you, Shipmate
15 National President.

16 Shipmate David, what this means
17 is that this is an option to be used; in other
18 words, another tool that the association can
19 use.

20 So it's, again, not necessarily
21 -- if there's the means to do things in
22 person, we'll do things in person. But again,
23 trying to get the business of the association

1 done in a cost-effective way, we wanted to
2 make sure that we had within our -- within our
3 regulations the option to be able to do things
4 via the new technology, which is Zoom, Teams,
5 WebEx, et cetera, et cetera. So again, it's
6 -- we're --

7 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: The
8 answer is yes.

9 NVP ROBBINS: Yes. That's the
10 short answer, yes.

11 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: At
12 this time I would like to call up the chairman
13 of the Time and Place Committee.

14 SHIPMATE BRUNE: Good afternoon,
15 Shipmates. Rich Brume from Alexandria Branch
16 181. I found out this morning I was the
17 chairperson of this committee. So if there's
18 any pro-pause, just let it run.

19 Here we go. The national -- who
20 owes us money, Theo?

21 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: Paul
22 Gunter.

23 SHIPMATE BRUNE: Paul Gunter, pay

1 the man \$25 bucks.

2 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: 50.

3 SHIPMATE BRUNE: Have we gone up?
4 Moving right along.

5 The National Convention Committee
6 of time and place met in the Kent Room of the
7 Hyatt Regency Wynfrey Hotel in Birmingham,
8 Alabama, on Wednesday, October 19th, at 0815.
9 The chairperson Rich Brune, Branch 181.
10 Members there were Jim Beckett from Annapolis
11 Branch 24, Junior Past Branch President; Pat
12 Guibao, Annapolis Branch 24, first Branch Vice
13 President; Donna M Ganskly, North Shore Branch
14 31, Past National President

15 Advisor was Kimberly -- I know
16 I'm going to miss this one -- Alfolabi.

17 SHIPMATE ALFOLABI: Correct.

18 SHIPMATE BRUNE: Thank you -- from
19 national headquarters, did an excellent job by
20 the way. And the visitors were Peter
21 Lazaretti --

22 PRPNW LAZARETTI: Lazaretti.

23 SHIPMATE BRUNE: -- Lazaretti, I

1 can go with that -- from Seattle Branch 18,
2 Past Regional -- past National --

3 PRPNW LAZARETTI: Past Regional
4 President Northwest.

5 SHIPMATE BRUNE: There you go, Past
6 Regional President Northwest. And Claudio
7 Pedery --

8 SHIPMATE PEDERY: Pedery.

9 SHIPMATE BRUNE: There you go --
10 Washington DC Branch 4, which is no longer in
11 existence.

12 The chairman reads the duties of
13 the National Convention Committee on time and
14 place from SR-6, C&BL and FRA.

15 Letter of intent. To the Fleet
16 Reserve Association National Headquarters from
17 FRA Centennial Committee. Subject: Letter of
18 intent, to sponsor National Convention in
19 2024. References Fleet Reserve Association
20 standing Rule 4, National Convention Sponsor.

21 This is to inform the National
22 Headquarters the desire of the FRA Centennial
23 Committee to sponsor the National Convention

1 in the year 2024.

2 The Centennial Committee has been
3 meeting for over a year and working on events
4 and activities for the FRA's 100th
5 Anniversary. It is a logical step to grant us
6 the convention. This would benefit the
7 Shipmates as well as the association
8 economically.

9 In 2024, the FRA will host the
10 veterans' activities in which the FRA and
11 National President will preside at Arlington
12 National Cemetery as well as the FRA will be
13 hosting a luncheon afterwards.

14 It is with that in mind that the
15 Centennial Committee is recommending the 2024
16 National Convention be held in the Washington
17 DC metropolitan area during the time frame of
18 10-16 November '24 -- November of 2024. It
19 would be appropriate for the Shipmates from
20 all the association to attend and see their
21 National President in the spotlight on stage
22 introducing possibly to the President of the
23 United States.

1 The centennial celebration and
2 convention would be set up differently than
3 what has been in the past, but will be in
4 accordance with the FRA National Convention
5 and Bylaws.

6 Section 602(a.) The FRA shall
7 hold an annual national convention not to
8 exceed a total of four days duration except
9 for any convention that has been designated as
10 a constitutional convention, which may not
11 exceed five days in duration.

12 Section 602(b,) the annual
13 convention shall convene on or after the 15th
14 day of September and shall adjourn before the
15 30th day of November.

16 Section 602(c,) the time and
17 place for the National Convention shall be
18 decided by the delegates at the convention
19 held two years in advance.

20 This is to certify that the
21 motion to sponsor the National Convention was
22 proposed at a regular meeting of the
23 Centennial Committee held on July 19th, 2022,

1 read, debated, adopted by a unanimous vote,
2 quorum being presented.

3 Okay. Under comments -- this is
4 the letter that Donna had submitted to the
5 headquarters.

6 Under comments: No other
7 Shipmates, branches or regions came forward to
8 sponsor the 2024 National Convention, only the
9 centennial Committee members were present and
10 a couple guests. Since the FRA's 100th
11 Anniversary is in 2024, they did not submit a
12 letter of --

13 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: It did --

14 SHIPMATE BRUNE: It did submit --
15 I'm sorry. Did I say not?

16 Oh, yeah, they did submit a
17 letter of intent in accordance with Standing
18 Rule Number 4, which is in the delegate
19 package kit page LI-1 Tab V.

20 The date of the convention would
21 be in the anniversary time frame of November
22 10th through 16th, 2024. The location would
23 be in the DMV, which is the District Maryland

1 Virginia area or the Washington DC metro area,
2 for those who are not familiar with the DMV
3 terminology.

4 Because the Centennial Committee
5 was waiting for others to submit a sponsorship
6 for the convention, an exact location has not
7 been determined. The Time and Place Committee
8 approved the centennial sponsorship of the
9 2024 National Convention.

10 Thank you Shipmates, National
11 President, for allowing us to serve. I move
12 that this report be received.

13 RPNC CUNNINGHAM: Cunningham,
14 Branch 14. I just have a dell -- I just have
15 a question -- I'll second it, but then I just
16 have a question. I know that's over our
17 anniversary date, but there are quite a few
18 branches -- I know mine is one of them -- that
19 do a lot of things on Veterans' Day, and that
20 may cause a problem.

21 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
22 Shipmate at the mic?

23 PRNCP COMBS: Combs, delegate

1 Branch 161. Do you have a property in mind
2 approximate?

3 NVP ROBBINS: No. We have not
4 finalized the property.

5 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: All
6 in favor of adopting this letter of intent for
7 the 2024 convention say aye.

8 (Chorus of ayes.)

9 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
10 Opposed?

11 (Nays.)

12 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
13 Passed. At this time I would like to call up
14 the chairman for membership and retention.

15 NVP ROBBINS: Good afternoon,
16 Shipmates. I am the chairman of the National
17 Convention Committee on Membership and
18 Retention. We were in the Wynfrey D. Room in
19 the Hyatt Regency Wynfrey Hotel in Birmingham,
20 Alabama, on Wednesday, October 19, 2022 at 9
21 o'clock.

22 Chairman was National Vice
23 President James D. Robbins, West Jacksonville

1 126; Regional President Southeast Elect, Jerry
2 Anger, Birmingham Branch 112; Regional
3 President North Central Elect, Marcia L.
4 Cunningham, Milwaukee Branch 014; Regional
5 Vice President South Central, Victor L.
6 Walker, Ozark Branch 227; Regional President
7 Southwest Elect, Chris Chapman, Imperial Beach
8 289; Regional President Northwest Elect Rex
9 Faubion, Mount Rainier Branch 104.

10 Advisor was Don E. Larson, Corpus
11 Christi Branch 094. My advisor was Christina
12 Hitchcock, MAL.

13 Visitors were Bruce Talbot, Past
14 Regional President South Central Branch 159;
15 Ed Labao, Regional President Southwest Branch
16 302; Charles R. Smith, Branch 89; Emmett Smith
17 Past Regional President Southeast Branch 89;
18 Charles G. Kickly -- Kirtley -- man, how could
19 I forgot that -- Regional Vice President,
20 Branch 22; Ed M. Blind, Vice President North
21 Central Branch 17; Robert Olivera, Regional
22 Vice President, Branch 293; H. Jimmy Beckett,
23 Junior Past President, Branch 24; John Davis,

1 Past National Chaplain, Branch 24 -- okay, I'm
2 sorry 44; James Brown, Branch 226, President;
3 and Claudio Pedery --

4 SHIPMATE PEDERY: Pedery.

5 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: Pedery.

6 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: Pedery.

7 NVP ROBBINS: Pedery, Past
8 President, Branch MAL, formerly 004.

9 Meeting was called to order at
10 9:12. And at this time I'm going to let my
11 advisor, Christine Hitchcock finish with the
12 --

13 DMD HITCHCOCK: Good afternoon,
14 Shipmates.

15 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATES: Good
16 afternoon.

17 DMD HITCHCOCK: One quick
18 clarification. I'm sorry, there was an error
19 in the information that the National Vice
20 President was given. That should be Victor L.
21 Walker, Regional President of Southwest
22 Central was not at the previous meeting, just
23 a point of clarification.

1 The meeting was called to order
2 again at 912. We -- the first order of
3 business was the review of the Frank J.
4 McPherson Memorial Award. For those of you
5 who want to write this down, section WIN-2,
6 which is the second -- or the last page of
7 your convention book.

8 The award is competitively
9 awarded to the National Convention
10 Membership -- by the National Convention
11 Membership and Retention Committee to one
12 Shipmate who exemplifies the three Cardinal
13 Principles of the Fleet Reserve Association,
14 especially in membership endeavors. All of
15 you recently heard the specific description,
16 so I'm not going to go through the full
17 criteria of it; however, what we will share is
18 that we received two applications -- two
19 nominations -- excuse me -- this year, one
20 from the Northeast new England and one from
21 the North Central region.

22 The one from the Northeast New
23 England Region was unfortunately ruled out of

1 order because of some handwritten notes that
2 were put on it. It was actually considered an
3 application for the 2022-2023 membership year
4 rather than the 2021-2022.

5 Therefore, we read the nomination
6 for Maria Behm, and the nomination was
7 unanimous. Acceptance of the nomination was
8 unanimous, my apologies.

9 Shipmate -- but we did want to
10 share with you why this Shipmate exemplifies
11 the Fleet Reserve Association. And so I'm
12 going to read the letter that was submitted as
13 part of the application.

14 Shipmate Behm joined the Fleet
15 Reserve Association as a member of Branch 113,
16 Stockton, California in 2011, and has
17 maintained her continuous membership since
18 then.

19 Shipmate Behm served the Fleet
20 Reserve Association and Shipmates of Branch
21 113 diligently in the following capacities:
22 She served as a Branch President and
23 Membership Chairman during the entire five

1 years as a member of Branch 113. She showed
2 dedication to the FRA and to Branch 113 by
3 serving as a delegate to the West Coast
4 Regional Convention each of those years, and
5 she served as the West Coast Regional Vice
6 President 2015-'16 and the West Coast Regional
7 President 2017-'18.

8 She maintained her FRA
9 affiliation 113 despite moving out of West
10 Coast Region and maintained it until March of
11 2020.

12 After realizing her dedication to
13 the three cardinal principles of the Fleet
14 Reserve -- after realizing that her dedication
15 to the three cardinal principles of the Fleet
16 Reserve Association could be accomplished
17 easier through her membership in a local
18 branch, she transferred her membership to the
19 Ozark Branch 316 located in Springfield,
20 Missouri.

21 While attending the 2022 -- North
22 Central Regional Convention, she -- her
23 Regional Shipmates recognized her dedicated

1 membership -- recognized her as a dedicated
2 member who would serve her Shipmates. She
3 served as the National Regional Vice President
4 from 2020 to 2021 where she assumed the role
5 as both the Membership Chairman and
6 Americanism Patriotism Chairperson. She also
7 served as the FRA National Membership and
8 Retention Committee 2020-2021.

9 During the 2020-2021 and 2022
10 membership year, she recruited over forty
11 Shipmates earning her a life membership in the
12 Fleet Reserve Association and the Silver
13 Anchor Squadron Award issued to Shipmates who
14 recruit fifteen new or reinstated members. To
15 date she has recruited over seventy members to
16 this organization.

17 Starting in April of 2021, she
18 again demonstrated her dedication and
19 determination embodied in the three cardinal
20 principles but starting up a new branch, the
21 Lake of the Ozarks Branch 32, which was
22 installed in August, on August 10th of 2021
23 during the North Central Regional Convention.

1 During the first year of Branch
2 32's existence, she badgered her Shipmates to
3 encourage their family members to establish an
4 auxiliary, another success.

5 In 2021 and 2022, she was elected
6 as the President of the North Central Region,
7 and as Regional President she continues to
8 train her Shipmates. Her knowledge of the
9 association afforded her the ability to set up
10 training workshops, which she developed and
11 conducted for Shipmates of the West Coast
12 Region and then brought to the North Central
13 Region, encouraging them to accept leadership
14 positions, to increase their leadership and
15 retention.

16 Shipmate Behm continues to seek
17 new ideas, suggestion and direction from her
18 fellow Shipmates to assist the region in the
19 furthering of the mission of the Fleet Reserve
20 Association. Her dedication to our
21 organization is steadfast and continuously
22 noted. It is a well-known --

23 It is well-known this Shipmate

1 consistently assumes the role as an Ambassador
2 of the Fleet Reserve Association in every
3 endeavor -- in almost everything she says and
4 does.

5 With this being said, Maria A.
6 Behm demonstrates all the qualifications of
7 the Frank J. McPherson Memorial Award. As a
8 result, the Committee reviewed the
9 application, the supporting application, and
10 approved this.

11 So congratulations, Maria.

12 RVP BEHM: National Shipmates,
13 thank you very much. I wasn't expecting that,
14 but thank you -- with a mic in my mouth.

15 DMD HITCHCOCK: The next line item
16 here is the FRA Gold Ribbon Award. The
17 Committee voted this past year to change it
18 from the 100 Percent Retention Award to the
19 Gold Ribbon Award. And for the 2021-2022
20 membership year, fifty-four branches qualified
21 for this award. The Committee was very
22 focused on ensuring that branches were not
23 penalized for the loss of membership due to

1 Shipmates reporting to the Staff of the
2 Supreme Commander, so additional calculations
3 were made that are slightly different than
4 what are in your book in the -- in the reports
5 that follow -- I'm sorry, in the convention
6 delegate book.

7 But I will read off the branches
8 that received awards. I'm sorry -- the Yellow
9 Ribbon Award, and the Yellow Ribbon Award will
10 be presented after this meeting. We will have
11 them on the table outside. I have them
12 divided up by region. So if the Regional
13 President would see me, I would appreciate it.

14 I'm sorry. Do you need me read
15 it or -- actually -- should I read it?

16 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Yeah.

17 DMD HITCHCOCK: I am? Okay. Group
18 one: East Coast -- Branch 24, East Coast,

1 Region, Philippines -- thank you -- Branch 207
2 East Coast, Dale City, Virginia; Branch 273
3 North Central, Fargo, North Dakota; Branch 92
4 South Central, New Orleans, Louisiana; Branch
5 37 East Coast, Portsmouth, Virginia; Branch
6 295 South Central, San Angelo, Texas; Branch
7 87, Northeast New England, Bedford
8 Pennsylvania; and Branch 334 South Central,
9 Osage, Arkansas.

10 Those are all of the branches
11 that received -- that maintained their
12 membership and will be recognized for an
13 award. I will ask that the Regional President
14 -- incoming Regional President see me to
15 obtain those ribbons and we're asking you to
16 take them back and distribute them to your
17 Shipmates.

18 With regard to the Recruiting
19 Incentive Program for Branches: The National
20 Committee on Membership and Retention
21 announced the continuation of the Branch
22 Recruiting Incentive Award Program for
23 2021-2022. The program provides a \$100 cash

1 award to one branch for each group of group
2 one through five that recruited the highest
3 number of former members to rejoin the FRA.
4 The report is on section P page -- section P
5 of your delegate kit, Membership and Retention
6 Report dash 2. So that information is already
7 published in your delegate kit and submitted
8 for your review. There were a number of
9 individuals. We will not go through each one
10 of them individually.

11 The next topic is the Branch
12 Development Program. There were three new or
13 reinstated branches within the past year. The
14 Branch 32, Lake of the Ozarks was the first
15 new branch. We are pleased to report that the
16 charter was presented in August of 2021 and
17 members of -- I'm sorry -- to Branch -- to
18 Branch 32 member and Regional Vice President
19 Maria Behm during the North Central Regional
20 Convention.

21 We also established Branch 50 in
22 the great state of Hawaii. They were granted
23 their charter. We believe it was mailed to

1 the Regional President and presented to them.

2 And then Branch 299 was
3 reinstated in Wilmington, North Carolina,
4 after a lapse of about three years. We look
5 forward to watching them grow.

6 To start a new branch, the
7 requirement is to have at least twenty new or
8 reinstated members of the Fleet Reserve
9 Association. This is a valuable way to
10 increase membership and strengthen your
11 region. The Regional President and Vice
12 President should be involved in the
13 establishment of new branches as it may take
14 more than one regional -- more than one term
15 of a regional officer to get a branch
16 established and up and running.

17 The next section is the
18 Individual and Branch Charles E. Lofgren
19 Awards. See section Z, again, WIN-1 of your
20 book.

21 The Charles E. Lofgren Award for
22 excellence in FRA membership recruiting is
23 perpetuated -- perpetuate and honor the memory

1 of the late National Secretary, Charles E.
2 Lofgren.

3 FRA standing rule 5(c)(2): The
4 Charles E. Lofgren membership award for
5 individuals. These awards will be
6 competitively awarded to one Shipmate from
7 among the branches within each membership
8 group. The determining criteria will be
9 reported -- will be the reported FRA member
10 who recruited the greatest number during the
11 proceeding 1st of April through 31st of March.
12 Each branch will report to the Chairman
13 National Committee on Membership and Retention
14 the name of its nominee and the number of
15 members the nominee had recruited. The report
16 shall arrive at the National Headquarters
17 prior to the 31st of May of each year.

18 The Committee did not receive any
19 reports from any branches, therefore there are
20 no awards being extended for the Charles E.
21 Lofgren award for 2021-2022.

22 FRA standing Rule 5(c)(1):
23 Charles E. Lofgren Membership Award For

1 Branches. The Convention Membership and
2 Retention Committee shall recommend one branch
3 within each membership group as the recipient
4 of the Charles E. Lofgren membership award in
5 recognition of excellence in membership
6 promotion in competition with the branches
7 within the same membership group.

8 Branch Group one: The recipient
9 is Branch 24, Annapolis, Maryland. They
10 increased their membership 5.99 percent for a
11 total of 197 new members.

12 Group two: Branch 20, Gotten,
13 Connecticut. They increased their membership
14 by 5.36 percent. They recruited eighteen
15 members to their branch.

16 Group three: Branch 264,
17 Meridian, South Carolina --

18 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE:
19 Mississippi.

20 DMD HITCHCOCK: My apologies. I
21 will see that that is corrected. They
22 increased their membership 15.15 percent. So
23 15.15, a total of twenty-five members.

1 Group four: Branch 101, Santa
2 Clara, California. They increased their
3 membership 2.8 percent, a total of nine
4 members.

5 Group 5, Branch 294, Crossville,
6 Tennessee. They increased their membership by
7 12.24 percent, total of nine members.

8 Congratulations to all of those
9 branches for the great work they did this past
10 year.

11 If you're not already still over
12 on page -- Section Z WIN-2, we are now going
13 to discuss the Abraham M. Rosenberg Membership
14 Award.

15 For the branch winning the --
16 from the branches winning the Charles E.
17 Lofgren Award, one branch is selected for its
18 achievement in outstanding membership
19 promotion. Shipmate Abraham M. Rosenberg
20 served as the National President between 1934
21 and 1935. He was a member of the Cleveland
22 Branch 17 and is credited with establishing
23 the association's financial stability in the

1 late 1930s.

2 The Meridian, Mississippi, Branch
3 264 was selected as the Abraham M. Rosenberg
4 recipient for overall recruiting gain of 15.15
5 percent.

6 That's it for the awards for the
7 branch -- I'm sorry, for the Membership and
8 Retention Committee. However, prior to the
9 adjourning of the meeting of the advisors and
10 -- prior to adjourning of the meeting of
11 Membership and Retention, the advisor of the
12 Director of Membership Development for the
13 Fleet Reserve Association provided a briefing
14 to the members and the committee about an
15 upcoming oral history project.

16 Many of you may remember that
17 several years ago, back in 2019, you might
18 have been recipient of a postcard, and the
19 postcard asked you to update your information
20 with the Fleet Reserve Association. It's a
21 similar project, however, this time we -- the
22 Committee has decided to do a membership
23 directory but instead an oral history project

1 which will give the individuals who reply to
2 those cards not only the opportunity to update
3 their contact information with headquarters,
4 which is generally a labor-intensive and
5 costly project, they will be helping us update
6 our membership contact information, and they
7 will be given an opportunity to record a
8 message that will be transcribed and
9 potentially put into a book of memories for
10 the Fleet Reserve Association.

11 The intent is that this is going
12 to start in December. You'll start getting
13 the cards in December. We will put an ad in
14 the FRA Today, probably an article in the FRA
15 Today as well as include information in future
16 news bites so everyone is aware that this is
17 what the project is about. It takes about a
18 year to process because of the production and
19 print and response time, again, from all of
20 our Shipmates, so we wanted to let all of --
21 we wanted the Committee to know and we also
22 want all of you to know that this project will
23 -- is intended to complete by January of 2024.

1 Therefore, we should have it for our
2 Centennial, and we hope that our Shipmates
3 will take advantage of this opportunity.

4 With that, I thank you and I
5 conclude the Report For Membership and
6 Retention.

7 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: I
8 make a motion -- no, I move, isn't it? I move
9 that our report be accepted.

10 (Chatter.)

11 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: We
12 have a motion on the floor. All in favor of
13 accepting the report as read?

14 (Chorus of Ayes.)

15 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
16 Opposed?

17 (No.)

18 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Pass.
19 Shipmate at the mic?

20 PRPSC SMITH: Yes, Smith, delegate
21 98, Past Regional President South Central.
22 For your correction, Charles R. Smith is
23 president of Branch 98 not 89.

1 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: We'll
2 fix it. Thank you.

3 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: You've got
4 that South Central not Southeast.

5 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: At
6 the time I would like to call up the chairman
7 from the Americanism-Patriottism, Norm Combs.

8 PRNCP COMBS: Shipmate National
9 President, Shipmates, the Americanism-
10 Patriottism Committee met in the Essex Room of
11 the Hyatt Regency Wynfrey Hotel, Birmingham,
12 Alabama, today, Wednesday, 19 October 2022 at
13 0900.

14 Members of the committee present
15 were Shipmate Nancy Copeland, Branch 201;
16 Shipmate Wayne Barron, Branch 89; Junior Past
17 President North Central, Jerry Lickteig,
18 Branch 161; Shipmate Richard Ruiz of Branch
19 101, and me, Past Regional President North
20 Central, Norman G. Combs. And remember that.

21 Visitors were Past Regional
22 President West Coast William Hanzel of Branch
23 230 and Past Regional President Southeast John

1 Davis of Branch 44.

2 In evaluating and judging the
3 reports, the first place winners were
4 Annapolis Branch 24, Group one. Group two was
5 Kempsville Branch 99. Group 3 was the Mark
6 Kilgore Branch 22. Group four was Cleveland
7 Branch 17. Group five Ogden Branch 185.

8 Second place, Group one was Low
9 Country Branch 269. There was none submitted
10 for Group two. Group 3 was Chesapeake Branch
11 40. Group four was Triangle Branch 182.
12 Group five, Lake of the Ozarks Branch 32.

13 Third place there was no
14 submission for Branch one -- or group one. No
15 submissions for Group two. I hope the
16 regenerating of the group levels members we've
17 approved today will rectify that.

18 Group three, third place, Mo-Kan
19 Branch 161. Group four, Birmingham Branch
20 112. That sounds local. Group five,
21 Shreveport/Bossier Branch 98.

22 Your streamers are on the table
23 on the port side of the port mic if they have

1 not already been given to you.

2 I will encourage the regional
3 presidents -- and Jerry is waving his hand --
4 wave your hand again, Jerry. He has them.

5 The Walter "Step" Rowell Award
6 for the best overall report goes to Cleveland
7 Branch 17.

8 The Leonard "Swede" Nelson Award
9 for Shipmate of the Year goes to Shipmate T --
10 I don't know what the T stands for -- last
11 name is Wright of the Elizabeth City Branch
12 293.

13 There was no Robert Doherty Award
14 recipient.

15 The committee recommends that the
16 theme for the -- it should be the 20 -- yeah,
17 the '22-'23 -- no the '22-'23 is already --
18 no, it's a 23-24. We have a typo here -- the
19 Americanism Essay Contest is: What Memorial
20 Day Means to Me.

21 Since our funding for this has
22 been depleted, the Shipmates -- the Committee
23 recommends that we find a revenue source to

1 fund the essay contest, which we kicked around
2 maybe perhaps something like a -- getting a
3 corporate sponsor of some kind.

4 For the edification of those of
5 you that want to remind commanding officers,
6 JAG officers and chief petty officers who tell
7 their young sailors that being a member of the
8 FRA could jeopardize their career in any way
9 for advancement or whatever, we are reporting
10 that we -- we garnered 1,672 essays.

11 Money expended -- this is what
12 was reported by the branches in the regions,
13 branches and regions amounted to \$71,651 and
14 change. Man hours, 4,611 and miles driven
15 12,988. That's what was reported.

16 And I move my report be received,
17 Shipmate President.

18 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
19 Shipmate at the mic.

20 SHIPMATE DUNN: Shipmate Dunn,
21 Branch 263, delegate.

22 Administrative correction there,
23 Shipmate. Wayne Barron that served on this

1 committee this morning is with Branch 263,
2 formally Branch 89 where I spent my first 40
3 years in the FRA.

4 PRNCP COMBS: Stand corrected.

5 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: You
6 heard the report. All in favor?

7 (Chorus of ayes.)

8 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
9 Opposed?

10 (No response.)

11 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
12 Report passed.

13 Shipmate Chaplain, would you
14 close the Bible, please?

15 NCHAP LYMON: FRA National
16 President, the Bible is closed.

17 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Thank
18 you. Take a break. Be back in 15 minutes.

19 (Break taken.)

20 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:
21 Shipmate National Chaplain, would you please
22 open the Bible?

23 NCHAP LYMON: Shipmate National

1 President, the Bible is open.

2 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: Shipmate
3 National President, the Junior Past remains in
4 the uniform of the day.

5 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: All
6 right. Shipmates, we're going to do one more
7 report and then we're going to have -- we're
8 going to hear from the Convention Committee
9 and then we're going to take recess 'til
10 tomorrow morning.

11 All right. At this time, I would
12 like to have the chairman for the Honorary
13 Membership Committee come up, please.

14 SECRETARY/TREASURER MIGLIONICO:
15 Shipmates, I was given this assignment thirty
16 minutes before we were supposed to start. I
17 was so excited my glasses broke. But anyway,
18 if I put them on halfway, I'll still read the
19 whole report.

20 The National Convention Committee
21 on Honorary Membership and Certificate of
22 Merit met this morning at 0815 at the Regency
23 Hyatt Wyndfrey Hotel in the Hampshire Room.

1 Present was myself, Stephen Miglionario,
2 Delbert D. Black Branch 117.

3 Members, David Field of the Nola
4 Branch of 162 and Charley Randall of the
5 Capitol Area Branch 201.

6 Some visitors were George Hyland
7 from the Groton Branch 20 and John A.
8 Sullivan, Groton Branch 20.

9 The meeting was called to order
10 at 0815. The committee reviewed five
11 Resolutions For Honorary Membership. I will
12 read each recommendation on a proceed basis.
13 If a Shipmate has a question, please state
14 your question. If a Shipmate has an
15 objection, please say objection. I will then
16 put a motion on the floor for discussion.

17 Charley Randall moved and
18 seconded by David Field that the nomination
19 for Groton Branch 20, Groton, Connecticut for
20 Ms. Sue Fazikas be approved for Honorary
21 Membership in the FRA.

22 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: Proceed.

23 SECRETARY/TREASURER MIGLIONICO:

1 David Field moved and seconded by Charley
2 Randall that the nomination from Corpus
3 Christi Branch 94, Corpus Christi, Texas, for
4 Ms. Shirley Moore be approved for Honorary
5 Membership in the FRA.

6 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATES: Proceed.

7 SECRETARY/TREASURER MIGLIONICO:
8 George Hyland moved and seconded by David
9 Field that the nomination from Capital Area
10 Branch 201, Austin, Texas, for Ms. Cynthia R.
11 Banks be approved for honorary membership in
12 the FRA.

13 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATES: Proceed.

14 SECRETARY/TREASURER MIGLIONICO:
15 David Field moved and seconded by Charley
16 Randall that the nomination for Bob -- for Bob
17 He-Coon Sikes, Branch 210, in Milton, Florida
18 for Mr. Donnie Gabbard be approved for
19 Honorary Membership in the FRA.

20 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATES: Proceed.

21 SECRETARY/TREASURER MIGLIONICO:
22 David Field moved and seconded by Charley
23 Randall that the nomination for Volusia

1 County -- Volusia County, Branch 335, Port
2 Orange, Florida, for Mr. John Pelosi be
3 approved for Honorary Membership in the FRA.

4 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATES: Proceed.

5 SECRETARY/TREASURER MIGLIONICO:

6 There was no resolution received regarding the
7 Certificate of Merit Award.

8 The meeting was concluded at
9 0840. I as the chairman move the Honorary
10 Committee Report be accepted.

11 PRPSE RICHMOND: Shipmate Richmond,
12 Kilgore Branch 22. The last one you said was
13 for Pelosi, right?

14 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: Right.

15 PRPSE RICHMOND: Was that for
16 Resolution five?

17 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATES: No, four.

18 PRPSE RICHMOND: Well, there's a
19 Resolution five in our delicate --

20 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: They are
21 out of order.

22 PRPSE RICHMOND: Thank you.

23 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:

1 You've heard the resolution for Honorary
2 Membership. All in favor?

3 (Chorus of ayes.)

4 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: All
5 opposed?

6 (No response.)

7 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: So be
8 it.

9 At this time I would like to call
10 up the -- wait a minute. We want to hear from
11 Mr. Pelosi.

12 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: Shipmate
13 Pelosi.

14 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Get a
15 mic.

16 SHIPMATE PELOSI: I would like to
17 have Bob installed me, if possible.

18 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: We
19 can have that happen.

20 Shipmate Jerry, do you want to
21 come up say a few words, do a little dance.

22 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: Or you can
23 just go to the mic.

1 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Or
2 you can just go to the mic on the floor down
3 there.

4 JrPRPNC LICKTEIG: I'll say
5 something but no dancing.

6 Shipmate President and all
7 Shipmates. I want to appreciate everything
8 that you've done this weekend or this week so
9 far helping us at this convention. It's been
10 -- it's been fun for the last eight months. I
11 hope everybody is enjoying everything.

12 (Applause.)

13 JrPRPNC LICKTEIG: I appreciate
14 that. I just want to put out a couple things
15 real quick that you can give any members that
16 aren't here.

17 Friday night after the banquet,
18 we're going to have an open auction. We're
19 going to have four items there. So we'll take
20 cash, check, or we'll even have credit card if
21 you want to bid on it. So we have a couple
22 nice things. Come up to the hospitality room,
23 you can see them sitting there. One item was

1 found in the -- when somebody was sea diving.
2 I don't know where it was. It was like a
3 bottle from 1800.

4 UNIDENTIFIED SHIPMATE: Caribbean.

5 JrPRPNC LICKTEIG: Caribbean.

6 Okay. But they found it there in the sand.

7 Next thing, we're opening in the
8 mornings at breakfast. If you want to come
9 down and have some coffee and some Danishes
10 and all that stuff, if you don't feel like
11 going down to the cafeteria -- not the
12 cafeteria, but the restaurant and everything.
13 So come on up. Lunch, we're going to have
14 some hot dogs and things like that, and that
15 evening we're going to have heavy -- heavy
16 food and all that if you feel like just
17 sitting around and eating and drinking -- more
18 drinking than that. That brings money in.

19 So we've still got the coins and
20 pins. If you haven't got them, we've still
21 got a lot left. And take some back to your
22 branches and everything else and show
23 everybody what they missed and everything.

1 One other thing: This is the
2 real thing. We really need -- we've only got
3 a couple people.

4 Saturday, if you're going to be
5 around and you can spend a couple hours from,
6 say, 9 in the morning until 12, we need some
7 help unloading the social room, get it from
8 the 15th floor down to the loading dock and
9 then help maybe load the trailer. If we get
10 enough people, we should be done in about an
11 hour, hour and a half. So if anybody can
12 help, just let me know or just be there, I'll
13 appreciate it. Thank you.

14 Are you going to auction that, too?
15 Raffle. That that's no problem. Got a good
16 bottle of -- what is it again? Woodward
17 Reserve. I haven't had any of that. It's got
18 a 2022 National Convention Crossing on the
19 back. It's got the triangle on it. It's a
20 real nice bottle. Come on up and start
21 bidding on it.

22 We still have a lot of silent
23 auction. There's some of them going to be

1 done actually this afternoon at 1800, and then
2 the rest of them will be done Friday at 1500.
3 So come make your bids and everything else.
4 We've got all kinds of things.

5 We just put out some sausage and
6 everything else up there. So it's summer
7 sausage and something else. It's real good.
8 It comes with cheese. I think some people
9 here have had it before. Come get some.
10 Thank you, National President. I appreciate
11 it.

12 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL:

13 You're welcome.

14 I have one announcement.
15 Tomorrow morning or tomorrow some time in the
16 day, we're going to do the Educational
17 Foundation and Disaster Relief Fund and
18 Veteran Services Tomorrow.

19 We're going to -- tomorrow's
20 meeting will start at 0900. I wanted to do it
21 at 06 but -- 0900. We'll be here tomorrow
22 morning. Hopefully we can get it all out of
23 the way before this time.

1 Master Chaplain, will you please
2 close the Bible?

3 Wait a minute. Hold fast.

4 NVP ROBBINS: Shipmates, just for
5 your information, at the conclusion of this
6 session, we do have a workshop with the
7 Department of Veteran Affairs across the hall
8 here. They're here to basically give a brief
9 on the PACT Act and on additional VA services.
10 So if you want to go and get information about
11 the VA or have questions about that, please.
12 They've been here all week but they're going
13 to do a formal presentation and such. So
14 please show your support and attend that
15 workshop. Thank you.

16 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: I
17 apologize. National Chaplain, would you
18 proceed?

19 NCHAP LYMON: Shipmate National
20 President, the Bible is closed.

21 NATIONAL PRESIDENT CAMPBELL: Thank
