Oasis Hotel and Convention Center
Springfield, Missouri

1 (Called to order at 1311.)

2 NP BEHM: Shipmate Master at Arms, will
3 you allow them in, and close the door.

4 National chaplain, would you please open
5 the Bible? Uncover please.

6 NCHAP FALU: Shipmate National
7 President, the Bible is open.

8 NP BEHM: Thank you, Shipmate.

9 We're going to do as quick as we can,
10 trying to move this along, and continue with our
11 committee reports.

12 Shipmate Matthews, would you please give
13 us the next credentials report?

14 PRPWC MATTHEWS: Matthews, Branch 197,
15 chairman for the national committee on hospital
16 welfare and rehabilitation.

17 NP BEHM: Credentials.

18 PRPWC MATTHEWS: Oh. For the
19 credentials, no change. Okay, fine.

20 NP BEHM: All right, I would like to now
21 ask the NVP come up and do his portion of the

1 membership and retention.

2 NVP FETRO: Good afternoon, shipmates,
3 are we all awake? What a crowd, okay.

4 So we met at nine o'clock at the -- was
5 it Kalahari?

6 SPEAKER: The Sonoran.

7 NVP FETRO: There we go, at nine
8 o'clock. The shipmates that were there were
9 Shipmate Smith from Branch 98; Shipmate Emory
10 from Branch 89; Shipmate Grimm from Branch 294;
11 Shipmate Thornton from 184; Shipmate Salsbury
12 from 170; Shipmate Toulotte from 24; Shipmate
13 (inaudible) from Branch 227; Shipmate Porter from
14 185; Shipmate Herndon from 364; Shipmate Turner
15 from 316; Shipmate Brown from 226; Shipmate
16 Sanchez from Branch 166, Shipmate Cecil from 166;
17 Shipmate Pena from 287; and Shipmate Bailey from
18 316.

19 Shipmates, we went over our report and
20 all our nominations are in the packet. So
21 basically what we did is we kind of had a

1 brainstorming for membership. We were very
2 fortunate because some of the members that came
3 are vice presidents that will be on the committee
4 next year, so some of the stuff that we talked
5 about, they will be bringing to the committee.

6 What we did talk about is getting young
7 members, I mean, that's a gimme. There's a
8 proposal that they're going to talk about this
9 year in membership as far as changing the dates
10 that your membership expires, to make it a single
11 date like, and I'm just using a date, like say
12 April 30th, that's when your dues are due, rather
13 than going for a full year every month, there's
14 different timeframes. That's going to be
15 discussed this next year coming up.

16 Another item that came up was putting
17 the application on the new brochure that we did.
18 Along with that is to make the brochure a
19 tri-fold.

20 A lot of branches are paying the first
21 year's dues for their members. Something to

1 think about.

2 Also in the new brochure, there is an
3 item that was brought up on the second page, that
4 the Coast Guard ship is really small on that
5 page, so we're going to increase that size
6 because you know, we're three services, so there
7 was some thought about that.

8 We also went over the proposal again
9 that I went over yesterday as far as that new
10 program that we're talking about. Since I have
11 not had a chance to look at the contract, what I
12 want is the NED to go over it so the entire
13 delegation here knows exactly what's going on.

14 NED REID: Shipmates, somewhere around
15 2017 we signed a contract for yearbooks, and we
16 did two separate yearbooks, we did one in 2019
17 and I believe the other one was done in 2022, and
18 this was a company called PCI. And you got phone
19 calls from these individuals, or cards, and what
20 they were saying is that they would put together
21 a book of FRA members and they would take their

1 stories, my stories, et cetera, et cetera. It's
2 kind of like a college yearbook or something like
3 that. Are there any individuals here who
4 participated in those? I see a lot of you.

5 So they've already approached us again,
6 they want to do it again. And one of the things
7 that I appreciate about this item is that there's
8 no money out of pocket from the FRA, it is
9 actually out of your pockets.

10 But what it is, they're making some
11 guarantees. So the number one guarantee
12 immediately, they're going to give us \$25,000.
13 What we're doing is we're loaning them our list
14 of members, and not just the current members but
15 members going back five years who have expired.

16 Number two, what they're going to do is
17 they're going to do recruiting for us. So
18 they're going to look at the members here
19 currently, they're also going to look at the
20 five-year expiration and they collect the money
21 and return the monies to us.

1 Number three, there is a book, there was
2 sweatshirts, there were other things that you
3 could purchase, and they would give us an
4 additional -- from the membership what they're
5 saying is that they're going to guarantee another
6 \$25,000. Each book that they sell, they're going
7 to give us \$10, I think it's 10, it may be 15. I
8 told them that they really need to bump that
9 because those books, ten percent of that book to
10 me as an ex finance officer is not enough.

11 So you're guaranteed, what you're doing
12 is we just talked about the budget, and this is
13 an opportunity for us to drive revenue without
14 any hit on the budget at all, we're not putting
15 out anything. So this is one of the items, the
16 PCI project, that we will not decide, but we will
17 be asking, you know, is this something we want to
18 go forward with. I know that there are people
19 who were not happy with stuff being late and
20 those kinds of thing. And my feeling is, I think
21 that I would tell them that I'll penalize you for

1 coming in late.

2 So there's various things we can do.

3 The guarantee minimum is approximately \$50,000,
4 the max is, I would imagine about \$75,000. But,
5 the big thing is there is no money going out from
6 the FRA.

7 NVP FETRO: So shipmates, what I am
8 planning to do if I become the national president
9 is at the post-board, bring this up so we can
10 approve this and get it going. We don't want to
11 miss this opportunity to get this started. And
12 they actually said they would like to start at
13 the beginning of '26, so they would have it
14 completed somewhere by the end of the year, or
15 somewhere within that year.

16 But NED, I'd like you to just take a few
17 notes, because at our meeting we talked about
18 that and they said that, one of the things that
19 some of the shipmates felt like it was a scam,
20 because they kind of put it in the words like you
21 have to respond immediately. When people see

1 that, they think oh, this is bad. So I think
2 what has to happen is in the FRA Today, what we
3 really have to do is really explain it to the
4 shipmates, so we know what's coming.

5 The other thing we talked about was to
6 try to use all avenues of media that we can. I
7 mean, there's Facebook, there's Instagram. And
8 just a show of hands, how many people go on
9 TikTok? I'm not going to tell you to go on
10 TikTok, but there are a lot of young people that
11 go on TikTok, there a lot of young people. So I
12 mean, that's just another media that we might be
13 able to look at.

14 Another thing that came up was when the
15 members of the membership committee, you know,
16 when we brought up the idea of new brochures or
17 how do we advertise, there's always money
18 constraints, the printing costs, the postage
19 costs. So that's one of the things that the new
20 membership committee is going to have to address.

21 The other, another thing that came up,

1 another idea that came up is to try to maximize
2 where we go as far as if you're in a base area,
3 if there's a Coast Guard base, if there is a --
4 you know, I'm just trying to think, I mean we
5 don't have a branch in, say, the middle of
6 Illinois. You wouldn't want to set up a
7 branch -- I mean you could, but you want to
8 maximize where you're at. Great Lakes is a great
9 example. Great Lakes is one that we should, in
10 my mind, we should be ashamed of, that we don't
11 have a branch at Great Lakes. So that's
12 something that we really have to work on.

13 Shipmates, I thank the members that were
14 on the committee, so I move to accept my
15 committee report, and I thank all the committee
16 members and I thank all the guests that came to
17 our meeting today. Yes, sir?

18 S/M DUVORE: Duvore, Branch 177.

19 Second. Okay.

20 Anyway, to add to that, what about a
21 thumb drive? One of the things about thumb

1 drives is you can access it anywhere in your own
2 personal media, and then it might be a great way
3 to resolve this as soon as possible instead of
4 buying 75 books, just an idea using what we have
5 today, just an idea.

6 NP BEHM: Thank you, Shipmate.

7 NVP FETRO: One more idea that came up,
8 and I think the NED would have to talk to the
9 producers of this book. A shipmate could be in
10 branch 202, just using a number. And when they
11 actually receive the book because it doesn't come
12 in one book, it comes in volumes, what could
13 happen is I could be a shipmate in 202, but I'm
14 not getting the same book. So I'm thinking in my
15 mind if I want to buy this book and the shipmates
16 in the book will be the shipmates in my branch,
17 that is not necessarily the case. And I'm not
18 sure if they use that as orders come in or if
19 there's some way that we might be able to, when
20 they get ready to do the book, is to get at least
21 the branches together, okay? That's it.

1 NP BEHM: We have a first and second,
2 any further discussion? All in favor of
3 accepting his report?

4 (Chorus of ayes.)

5 Any nays?

6 Americanism and patriotism, step up
7 please.

8 MAA RUIZ: I'm the AP chairman for the
9 Americanism and patriotism. On my staff, my
10 committee was John Way, Branch 090; Richard
11 Brune, 181; Robert Oliviera, 293; Wayne Barron,
12 Branch 263; Donald Kelley, Branch 289; Raymond
13 Rizzo, 124; Richard Rivas, 161. The advisor was
14 Jerry Lickteig. Visitors were Terrence Johnson,
15 Sonny Sales, Nicholas Lucito, Earl Boswell,
16 Robert Duvore, Yuki Hillary and Norm Combs,
17 Charles McIntire and John Larson. Thank you for
18 coming to this meeting and helping, and these new
19 guys just showed up yesterday when we were tasked
20 with judging the essays, or judging the reports.

21 So I'm going to tell you guys, forms are

1 going to be changing, rules are going to be
2 changing, the new forms have W-9s requested, AP
3 chairmen and presidents have to contact the AP
4 regional guys. They're going to be on the
5 committee for next year. So make sure they know,
6 my number is in the book so have them call me,
7 because we're going to do maybe some Zoom
8 meetings to make all this happen this year.

9 What I want you to know is that a
10 special thank you goes out to Jerry Lickteig. He
11 got all the plaques made and had them all
12 shipped, all under a thousand dollars for this
13 year.

14 (Applause.)

15 So when you see Jerry, thank him. These
16 plaques are not small, they're big, overall
17 bigger, so we've got to thank Jerry very much for
18 what he did. And I know he snuck out of the room
19 so he wouldn't seem embarrassed. Yeah, he didn't
20 want to suffer like the rest of us do.

21 Okay. We're going to go over

1 everybody's groups and winners, so you're in.

2 Group I, Branch 259, first place.

3 Second place, Branch 24, Group I. Third place,
4 we didn't have one in Group I, NA.

5 Group II, first place, 161. Second
6 place, Branch 99, Group II. Second place, or
7 third place, 261, okay?

8 Group III, 101, first place. Second
9 place Group III is 172. Third place, 126.

10 Okay. Now we're down to Group IV.

11 Branch 261 --

12 (Side comments.)

13 Group II is 161, okay?

14 NP BEHM: I have it here, hang on.

15 MAA RUIZ: Okay, Group IV, I'll check on
16 that, okay? Group V -- hang on. What I have to
17 do is go back to my room and get my sheet, and
18 I'll come back with Group IV later, okay?

19 Group V, first place, Branch 185.

20 Second place, Branch 98. Third place, Branch 37.

21 So I'll check on Group III and IV to

1 make sure those are correct. II and IV, I'll
2 check again. So I'm not going to ask that my
3 report be complete until it's, or accepted until.

4 Yeah, the Walter "Step" award is Branch
5 201. The Walter C. "Step" Rowell award was
6 Branch 201, that's overall. I'm sorry, guys, my
7 fault.

8 The Leonard D. "Swede" shipmate of the
9 year was shipmate Gruetzner, Cathleen Gruetzner.

10 SPEAKER: How do you spell it?

11 MAA RUIZ: G-R-U-E-T-Z-N-E-R.

12 SPEAKER: Ursula.

13 NP BEHM: Congratulations.

14 (Applause.)

15 MAA RUIZ: Good job, Shipmate.

16 The Robert E. Doherty award, we didn't
17 have one, NA.

18 NED REID: Reid, NED. Shipmates, I just
19 want to give you an update about the Americanism
20 and patriotism. What I was able to do was get a
21 sponsor for our top prize, the \$1,500, and I'd

1 like to give a hand to AMBA, who has a table
2 outside, and we will identify the top prize, the
3 \$1,500 winner as the AMBA winner as long as they
4 give me the sponsorship money, so thanks to AMBA.

5 (Applause.)

6 MAA RUIZ: One of the shipmates, I'm not
7 a computer literate guy, but the office people
8 were eating lunch and they thought I was, so I
9 did the numbers myself and I screwed them up.

10 All right, real quick, I'm going to do
11 it a little bit different.

12 First place, Branch 269, Group I.
13 Second place Group I, Branch 24. Third place
14 Group I, NA, we didn't have one.

15 Group II, Branch 161, first place.
16 Second place, Branch 99. Third place, Branch
17 261.

18 First place, Group III, Branch 101.
19 Second place, 172. Third place, 126.

20 Group IV, 201. Second place, 182.
21 Third place, Branch 197.

1 Group V, Branch 185. Second place, 98.
2 Third place, Branch 37. Okay.

3 The Rowell award is Branch 201.

4 And the Leonard D. "Swede" Nelson
5 shipmate of the year is Cathleen Gruetzner.

6 SPEAKER: Ursula.

7 MAA RUIZ: I know, but in the book and
8 how she registered and signed is Cathleen Ursula
9 Gruetzner, that's why. Plus, she's a Marine and
10 she knows it. Congratulations.

11 I move that my report be accepted.

12 NP BEHM: Second?

13 PRPSW KELLEY: Kelley, delegate, 289. I
14 second that.

15 NP BEHM: Any discussion? All in favor?

16 (Chorus of ayes.)

17 Any opposed? Accepted.

18 (Applause.)

19 All right. Next one, hospital welfare
20 and rehabilitation. That would be -- I didn't
21 give you enough to do this year.

1 PRPWC MATTHEWS: Let me try and see if I
2 can get this right this time. So this is for the
3 report for national committee on hospital welfare
4 and rehabilitation, Matthews, Branch 197,
5 chairman.

6 We met here yesterday in this room at
7 0900. Myself was the chair. Shipmate Baker from
8 Branch 014, Milwaukee; Shipmate Victorio Carreon
9 is a member but he couldn't be here, from Branch
10 302; Laurie Bailey, Past National Chaplain, Low
11 Country Branch 269; Regional Vice President East
12 Coast Paula Falu, Branch 099; Regional President
13 East Coast Robert Oliviera, Elizabeth City Branch
14 293; Past Regional President Southwest Chris
15 Chapman, Imperial Beach Branch 289; and Regional
16 President West Coast Joseph R. Huffman couldn't
17 attend, he's part of our committee but he had to
18 stay home, health issues. Advisor is Past
19 National Chaplain Paul Gunther, Triangle Branch
20 182. And the visitors were Branch President
21 Denise Orafranco, I hope I got that right, from

1 Branch 091; Regional Secretary Southwest Romeo
2 Galeon, Carson Branch 302; Regional Vice
3 President West Coast Marcus Pena, Branch 287
4 Livermore.

5 So we graded the reports of course, and
6 I have that, but I just wanted to say to my
7 committee, those people that worked on the
8 committee have been meeting every month since
9 January. In fact the first meeting we held I was
10 on fire, I was on a fire down in southern
11 California trying to do it from there. So we met
12 every month and they've done incredible work.

13 They've updated the guidebook for
14 hospital and welfare, changed the form for next
15 year to include VAVS, CDCE, the same thing with
16 the guidebook, so those two things are together
17 pursuant to approval of that resolution. And
18 really helped me out being kind of a knucklehead
19 myself for being a chairman, to put together this
20 report, and I just want to thank them for all the
21 things that they've done.

1 (Applause.)

2 So I'll read you the report winners.

3 First place Group I, is Branch 289,
4 Imperial Beach, Southwest region.

5 Group II, Branch 161, MO-Kan, North
6 Central.

7 NP BEHM: Are you going across the
8 section of the groups instead of first and
9 second?

10 PRPWC MATTHEWS: Group III, first place
11 is Branch 302, Carson, Southwest.

12 Group IV, Branch 014, Milwaukee, North
13 Central.

14 Group V, Branch 098, Shreveport, South
15 Central.

16 Second place: Group I, 024, Annapolis,
17 East Coast. Group II, Branch 097, Whidbey,
18 Northwest; Group III, 101 Santa Clara, West
19 Coast; Group IV, Branch 197, Modesto, West Coast;
20 Group V, Branch 038, Inland Empire, Northwest.

21 Third place: Group I, none, okay?

1 Group II, 061, I don't have the name here, I made
2 that mistake, Southwest. Group III, 040, Chula
3 Vista, Southwest --

4 SPEAKER: No, that's wrong.

5 SPEAKER: Shipmate, 061 is Chula Vista.

6 PRPWC MATTHEWS: Okay. So I'll go back
7 to my notes to make sure it's right, my mistake.

8 Group IV, 201, Capital Area, South
9 Central; and Group V, 041, Roanoke Valley, East
10 Coast.

11 So I'll check that one for 040 and make
12 sure I got it right. I will not move my report
13 be received until I fix the mistake.

14 NP BEHM: Shipmate of the year?

15 PRPWC MATTHEWS: Excuse me. Shipmate of
16 the year, Randy Phillips, Branch 182, Triangle
17 Branch.

18 (Applause.)

19 NP BEHM: Your report's okay as far as
20 just telling us where they're located, your
21 report is okay.

1 PRPWC MATTHEWS: Okay. I move that my
2 report be accepted.

3 NP BEHM: Do I have a second?

4 RPNENE RIZZO: Rizzo, delegate, 124,
5 seconds.

6 NP BEHM: Any discussion? Any
7 discussion? All in favor?

8 (Chorus of ayes.)

9 Any opposed? Accepted.

10 Next we go to our national public
11 relations chairman Edgardo Labao. If you come up
12 here that would be easier, some people read lips.

13 RPSW LABAO: Ed Labao, public relations
14 chairman. The national convention committee on
15 public relations met in the Coca/Maui ballroom at
16 the Oasis Hotel and Conference Center,
17 Springfield, Missouri on November 5 at 0900.

18 Chairman, Ed Labao, Carson Branch 302. Members
19 are Shipmate Ernest Rose from Branch 89; Shipmate
20 Frank Correan from Branch 302, Southwest;
21 Shipmate James Galeon, Branch 17, North Central;

1 Shipmate Pat Spath (phonetic) Branch 17, North
2 Central; Shipmate Jonardo Torrila (phonetic)
3 Branch 197, West Coast.

4 And here are the 2025 winners for public
5 relations. I'm going to read the first place
6 winners first.

7 First place, Group I, Branch 269, South
8 Central. Group II, Branch 161, North Central;
9 Group III, Branch 302, Southwest; Group IV,
10 Branch 14, North Central; Group V, Branch 222,
11 South Central.

12 I'm going to read the second place
13 winners: Group I, Branch 24, East Coast; Group
14 II, Branch 70, Southwest; Group III, Branch 136,
15 North Central; Group IV, Branch 182, East Coast;
16 Group V, Branch 32, North Central.

17 Now third place winners: Group I, there
18 is no winner; Group II, Branch 97, Northwest;
19 Group III, Branch 117, Southeast; Group IV,
20 Branch 382, Northwest; and Group V, Branch 38,
21 Northwest.

1 Shipmate of the year, Shipmate James
2 Grisham from Branch 38.

3 I want to thank all the shipmates who
4 participated in evaluating this report. I move
5 that this report be received.

6 PRPSW KELLEY: Kelley, delegate, 289,
7 second.

8 NP BEHM: Thank you. Any further
9 discussion? Any discussion? All in favor?

10 (Chorus of ayes.)

11 Any opposed? All right, accepted.

12 By the way, I have further information
13 on the convention that's coming up for national
14 for 2026.

15 Next up is our veteran service officer
16 for the VSO, there you are, you've been hiding,
17 S.C. Martin.

18 PRPEC MARTIN: Good afternoon,
19 shipmates. The following is a split veteran
20 service report and we will do the VAVS first.
21 There was 21 VAVS reports presented, five of them

1 was in the negative. I will read them one, two
2 and three accordingly. There is no streamer for
3 either one of these, only the shipmate of the
4 year.

5 Group I, no report; Group II, first
6 place, Southwest, Branch 61 out of Chula Vista;
7 second place, North Central, 161, Kansas
8 Missouri; Group II or excuse me, Group III, North
9 Central, Branch 136, Minneapolis; second place,
10 East Coast, Branch 140, Chesapeake. Second
11 place --

12 SPEAKER: Are you doing first place all
13 the way across?

14 PRPEC MARTIN: First place all the way
15 down, first, second and third in each group. All
16 right, where are we at?

17 First place, there was none submitted in
18 Group I.

19 Group II, first place, Southeast --
20 excuse me, Southwest, Branch 061, Chula Vista;
21 second place, North Central, Branch 181 or excuse

1 me, 161, MO-Kan.

2 Group III, first place, North Central,
3 Branch 136, Minneapolis; second place, East
4 Coast, Branch 040, Chesapeake, Virginia.

5 Group IV, first place, North Central,
6 014, Milwaukee's finest; second place, West
7 Coast, 197, Modesto; third place, Northeast/New
8 England, Branch 1, George Hall. Are you with me?
9 All right.

10 Group V, first place, Southwest, 274;
11 second place, West Coast, 287; third place, East
12 Coast, 309.

13 And it is my honor to say that the
14 shipmate of the year was P. Smith out of fabulous
15 Vegas Branch 90.

16 Now VSO, veteran service officer. We
17 had 37 reports submitted of which nine were
18 negative.

19 First place, Branch 024, Annapolis,
20 that's Group I.

21 Group II, first place, Northwest, Branch

1 097, Whidbey Island; second place, east coast,
2 Branch 166, Virginia beach; third place, North
3 Central, Branch 161.

4 Everybody with me? I can't talk over
5 you, shipmates.

6 Group III, first place, East Coast,
7 Branch 040; second place, Southwest, Branch 302.

8 Group IV, first place, East Coast,
9 Branch 293, Elizabeth City; second place,
10 Northeast/New England, Branch 226, Staten Island.

11 Group V, first place, West Coast, Branch
12 287; second place, East Coast, Branch 309; third
13 place, Northeast/New England, Branch 031.

14 It is my distinct honor, veteran
15 services officer of the year, there are two of
16 them, side by side, Branch 040, Past Regional
17 President East Coast Paul Phelps, and from the
18 South Central I have Past Regional President
19 South Central Cathleen Ursula Gruetzner.

20 This concludes my report and I ask that
21 my report be received.

1 (Applause.)

2 NP BEHM: Second please?

3 PRPSW KELLEY: Kelley, delegate, 289,
4 second.

5 NP BEHM: First and second. Any
6 discussion? All in favor?

7 (Chorus of ayes.)

8 Any nays? Perfect.

9 Next we're going on to youths with
10 Regional President North Central Brian Jones.

11 RPNC JONES: Good afternoon, shipmates.
12 I'm Regional President North Central Brian Jones,
13 and the chair of the national youth activities
14 committee.

15 The national youth activities committee
16 met in the Coca/Maui Room at the Oasis Hotel and
17 Conference Center in Springfield, Missouri on
18 Wednesday, November 5th at 0900. The committee
19 members present, myself as chair; Junior Past
20 Regional President North Central Ed Grimes,
21 Branch 17; and the guest Past Regional President

1 North Central Barry White, MO-Kan Branch 161,
2 he's acting as our advisor. We had Shipmate
3 David Butz, Branch 251, who was a guest.
4 Regional President Northeast/New England Raymond
5 Rizzo, Branch 124. And Shipmate Anna Olsen,
6 Branch 161 was a guest. Shipmate Curtis Grant,
7 Branch 251 was a guest. Shipmate Geraldine Butz,
8 Branch 251 was a guest. And that was -- and we
9 had unfortunately three absent members from the
10 committee that were not here.

11 Primary business of youth activities.

12 Our primary duty was to study the various methods
13 by which the members best served the youth in
14 their communities so that young people may become
15 properly guided so they become better and more
16 useful citizens, and to solicit the full
17 cooperation of all branches and members to assist
18 in carrying out these duties. The committee
19 recognizes FRA branches annually for their
20 participation in the program.

21 So without further ado, the awards of

1 the branches, and I'll read them down Group I,
2 one, two, three.

3 So Group I, first place, Branch 269;
4 second place, 289; third place, 24.

5 For Group II, Branch 161; second place,
6 290; third place, Branch 166.

7 Group III, first place, Branch 136;
8 second place, 181; third plates, 162.

9 Group IV, first place, Branch 14; second
10 place, 112; third place, 182.

11 Group V, Branch 185; second place,
12 Branch 98; and third place, Branch 364.

13 Your shipmate of the year, Shipmate
14 Manny Gabon, Branch 302, Southwest, G-A-B-O-N,
15 Branch 302.

16 Other comments, there were 24 reports
17 submitted in youth activities and five shipmates
18 were nominated for shipmate of the year. All the
19 reports were outstanding, I applaud the committee
20 that showed up, the guests in force for the first
21 time sitting in on national youth activities,

1 they did an outstanding job.

2 Some recommendations for the next chair
3 were, each region should supply man hours, money
4 spent and miles driven so we get a complete
5 picture of what's being done as an organization.
6 What I received as first place winners, it also
7 would tally up. I did receive some of the
8 reports of some regions, but if I didn't have a
9 total tally, I felt that wasn't painting a clear
10 picture. So what I did tally was all the reports
11 submitted for the first place winners, so you can
12 jot those down. The approximate man hours spent
13 for all those first place winners was 4,865 man
14 hours. Total dollars contributed by shipmates,
15 \$9,306.23. Total dollars contributed by
16 branches, \$50,593.21. Grand total of dollars
17 contributed, \$61,306.84. Total mileage driven,
18 19,528. Again, that's just a snapshot of the
19 first place winners, so you can probably at least
20 double that or triple that across the board.
21 That's why it's important that those totals get

1 submitted in, and you can submit those by email,
2 you don't have to mail the whole package to us,
3 bring the package in with you to provide the
4 winners and those tallies. And there are
5 spreadsheets out there, I know the East Coast and
6 North Central has them, so you can get those
7 branches and the item numbers correspond with the
8 report, fill that in, total it, email it, all
9 right?

10 The only other recommendation as was
11 discussed in here before is that we are looking
12 to combine the three committees together and
13 adopt the community engagement when it comes up
14 for a vote in the 2026 convention.

15 Without further ado, I move that this
16 report be received.

17 NP BEHM: Second please?

18 S/M DUVORE: Duvore, Branch 177, I
19 second.

20 NP BEHM: Any discussion? All in favor?

21 (Chorus of ayes.)

1 Any opposed?

2 Shipmate National Vice President? The
3 national vice is going to give his membership
4 awards.

5 NVP FETRO: Shipmates, yesterday I
6 reported that we had our election, not our
7 election but our winners when we had our Zoom
8 meeting. So I gave the following out yesterday,
9 but I will repeat it again today so you can fill
10 out your journals.

11 So if you go to the membership and
12 retention, Group I for the Charles E. Lofgren
13 award for Branch 024, Annapolis. Group II was
14 097, Whidbey Island. Group III was 346, Panama
15 City. Group IV was Branch 154 Baguio City,
16 Philippines. And Group V was Branch 098,
17 Shreveport. And these, this information is in
18 the journal.

19 There were no submissions for the
20 individual award.

21 And for the membership and retention for

1 the Abraham Rosenberg membership trophy, that was
2 Branch 097, Whidbey Island.

3 And the Frank F. McPherson memorial
4 membership award was Gerald Miranda, and that was
5 from Southwest region, Branch 70, a life member.
6 Thank you.

7 (Applause.)

8 NP BEHM: All right. We're now moving
9 on -- sorry, I accept your report. Perfect.

10 Now we're going to go on to any
11 unfinished business that you might have. Is
12 there any unfinished business that you have
13 before we move into our recess and then come back
14 for the big one? All right.

15 Do you have any unresolved issues to
16 talk about, NED?

17 Let's take a break until 1430, come back
18 and get set up for the next process. Shipmate
19 National Chaplain, please come close the Bible.

20 NCHAP FALU: Shipmate National
21 President, the Bible is now closed.

1 NP BEHM: Cover. We're in recess until
2 1430.

3 (Recess.)

4 NP BEHM: Master at arms, will you make
5 sure that everyone is in and close the door?

6 Shipmate National Chaplain -- uncover.
7 National Chaplain, will you please open the
8 Bible?

9 NCHAP FALU: Shipmate National
10 President, the Bible is now open.

11 NP BEHM: Thank you, National Chaplain.

12 Shipmates, we're going to take a final
13 credentials report for changes, and if the report
14 has no changes --

15 PRPWC MATTHEWS: Shipmate President.

16 NP BEHM: Shipmate at the mic.

17 PRPWC MATTHEWS: Credentials Chair
18 Matthews, Branch 197. No change.

19 NP BEHM: We accept the last credentials
20 report and we will proceed.

21 Shipmate National Executive Director,

1 would you please read the resolved? We're going
2 to be starting with the national president, his
3 resolution.

4 NED REID: Fleet Reserve Association,
5 Santa Clara Valley Branch 101, National President
6 Nominating Resolution, Santa Clara Valley Branch
7 101.

8 Whereas, it will be the duty and
9 responsibility of the delegates assembled at the
10 97th national convention of the Fleet Reserve
11 Association to elect a dedicated, experienced and
12 qualified shipmate to the office of national
13 president for the year 2025-2026; and

14 Whereas, the assembled delegates realize
15 the shipmate elected must demonstrate leadership,
16 integrity, knowledge, and dedication to the three
17 cardinal principles of loyalty, protection and
18 service to their fellow shipmates, their families
19 and the FRA; and

20 Whereas, Santa Clara Valley Branch
21 101 -- oh wait -- I'm sorry, I didn't -- I love

1 reading, sorry.

2 Resolved, that the Santa Clara Valley
3 Branch 101, FRA, at the regular meeting held on
4 March 7, 2025, with a forum being present, did
5 vote unanimously to place the name of Richard J.
6 "Rick" Fetro in nomination for the office of
7 national president for the term 2025 to 2526; and
8 be it further

9 Resolved, that the shipmates of Santa
10 Clara Valley Branch 101, FRA do earnestly solicit
11 your support for our candidate Richard J. "Rick"
12 Fetro, whose exemplified dedication, service and
13 knowledge qualify him for the office of national
14 president for the term 2025-2026.

15 Signed, Richard A. Ruiz Sr., Branch 101
16 president. Signed, Richard J. Fetro, Branch 101
17 secretary and treasurer.

18 NP BEHM: Are there any other
19 nominations for the office of national president?
20 Are there any other nominations for the office of
21 national president? Are there any other

1 nominations for office of national president?

2 The nominations for national president are now
3 closed.

4 MAA RUIZ: Ruiz, Branch 101 president.

5 I move that we elect him by acclamation,

6 Richard J. Fetro.

7 NP BEHM: We need a second.

8 S/M DUVORE: Duvore, Branch 177, second.

9 NP BEHM: All in favor?

10 (Chorus of ayes.)

11 Opposed?

12 (Applause.)

13 NVP: Shipmates, this is really a
14 humbling experience. I'm thinking back more than
15 25 years ago, I was going to an Air Force
16 Sergeants Association meeting at Moffett Field.
17 I don't know if anybody's been to California, but
18 Moffett Field is a naval station. And there was
19 a friend of mine, and we were driving, I think
20 it's 237, from Milpitas over to Moffett Field,
21 and his name was Paul Gidling. And he said you

1 know, you ought to join the Fleet Reserve
2 Association. I told him, I said I can't, I never
3 retired from the Navy. He said no, no, no,
4 there's something, they have a special deal where
5 you didn't have to retire from the Navy, you just
6 had to have served. So the following month I
7 joined 101 and I've been there ever since, but
8 for the life of me, I never thought that day
9 would turn into this.

10 And it's really hard to be up here and
11 talk because you never think you're going to hit
12 this point and I hit it. So trust me when I say
13 that I will work hard and I will do everything in
14 my power to make sure that these lights for the
15 FRA never shut off and these doors never close.
16 Thank you.

17 (Applause.)

18 NP BEHM: Now we're going to proceed
19 with the election of the national vice president
20 and we have a couple candidates, so the NED is
21 now going to read the resolved. Regional

1 President North Central Brian Jones is present,
2 and we have Past Regional President East Coast
3 S.C. Martin, who also is present.

4 NED REID: National vice president, Lake
5 of the Ozarks Branch 032, nominating resolution.

6 Resolved, the Lake of the Ozarks Branch
7 032, Fleet Reserve Association, at a regularly
8 scheduled meeting held on Thursday, 8 May 2025, a
9 quorum being present, did vote unanimously to
10 place the name of Shipmate Regional President
11 North Central Brian J. Jones in nomination for
12 the office of national vice president, Fleet
13 Reserve Association, for the association year
14 2025-2026. And be it further

15 Resolved, that the shipmates of the Lake
16 of the Ozarks Branch 032 earnestly solicit the
17 support of each branch in the Fleet Reserve
18 Association to endorse and elect Regional
19 President North Central Brian J. Jones to the
20 office of national vice president, Fleet Reserve
21 Association.

1 Signed, President Maria A. Behm,
2 Secretary Bob Behm.

3 Fleet Reserve Association, Virginia
4 Beach Branch 166, nominating resolution, Virginia
5 Beach 166.

6 Resolved, that Virginia Beach Branch
7 166, Fleet Reserve Association at a regularly
8 scheduled meeting held on May 19th, 2025, with a
9 forum being present, did unanimously vote to
10 place the name of Sha'ron D. Martin, aka S.D.
11 Martin, in nomination for the office of national
12 vice president for the term 2025-2026. And be it
13 further

14 Resolved, that the shipmates of Virginia
15 Beach Branch 166, Fleet Reserve Association, do
16 earnestly solicit your support for our candidate
17 Sha'ron D. Martin, who exemplified dedication,
18 service, loyalty and knowledge qualifying him for
19 the office of national vice president for the
20 term of 2025-2026.

21 Signed, Thomas A. Cecil, Branch 166

1 President, and Victor Sanchez, Secretary.

2 NP BEHM: Are there any further
3 nominations for national vice president? Are
4 there any nominations for national vice
5 president? Are there any other nominations for
6 national vice president? The nominations for
7 national vice president for the Fleet Reserve
8 Association are now closed.

9 Would the two candidates, I'm going to
10 start out, we're going to, go in order read, so
11 Shipmate Regional Vice President North Central
12 Brian Jones, would you like to come up and speak
13 please? Each candidate will have five minutes.

14 RPNC JONES: National president,
15 national officers, past national officers,
16 regional officers, past regional officers,
17 shipmates and guests, it is an honor to stand
18 before you as the national vice president
19 candidate for the Fleet Reserve Association
20 2025-2026.

21 As I stand before you today, you know,

1 as we mark the beginning of our second century,
2 we must meet the challenge before us. We have to
3 meet it with clarity, courage and vision. It is
4 the duty of us all to look to our future,
5 evaluate where we stand, and what we can do to
6 grow this organization. As the national vice
7 president I will work with our membership
8 director, our NED and our national board of
9 directors to further enhance our membership and
10 retention.

11 In retention, we have seen too many
12 times that we're losing our shipmates out the
13 back door and how do we stop that, how to we curb
14 the bleeding wound quite frankly? And my vision
15 is that we have to incorporate Zoom at the
16 branch, every branch, because what's happening is
17 those shipmates are out there and they're
18 isolated, you know. If they merged with another
19 branch that makes it worse, because it's more
20 likely they're sitting off 40, 50, a hundred
21 miles away, they're not being included. We've

1 got to get the shipmates included back into
2 branch activities, and that's how we approach
3 retention. It might not fix it all but get them
4 back involved.

5 Zoom works. I attend Zoom at my branch,
6 I'm two hours away. So with retention, it's
7 reaching out to those shipmates that are not
8 coming to our meeting, so by including them, we
9 can now look at their community areas and get
10 that feedback into the branch through Zoom.

11 Membership, you know, through
12 membership, the NED talked about business
13 enterprises. I will work tirelessly with the NED
14 in membership to further those strategies, look
15 into how we can promote the FRA.

16 One of the things I have found this past
17 year is our nonprofit grass roots veterans
18 organizations. They're springing up everywhere
19 and while we fail to get our current and younger
20 veterans because the pressure is they're not
21 joiners, but they are viewers. And you find that

1 if you get involved in these nonprofit
2 organizations, so as we find those nonprofit
3 organizations, introduce ourselves to them as to
4 what we can do. And I feel we need to do a
5 registry or a website that can connect these
6 organizations.

7 Just some of the examples, Suite Smart
8 has a sleep app for insomnia. Suicide Veterans,
9 you get 17 to 22 a day, you know. And then
10 you've got Heroes Care, that gives out food,
11 clothing to our veterans, and it doesn't cost
12 them a thing. You know, Veterans Crisis Hotline,
13 Tiny Homes for Veterans, you know, if we can
14 connect them to each other through our website,
15 then they see us, they see that we're helping
16 them, and then they look to see who we are.

17 I feel that that is an area that we need
18 to take advantage of, do a registry on the
19 national website by state, by organization, so we
20 can plug that in with each other. We have to go
21 through these other nonprofits and get those

1 younger veterans to at least know who we are, get
2 that name recognition. Too often we hear that
3 FRA, never heard of you, or I heard of you but
4 didn't know that you still existed.

5 We're not gone yet, and as the national
6 president just mentioned, you know, we don't look
7 to close these doors, and we need to make sure
8 that doesn't happen. So you know, the fact is,
9 because we're not just an organization, we're a
10 family, the comradery that we built ourselves on,
11 and that's one of the big reasons I became a
12 member in 2009, going to a branch meeting and
13 seeing the structure of it at Branch 93 on the
14 East Coast. And I was sold on this organization
15 then as I am today, so I look for your support,
16 and thank you very much.

17 (Applause.)

18 NP BEHM: Regardless of who you may vote
19 for today, let's please when the candidates leave
20 the podium, let's all give them a round of
21 applause, okay?

1 (Applause.)

2 Regional President, Past Regional
3 President East Coast S.R. Martin, would you like
4 to come up please?

5 PRPEC MARTIN: Thank you very much,
6 National President. National president, past
7 national officers, past regional officers,
8 regional officers, branch, guests, and those
9 distinguished individuals up there. Folks, Sam
10 Mayhill, Chuck McIntyre, Dick Smith, Jim Scarbro,
11 not only them, look around, those were our
12 mentors. Look at your buddy, your friend, your
13 shipmate. We are now the mentors of those that
14 are coming and will come. We have to sell
15 ourselves as the Fleet Reserve Association, and
16 not only that, but to the public. 85 percent of
17 the people that are in the armed forces of today
18 as I speak to you know nothing, absolutely
19 nothing about what we do, what we stand for, or
20 what we even think about.

21 Now, everyone screams about recruiting.

1 How can you recruit someone who does not know who
2 you are? Information. Information is more
3 valuable than gold. Why? Because it tells each
4 and every one that is on the street, that is on
5 the bases, that is on the ships, in the air, on
6 those subs that they try to sink and get back to
7 the surface, who we are, what we are and how we
8 do it.

9 I will stand here and make no promises
10 to you except for the following. I will do my
11 utmost to follow the C&BLs and to follow the
12 leadership that I will be working under. Not
13 only that, you, each and every one of you, you're
14 the brains, you're the ones who dictate what you
15 and I can do, what the board of directors can do.
16 We have got to listen to you as the body. The
17 mind can do nothing other than follow what the
18 body tells it to do. You have the power and you
19 and only you can utilize the power.

20 With that, I humbly, and I often ask for
21 each and every one of you, a 50-50 shot, place

1 knowledge and balance. If you think he's more
2 qualified than I am, then vote for him. All I
3 ask is a 50-50 shot. You've seen my resume,
4 you've read his. Put them side by side and you
5 decide, not I, you decide.

6 Now one other thing before I step down.
7 Veteran service officers. I have heard that
8 everyone thinks that I am only running in order
9 to better the veteran service officers. Let me
10 say this to each and every one of you. Without
11 the body, meaning the association, the Fleet
12 Reserve Association as I stand before you, we
13 have no veteran service officer program. Either
14 we protect the association in order to help the
15 veteran service officer or we have none at all.
16 Besides that, we have a good foundation to work
17 from. They laid the foundation. All we've got
18 to do is build on it. If we don't build on it,
19 we're history. With that, I reach one more time
20 and solicit your help and your vote. Thank you
21 very much for your attention, and please, God

1 bless America.

2 (Applause.)

3 NP BEHM: Are there any other
4 nominations? Are there any questions that you
5 would like to ask any of the candidates?

6 Please state your name, your branch, and
7 the candidate or both that you would like to
8 address.

9 S/M DUVORE: Duvore, Branch 177. What
10 is your vision and plan on how we get our youth
11 involved in the activities of their school and in
12 turn an opportunity to utilize the FRA?

13 NP BEHM: Brian, S.C.?

14 RPNC JONES: Jones, candidate for NVP.
15 As far as youth activities, you're aware of what
16 we're doing at the national level as the youth
17 activities committee, and I plan to further
18 expand on that, getting the youth involved. We
19 need to hit the schools, look at the home
20 schools. Branch 177 with their, the next
21 generation of youth activities program, you know,

1 within our region, we can expand on that. But
2 that's what it takes, it takes community
3 engagement, getting out there and getting
4 yourself involved, not only in the schools but
5 you know, athletics and sponsorships. Every
6 branch has sponsored a youth activity at some
7 level. You know, Branch 93 when I was with them,
8 we hosted, or sponsored Boy Scouts, the local
9 football team. So we've got to get out there
10 involved in the youth in areas where they're at,
11 and that's at the schools and your community
12 athletics. Thank you.

13 PRPEC MARTIN: You asked how we can get
14 members. Basically number one, it starts with
15 each and every one of us. Why? Your kids, your
16 grandchildren, whenever you talk to these people,
17 don't forget one thing. In your mind you've got
18 to sell yourself as well as the organization.
19 Not only do you sell yourself, you sell the
20 ideal. You're not a used car salesman. Let them
21 tell you what they want and you listen. The

1 greatest thing that you can actually do is
2 listen, and that's what I've told so many others
3 that take the course as far as the veteran
4 service officer. It's not our stories to be
5 told, it's their stories. Listen to them. Give
6 them answers, give them guidance.

7 You ask how we can do this? Start with
8 the schools. Not only the schools, start with
9 the colleges. How many people in here have a
10 scholarship from their branch to a college? 166
11 has a scholarship fund that goes to a college.
12 It only helps those who help themselves.

13 Not only that, preach what is real.
14 Why? Engineering degrees. My grandson graduated
15 VCU with honors, he's a nuclear engineer. Aside
16 from that, getting involved as a student as well
17 as a teacher. Why? Because you and only you can
18 make this place better. We can't do it. We only
19 work as far and as hard as you tell us to work.
20 Why? We are trying to please each and every one
21 of you. We want to keep everything on the ground

1 and on a firm foundation. I hope that answered
2 your question. Thank you.

3 NP BEHM: Thank you.

4 NPAR POSEKANY: Shipmates, will the
5 candidates' tally members please come over here
6 where the tally chair appointed by the national
7 president is.

8 NED REID: Shipmates, can I have your
9 attention? Is there someone here from Branch
10 093? Okay.

11 NP BEHM: Shipmate at the mic.

12 RPNENE RIZZO: Rizzo, 124. There's also
13 no one here from 013.

14 NED REID: That's fine. So on your
15 tally sheets, and this is how we've done it
16 before, 093 should be crossed off. The tallies
17 and everything else will remain the same, but in
18 your book you may see 093. Cross that off.
19 Everything else is good. Okay.

20 NP BEHM: Shipmate at the mic.

21 MAA RUIZ: I just have a quick

1 announcement. You guys need to check your second
2 place ribbons, make sure you're in the group. I
3 might have switched the numbers on the wrong one,
4 so check the ribbons, make sure you're in your
5 group, or your branch.

6 NP BEHM: Shipmate at the mic.

7 PRPNC CUNNINGHAM: Cunningham, Branch
8 14. I was asked by Donna Lickteig to say that
9 because of the time and she's not sure she can
10 get in the room, the raffle, if you folks bought
11 those red raffle tickets, they're going to do
12 that before the installation, so if you have red
13 tickets they're going to pull those before the
14 installation. And they still have a lot of red
15 tickets to sell, they're six for five bucks, and
16 there's a lot of nice stuff in there.

17 NP BEHM: Thank you. Shipmate at the
18 mic.

19 PRPNC COMBS: Shipmate National
20 President, Combs, delegate, Branch 161. I have a
21 couple of announcements to make. Please pay

1 attention.

2 Tomorrow morning starting around 0900,
3 the convention van will be shuttling shipmates,
4 auxiliary members, guests to and from Bass Pro
5 Shop. It's a good sized place. All we ask is
6 that you take down the phone number of the
7 driver, the driver will be Joe Newton,
8 N-E-W-T-O-N, Joe Newton.

9 NP BEHM: Thank you, Norm.

10 PRPNE COMBS: His phone number is 417 --

11 NP BEHM: They're a little preoccupied
12 and won't remember that, okay?

13 PRPNC COMBS: You don't want his phone
14 number? Does anyone want his phone number?

15 NP BEHM: It's not the time, I'm sorry,
16 Norm.

17 PRPNC COMBS: One other thing. After we
18 finish business today, this is going to be closed
19 off because the hotel tomorrow morning has an
20 event going over here, and we'll be finished
21 anyway.

1 NP BEHM: Thank you. Shipmates, we will
2 now proceed to the election of the national vice
3 president. The tally committee will consist of
4 Shipmate Kurt Baker, Branch 14, as the chairman
5 oversight, and Shipmate Regional President North
6 Central Brian Jones, Branch 32, and Shipmate Past
7 Regional President East Coast S.C. Martin, Branch
8 166. Oh? I was interrupted while I was still
9 writing, okay?

10 Anyway, we have a tally committee and we
11 have a chairman, so now we will proceed with the
12 rollcall vote. NED, you may start.

13 NED REID: Shipmates, I will read the
14 branch, region, number of votes, and then I will
15 recite once again how the votes were split or
16 what the votes are. And this is for the vice
17 president.

18 Branch 001, Northeast/New England, four
19 votes.

20 RPNENE RIZZO: Rizzo, proxy, as
21 directed, four votes Martin.

1 NED REID: Branch 001 votes four votes
2 Martin. Branch 004, East Coast, two votes.

3 RPEC OLIVIERA: Oliviera, delegate,
4 proxy Branch 4, four votes directed Martin --
5 excuse me, sorry, two votes Martin.

6 NED REID: Branch 004 votes two votes
7 Martin. Branch 008, West Coast, five votes.

8 PNP BLACKBURN: Blackburn, delegate,
9 proxy Branch 8, five votes Martin.

10 NED REID: Branch 8, five votes for
11 Martin. Branch 012, North Central, two votes.

12 RVPNC HERNDON: Delegate Herndon, Branch
13 364, two votes Brian Jones.

14 NED REID: You're the proxy for 12; is
15 that correct?

16 RVPNC HERNDON: I am the proxy for 12.

17 NED REID: All right. Branch 12, two
18 votes for Jones. Branch 14, North Central, five
19 votes.

20 PRPNC CUNNINGHAM: Cunningham, Branch 14
21 delegate, five votes as instructed, Jones.

1 NED REID: Branch 14, five votes for
2 Jones. Branch 15, Southeast, two votes.

3 RPSE ANGER: Anger, proxy, two votes for
4 S.D.

5 NED REID: Branch 15, two votes for
6 Martin. Branch 17, North Central.

7 S/M SPATH: Spath, delegate, Branch 17,
8 four votes for Brian Jones.

9 NED REID: Branch 17, four votes for
10 Jones. Branch 20, Northeast/New England, 13
11 votes.

12 S/M HARRIS: Harris, delegate, Branch
13 20, 13 votes for Martin.

14 NED REID: Branch 20, 13 votes for
15 Martin. Branch 22, Southeast, nine votes.

16 S/M KIRTLEY: Kirtley, delegate, Branch
17 22, nine votes Martin.

18 NED REID: Nine votes for Martin.
19 Branch 23, Northeast/New England, four votes.

20 PNP JANSKY: Jansky, proxy, four votes
21 as instructed, Martin.

1 NED REID: Branch 23, four votes for
2 Martin. Branch 24, East Coast, 104 votes.

3 RVPEC TOULOTTE: Toulotte, Branch 24,
4 delegate, 104 votes to Martin.

5 NP BEHM: Branch 24, 104 votes for
6 Martin. Branch 29, Northwest, 15 votes.

7 RPNW BEAN: Branch 29, Bean, proxy, 15
8 votes for Jones.

9 NED REID: Branch 29, 15 votes for
10 Jones. Branch 31, Northeast/New England.

11 PNP JANSKY: Jansky, delegate, three
12 votes Jones.

13 NED REID: Branch 31, three votes for
14 Jones. Branch 32, North Central, three votes.

15 S/M BEAM: Beam, delegate, Branch 32,
16 three votes for Jones as directed.

17 NED REID: Branch 32, three votes for
18 Jones. Branch 34, Southeast, two votes.

19 S/M RIGGS: Riggs, Branch 34, two votes
20 Martin.

21 NED REID: Branch 34, two votes for

1 Martin. Branch 37, East Coast, two votes.

2 S/M HANSON: Hanson, delegate, Martin,
3 two votes.

7 Once again, I reiterate to each and every one of
8 you, what the body says, the mind has to take,
9 whether we like it or not, we follow. My job is
10 now to support this gentleman right here, not
11 only support him but support you. I work for
12 you, I work for him. With that, thank you very
13 much. I'll see you, God willing, tonight. Thank
14 you.

15 (Applause.)

16 NP BEHM: Just a reminder that the
17 elections are a two-thirds vote -- majority,
18 simple majority. All right. Are we ready to
19 proceed? Shipmate at the mic.

20 PRPNC LICKTEIG: Jerry Lickteig,
21 delegate, Branch 161. I have a public service

1 announcement to make here. The raffle prizes
2 will be divvied up before the banquet tomorrow,
3 so it's strongly encouraged that you get your
4 tickets this evening, there will be tickets out
5 up there, and I appreciate it. Thank you. Next
6 door in the Arabian right next to the hospitality
7 room.

8 NP BEHM: Shipmates, we will now proceed
9 to the election of the national executive
10 director. The first resolution will be read as
11 far as the resolved by the NED. Shipmate NED?

12 NED REID: Resolution for the National
13 Executive Director, North Shore Branch 031,
14 nominating resolution.

15 Resolved, that the North Shore Branch

9 Resolved, that High Sierra Branch 274,

11 scheduled monthly meeting held on 28 March 2025,
12 a quorum being present, did unanimously vote to
13 place the name of Past National President

9 President, Branch 031, and Donna M. Jansky,
10 Secretary, Branch 031.

11 NP BEHM: Are there any other
12 nominations for national executive director? Are
13 there any other nominations for national
14 executive director? Are there any other
15 nominations for national executive director of
16 the Fleet Reserve Association? The nominations
17 are now closed.

18 I'd like to invite both candidates up on
19 the rostrum, podium. We will give you five
20 minutes to talk and we will have a timekeeper
21 start when you're ready. PNP Virgil, if you

1 would like to go first.

2 PNP COURNEYA: I'll let the lady go
3 first.

4 PNP JANSKY: This is the hardest speech
5 to do. I wanted to just let you know that I am
6 motivated by the potential that lies within our
7 organization in the communities we serve. Good
8 leadership means listening, learning and making
9 clear decisions. As a candidate for NED, I
10 promise to give my best to this position and to
11 serve with integrity and transparency.

12 Just to let you know a little bit, I
13 have been taking classes through the nonprofit
14 Leadership Lab on how to be an NED, and that's
15 been a whole year of doing that.

16 The FRA is not merely a collection of
17 individuals. Our strength lies in our unity and
18 shared purpose. Together we have the power to
19 drive change, inspire others and make a lasting
20 impact, all the while keeping in mind our history
21 and traditions, improve our programs, do better

1 through smart partnerships. My commitment is to
2 listen to you the shipmates. Together we can
3 build a stronger future rooted in mutual respect
4 and a shared vision for progress.

5 We need to move forward. The role of
6 NED is not one to be taken lightly. It is a
7 responsibility that requires vision, empathy and
8 unwavering dedication, and again, I pledge to
9 give you my best to this position and to serve
10 with integrity and transparency.

11 (Applause.)

12 NP BEHM: PNP Virgil Courneya.

13 PNP COURNEYA: National board,
14 shipmates, past national officers, weird to say,
15 I listened to what PNP Jansky just said, and
16 we're in the same place, I believe. But moving
17 forward, the first thing I would do is, I want to
18 see what the staff is doing up there. I want to
19 sit down with each one of them and get their
20 ideas, and see how we can better serve you as
21 shipmates, and go from there. And work with them

1 and then make sure I hear your voice, what you
2 have to say out here, and also what the national
3 president's direction is in getting the job done,
4 bringing funds in, getting us a way to go out and
5 work our grants. We already have a 501(c)(3).
6 Get that money funneled through there, bring in
7 the funds and bring up our budget.

8 Along with that, look at membership and
9 see what we can do, see what the problems are on
10 the bases, and if there is a problem, go out and
11 talk to the commanders, the master chiefs, the
12 commander of the base. I've done that in the
13 past when I was national president and had good
14 results with it, and it can be done again.

15 Get involved with our E-9s, or E-10s if
16 you want to call them that. Bring them back into
17 the fold and have them come talk to us from time
18 to time.

19 So moving forward, I would work with the
20 board, the national president, and bring our,
21 bring us into the future. So I hope you'll vote

1 for me. I could stand up here and go over all
2 the things that you've already heard all day
3 long, our membership, our funds, our budget, and
4 it won't do no good until we get out there and
5 start working at it again. We have to work at it
6 and have to work with each group and branch to
7 get things done to bring our membership up. It
8 ain't going to happen overnight, it will be a
9 time process, but I think the first thing you
10 need to do is sit down, like I said, with the
11 staff at headquarters and see what direction we
12 can go and what ideas they still have for what
13 they haven't been doing, and reinitiate a lot of
14 things that need to be done.

15 Thank you, and I hope you'll vote for
16 me.

17 (Applause.)

18 NP BEHM: I'm going to allow the same --
19 don't go back, don't go anywhere. I would like
20 to know if anybody has any questions they would
21 like to ask the candidates. This is a very

1 important position in our organization. Anybody
2 want to have a discussion, anybody has questions?
3 As I say, we don't want to hear about it once
4 everyone's elected and you don't like what's
5 going on. Are you coming, Shipmate? Shipmate
6 will be at the mic.

7 S/M HOLMES: Holmes --

8 NP BEHM: I'm sorry. And please state
9 who, if not both of them, we want to know who
10 you're talking to, they need to know who you're
11 talking to.

12 S/M HOLMES: Holmes, delegate, 269, two
13 vote. What are we going to do when the lease is
14 up?

15 PNP COURNEYA: The general consensus is
16 right now when the lease is up, we're going to
17 have to look at that time. Right now we have
18 five years, or four years to go right now. We
19 have four years and we're locked in. But we will
20 look, we'll have to look at whether we want to
21 stay in the beltway or if we want to move, either

1 way. But I think that will actually be up to the
2 members right here, the delegates that come to
3 the convention the year before our lease is up,
4 and we need to decide at that time what to do or
5 where to move.

6 PRPNC COMBS: Combs, delegate, Branch
7 161, to Shipmate Jansky. What are your ideas for
8 reducing costs at national headquarters?

9 PNP JANSKY: I don't really have any
10 ideas yet of reducing costs because I don't know
11 what is being spent exactly there. Yes, there is
12 a line on here that says X amount of dollars, but
13 not knowing where the X amount of dollars is
14 going to, how can I tell you I'm going to cut
15 this or move that, and change things around? I
16 have to get into the office first.

17 PRPNC COMBS: Shipmate Virgil, what are
18 you your ideas for enhancing the income of the
19 association?

20 PNP COURNEYA: I think first we
21 definitely have to look at how we can make our

1 501(c)(3) work for us. Go out for donations and
2 see how much money we can get there, and bring it
3 into the coffers. And after we do that, just
4 like NED Reid was talking about earlier, we've
5 got that book that we can ask everyone to look at
6 and possibly buy. It don't cost us nothing
7 except for out of you guys' pockets.

8 And go from there and then, you know,
9 reach out to the shipmates and say what ideas do
10 you have. It can't all be done at headquarters,
11 the shipmates have to give us some ideas too.
12 What can we do? Maybe the same as working for
13 the branch will work on the headquarters to bring
14 fund in. Fundraisers, family days with families
15 to bring membership up. That would be a good
16 idea to sponsor something like that from a
17 headquarters level and get all the branches
18 involved. So different ideas, but I believe we
19 need a lot of input from all the branches, and
20 possibly even the units.

21 Does that answer your question,

1 Shipmate?

2 PRPNC COMBS: Thank you, both of you.

3 S/M SPATH: Spath, Branch 17, question
4 for the two of you. What experience do you have
5 in writing grants? It's been mentioned several
6 times that's one way for different branches to
7 get money. What can you offer the branches to
8 help us write grants?

9 PNP JANSKY: I've only written one
10 grant, I did not get it. It is a learning
11 process, and if anyone has experience in writing
12 the grant, shipmates, I would gladly have you
13 come aboard and write one for us.

14 PNP COURNEYA: I want to say I've only
15 done one grant at the branch but we got it, it
16 was from Walmart. So we got that one, but like
17 the shipmate, who was that, Richmond, just like
18 the shipmate talked about, you Google it, fill in
19 the blanks, get a list, mail them out, and hope
20 like hell they're going to give you a pocket full
21 of money in that envelope when it comes back.

1 NP BEHM: All right, shipmates, thank
2 you very much.

8 Veteran Service Foundation working over time
9 amended the bylaws for the Veteran Service
10 Foundation. The national board of directors

12 the first session or second session when you went
13 through the NBRs, you ratified that approval.

14 What we have next, you've heard a lot of
15 talk about 501(c)(3) that we can use for money,
16 and we can get this for the veterans, yes, we
17 can. Right now I don't have a final tally, the
18 money is in a separate account managed by finance
19 here within the FRA. There's several steps that
20 have to be taken to take care of that money and
21 move it around, but we have probably around

1 \$12,000. I don't know what the tally is after
2 the donations. But what you will look forward to
3 now is I will get with PNP Mick and the other
4 Veteran Service Foundation board members. What
5 we need to do in accordance with the bylaws, we
6 are looking for a president, a secretary and a
7 treasurer that the VSF board of directors will
8 elect, put into office, and direct the operations
9 of the VSF Foundation through those officers.

10 So you will see on the official
11 correspondence list that comes out, hopefully
12 within the next month or two, a letter outlining
13 that and soliciting for those that want to be
14 president, secretary and treasurer of the Veteran
15 Service Foundation. So kind of think about that,
16 and branch secretaries and treasurers when that
17 comes out, please get that information out to
18 your branch so we can do that, get the VSF up and
19 running, which has been going on for too many
20 years now.

21 So thank you very much, keep the VSF in

1 mind, 501(c)(3), we have an EIM file on taxes,
2 everything like that, but that money can be used
3 to help the veterans through the Fleet Reserve
4 Association. Thank you.

5 (Applause.)

6 NP BEHM: I asked the NED to go and get
7 me a tally on exactly how much you all donated to
8 the VSF yesterday and today, and through my
9 regional branches and everything. So he went to
10 do that so it will be a few more minutes, and let
11 me see what else we have today. Are you in a
12 hurry?

13 Shipmate Jerry, is he gone? Anybody
14 else have anything else? Does anyone else have
15 anything they would like to -- oh, here comes
16 Chris Murray. Shipmate at the mic.

17 S/M MURRAY: A little update for the
18 photos tomorrow, for the official photos, this
19 area is going to get converted, we're actually
20 going to do the photos here in the Coco Room.
21 What we want you to do is come outside here, I'll

1 take your photos and you'll go right out here
2 into where the installation will take place to
3 keep it flowing as smoothly as possible. Please
4 be early and on time, because it's a very tight
5 schedule from rehearsal to the photos to the
6 actual installation to dinner, and they have a
7 very short time flipping the room in there, and
8 that's why we're doing the photos in here.

9 So please be on time ready to go. It's
10 still 1500. I'll be actually set up down here by
11 1400 so if you guys want to get your pictures
12 done and out of the way, I'll do it then. All
13 right?

14 NP BEHM: Shipmates, I'm just going to
15 inform you that the Auxiliary, the new officers
16 have adjourned for the day so we won't be
17 parading them today.

18 Shipmates at the mic.

19 PRPSC TALBOT and PRPNC SMITH: Talbot,
20 delegate, Branch 159. Smith, delegate, Branch
21 98.

1 PRPSC TALBOT: With the merger of the
2 North Central and South Central into the
3 HeartLand Region, the HeartLand Region met and
4 held an election. I as the South Central
5 president-elect withdrew, leaving David Herndon
6 as the HeartLand region as president.

7 PRPNC SMITH: I standing as the vice
8 president-elect withdrew, and Michael Russell
9 will be the HeartLand vice president.

10 NP BEHM: Thank you, shipmates.

11 (Applause.)

12 PRPSC TALBOT: That's effective at
13 installation tomorrow.

14 NP BEHM: Shipmate at the mic.

15 S/M MIGLIONIGO: Shipmate Miglionigo,
16 Branch 117 congratulates everybody for doing a
17 good job. You finally have us believing you know
18 how to turn on the shells.

19 (Laughter.)

20 NP BEHM: Would any of the branches like
21 to speak? Shipmates, you're not going to do this

1 casual I have enjoyed it.

2 Remember your commitments that you have
3 tomorrow, and don't forget the installation and
4 photos, and we have to all see you there.

5 It's been a pleasure and a very big
6 honor to serve you guys this year. I have to
7 admit, I'm a little tired of traveling. I'm
8 going to get on the cruise ship and never
9 complain again about my husband falling asleep
10 within -- oh, I have one more, you're right. The
11 new national president-elect and I both will be
12 joined in Washington, I'm leaving Sunday.

13 But anyway, it has been an honor,
14 probably one of the greatest honors of my life
15 besides the birth of my triplets, you know. And
16 I want to thank you guys for everything, all the
17 support, all the love, all the challenges, you
18 know, all the getting upset, it's part of the
19 game, I'm a mother.

20 (Laughter.)

21 Anyway, I am here if you need me, I'll

1 be here for another year with our new board, and
2 I will help them, direct them, and I will still
3 call on those PNPs that are dear to us. And also
4 all you shipmates who should be stepping up to
5 continue this going on. I'm going to continue
6 that challenge of getting new members, I
7 personally like I said, got 15 myself last week
8 and it can be done. But God bless you all and
9 thank you so much for allowing me to have one of
10 the biggest parts of my life fulfilled with you
11 guys. Thank you.

12 (Applause.)

13 NP-ELECT FETRO: Shipmates, the board of
14 directors for this year, could you please meet me
15 in the headquarters room for a minute, except for
16 you? Thank you.

17 NP BEHM: The current board of
18 directors, okay. That would be Anger, Brian, the
19 current -- Talbot, all of you guys, outgoing.
20 National President-Elect, your instructions have
21 to be accurate and right to the point. I am

1 leaving all these wonderful shipmates and my mind
2 is kind of flustered. I have been nonstop, I've
3 answered phone calls the entire time. I eat,
4 sleep and breathe my shipmates, that my husband
5 can tell you. I'll probably still wake up in the
6 middle of the night for doing it.

7 Yes, Shipmate, I will entertain a
8 motion.

9 JPNP ROBBINS: I move to adjourn.

10 (Chorus of seconds.)

11 NP BEHM: Shipmate National Chaplain,
12 for the last time for me.

13 NCHAP FALU: Shipmate National
14 President, the Bible is now closed.

15 NP BEHM: Thank you, Shipmate. We now
16 stand in recess.
