2	(8:30 a.m.)
3	FEMALE SPEAKER: Requesting a roll call vote.
4	Requires four seconds.
5	MALE SPEAKER: Three. Three seconds standing by,
6	okay.
7	FEMALE SPEAKER: It requires four delegates
8	seconds. Four delegates.
9	MALE SPEAKER: Okay. At this time the Chair
10	requests that the Credentials Committee provide a third report
11	if there's been any changes to report even earlier at this
12	Convention. (inaudible) Lazzaretti.
13	At the mic.
14	MR. LAZZARETTI: Good morning, Shipmates.
15	GROUP: Good morning.
16	MR. LAZZARETTI: This is the third Credentials
17	Report for the 90th National Convention. With the change of
18	branch status for Branch 170. Voting straight is now 1413.
19	Number of branches represented by delegates, 74. Number of
20	votes represented by delegates, 854. Number of branches
21	registered by proxy, 118. Number of votes registered by proxy,

1 Number of branches not registered, we are here. Number of delegates registered, 133. Again, 2 registered voting strength is 1413. Number of votes not 3 registered, zero. Two-thirds vote, 942. Majority vote is 707. 4 MALE SPEAKER: (inaudible) Branch 93, second. 5 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Okay. It's been moved and 6 7 seconded to accept the 3rd Credentials Report from the 90th National Convention. Discussion? 8 All in favor of receiving, signify by saying -9 10 GROUP: Aye. NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Opposed? Thank you. 11 12 (General conversation.) 13 FEMALE SPEAKER: Delegate, Branch 38. I challenge 14 the vote on honorary membership for Branch 170. There was no clear two-thirds vote on that particular branch. So I request 15 you (inaudible) 16 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Proceed. 17 MR. LAZZARETTI: Lazzaretti, Branch East, delegate, 18 seconds. 19 Vatter, Branch 93, delegate, second. 20 ME. VATTER: (inaudible) 21

1 ME. MARTIN: Gil Martin, 207, delegate, seconds. We've got four branches. 2 MALE SPEAKER: MALE SPEAKER: Branch 24, seconds. 3 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: All right. We have the 4 required amount of seconds. 5 FEMALE SPEAKER: All you need is a tally Committee. 6 7 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Okay. We didn't appoint a 8 tally Committee. Did you just volunteer? I didn't mean to. 9 MALE SPEAKER: 10 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: We have great expectations. Do we have a second volunteer from another branch, different 11 12 region? 13 FEMALE SPEAKER: You should have at least two. NATIONAL PRESIDENT: We'll take a third if anyone 14 wants to volunteer. Okay. Mitch, please. 15 (General conversation.) 16 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: I'll have Bill. I'll have, 17 hold on one second. We'd like to go ahead and talk of your next 18 year's Convention while we get ourselves settled. Are you 19 20 ready? You have at least five minutes right now to wait and 21

1 get set up. I don't want anyone in recess. All right, fantastic. 2 MALE SPEAKER: NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Shipmate, your name? 3 Valerie Tooma, delegate, Branch 24. If MS. TOOMA: 4 on the resolution of honorary membership for the first one, it 5 should be three? 6 7 FEMALE SPEAKER: Just one. 8 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: You're challenging the one Shipmate? They're not challenging all. I understand the 9 10 request is challenging one Shipmate, not all three. 11 FEMALE SPEAKER: Right, but. NATIONAL PRESIDENT: We passed all three 12 13 separately. 14 FEMALE SPEAKER: But two-thirds vote. So we're going to challenge the first one that all three (inaudible) 15 FEMALE SPEAKER: No, they weren't. He's only 16 challenging the one. 17 That's all we vote on. NATIONAL PRESIDENT: We're just going to challenge 18 the one. Thank you. 19 20 FEMALE SPEAKER: I don't want to challenge the other two. 21

1 (General conversation.) NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Your attention, please. 2 3 morning, Shipmates. GROUP: Good morning. 4 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: I'm PNP Leonard Boudreaux from 5 Branch 275, Hangtown, California. Chairman for the 91st 6 7 National Convention, next year. 8 In San Antonio Texas, the dates for the Convention, September 23rd through 30th, 2018. Sunday through Saturday. 9 10 That's pre-Board on the 22nd; the Post Board will be on the 11 21st. It's going to be at the Omni Hotel at Colonnade. 12 13 Room rates \$105 plus tax. Honored a rate three days prior to 14 and three days after. The rooms are blocked and they'll hold the rooms until Monday, 3 September. 15 There's an airport in San Antonio approximately 8 16 miles from the hotel. Complimentary shuttle for the hotel to 17 and from the airport. This complimentary shuttle can 18 take you within five miles of the hotel, to and from. Besides 19 20 the airport. Those who need valet shuttle it's a discounted 21 rate of \$10 per day.

1	The first newsletter is sitting on a table
2	downstairs, (inaudible) and they have an 800 phone number for
3	the hotel for reservations. The Committee has a website at the
4	hotel and it's been active since April.
5	You can make your reservation by going to the
6	website. When you make it, you make your reservation by phone,
7	make sure you mention the Fleet Reserve Association to get
8	discounted rates.
9	(General conversation.)
10	NATIONAL PRESIDENT: This Convention is being put
11	on by the FRA National Committee and all profits and losses will
12	be borne by the FRA. (inaudible) putting anything on. Branch
13	201, San Antonio has volunteered to do a hospitality room for
14	us.
15	Of some interest, people, the hospitality room is
16	twice as large as the one they have here. It's up on the 20th
17	floor overlooking the City of San Antonio.
18	Do you have any questions?
19	Yes, Shipmate?
20	MALE SPEAKER: What is the tax rate?
21	NATIONAL PRESIDENT: The tax rate is 16.75 percent.

1 There are 10 handicapped rooms. So the people requiring handicap rooms, make sure you call and make your reservations 2 3 first or as soon as you can. Any more questions? 4 If not, thank you, Shipmates. Shipmate, ask for a 5 mic. 6 7 MALE SPEAKER: (inaudible) President (inaudible) 8 Branch 298, delegate. A question or a clarification. This request was for a week tally roll call vote. The expectation 9 10 that all votes that were cast yesterday be cast again, please, 11 today. Going through the roll call process. Is this open 12 13 or was it reconsidered. It was just calling for a roll call 14 vote. It wasn't a whole new motion on the floor. Is there expected changes on this? Can we get an explanation? 15 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Shipmate, great question. 16 Thank you. And we'll have an answer for you here. My 17 18 understanding is that each Shipmate, each Shipmate will address the microphone and identify themselves and cast one vote for 19 20 themselves. One vote for themselves. I'm not concerned about how many delegates, how many proxies? It's each Shipmate in the 21

1 hall get one vote. GROUP: Nooo! 2 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: You're saying no as per the 3 Constitution and Bylaws or you're saying no because that's not 4 what you want. 5 This is not personal. This is Robert's Rules of 6 7 Order. We all have our Robert's Rules of Order, right. (inaudible) We run by Robert's Rules. Each Shipmate will have 8 one voice vote. 9 (General conversation.) 10 11 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Shipmate Meyer. We will do 12 this vote as we do, always do our votes, by roll call vote by 13 the delegates. 14 MALE SPEAKER: In accordance with our Constitution and Bylaws, Section 306 (inaudible) I want to read you all the 15 blah, blah, where it says by a two-thirds vote, the 16 delegates. 17 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: I'm sorry. I just made my 18 correction by myself. Many people are responding on my error. 19 20 But thank for you due diligence in bringing the correction to me at the rear - front mic. 21

1 MALE SPEAKER: (inaudible) Delegate. Are we going to do this alphabetically or by membership number? 2 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: No, no. I was incorrect 3 earlier. (inaudible) the highest rank which would be Branch 4 386. 382. Okay. 5 Shipmates, your attention, please. The way we're 6 7 going to do this, we're going to have the highest Branch only 8 382, to expedite this. We can provide this to them and come back tomorrow or we can go ahead and make sure we know what 9 10 Branch number we are. Get in line at the rear mic and front mic and you 11 12 know how many votes you're voting for. Okay. Could you make that a little -13 MALE SPEAKER: 14 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: (inaudible). MALE SPEAKER: Delegate 269. Can we have a few 15 minutes to caucus? (inaudible) 16 Where's Shipmate Bilner. 17 FEMALE SPEAKER: Branch 170. 18 Shipmates, please. 19 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Shipmates, sit down. Past 20 FEMALE SPEAKER: (inaudible) club manager for the honorary membership. This 21

1	management over the years has had, we've had problems with
2	Branch 170 and club management who run the Branch. They've had
3	their (inaudible) pulled twice by regional officers in the last
4	10 years. Right now we're going to reinstate the Branch 170
5	after they had their EIN problem.
6	They were using a DINs for the (inaudible) the
7	Branch and the club, all the same one. We just recently
8	developed that change by the suspension (inaudible) statement
9	rescinding. This club manager is the only one answering my
10	emails instead of the Branch officers.
11	By giving her honorary membership, you were giving
12	them an indication that it's okay for her to run their Branch.
13	And the regional officers from Mary and (inaudible) breakfast,
14	Hazel Bretinborg, Past Regional President with Mr. Lazzaretti,
15	and myself for 12, 20, 13 years. And all had to go fix this
16	Branch's operation between the Club and the Branch.
17	To me I've tried to talk him out of putting her up
18	for an honorary membership. But they still wanted to do it. I
19	objected to it. I handled it to go through because they still
20	insisted. It was their submission.
21	The only reason I found out about it is it was sent

back to me by Headquarters for confirmation and proper format. 1 And I talked to the Branch President at that time. And their 2 objection, they still wanted to do it so I objected and then 3 Branch 38 member says (inaudible) 2003 I object to this. That 4 is my reason for calling for those two-thirds majority vote on 5 this particular branch honorary member. 6 7 Any questions? (inaudible) Branch 62, 8 MALE SPEAKER: Yes. delegate. Did you bring up the subject at the meeting when they 9 10 were considering this application? 11 MALE SPEAKER: No, because I was holding my own 12 Committee. That's right. 13 MALE SPEAKER: Did you send anyone there? 14 FEMALE SPEAKER: No. Did the Committee know anything 15 MALE SPEAKER: about what you're talking about? 16 Probably not. I don't believe FEMALE SPEAKER: 17 anybody else was in there. I think one of our people from the 18 Northwest was (inaudible); one was in another branch. 19 20 MALE SPEAKER: This information that you're giving should have been given to that Committee. 21

1	Branch 46.
2	MALE SPEAKER: You're looking for this person that
3	is running for honorary membership would then have the power to
4	take over the grants and all that. If I'm not mistaken,
5	honorary members do not have a right to hold office. Nor do
6	they participate in a Branch meeting. Am I correct?
7	FEMALE SPEAKER: That is correct, but this
8	particular, this particular Branch ignores those rules.
9	NATIONAL PRESIDENT: That is a complete (inaudible)
10	MALE SPEAKER: I need now someone from Branch 170
11	that submitted resolution on behalf of this individual. Or the
12	delegate or a proxy.
13	FEMALE SPEAKER: I'm the delegate proxy.
14	NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Would you care to speak on
15	behalf of this incl, coming in here with his or her papers?
16	
17	FEMALE SPEAKER: For 170 I would, yes.
18	NATIONAL PRESIDENT: In behalf of the (inaudible)
19	as directed. Please get to a microphone.
20	MS. BURKE: Burke. Delegate. Branch Delegate,
21	proxy to 170. I as directed, I have to vote for her for 170.

But as Branch 38 delegate, I don't have to. 170? No, we don't 1 have words for what she's saying. 2 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: You have answered. All right. 3 Rear mic. 4 MALE SPEAKER: Delegate, 335 and I think the whole 5 thing is ridiculous. 170 is not your (inaudible) 6 7 (Applause) Under advisement, we'll let our 8 MALE SPEAKER: order again proceed. The vote will stand as approved. 9 10 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Oh, Budget and Finance, are we 11 ready. Tally Committee, you are dismissed. Thank you very 12 much. We need to extend our state here. 13 Okay. As the Budget Chairman I'll bring to the 14 podium I know for the most part, those are really concerned taking a look at the budget during this week. And I say that in 15 all honesty from years in the past, I didn't always look at it. 16 17 Please pay attention. This is the money, this is part of the reason we went from a 30-year membership or 40-year membership 18 last year with finances. And \$10 didn't make a great list but 19 20 it's moved us forward in hopes of our budget and your budget, you hear a lot about the budget and membership. 21

1	Did you all attend the Membership meeting this
2	morning at 7:30?
3	MALE SPEAKER: Some did.
4	NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Raise of hands? Did you get
5	anything out of it? From the back regions and branches, make it
6	happen. These are yours and my association.
7	Shipmate, you have a mic.
8	MALE SPEAKER: Shipmate National President,
9	Shipmates. I presented the changes to the budget yesterday. I
10	hope you all took care of them. There may be a few delegates
11	here who were not in the house as of yesterday. If you would
12	like I will go over them. There's two definitive changes.
13	For the benefit of those who were not here
14	yesterday, if you will go to your budgets under Tab 2, line item
15	57250070. They will make the candidate change. It says on the
16	far right-hand side, proposed budget, \$9,000. Change that to
17	\$10. 10. That's \$8,990 decrease. Are you with me so far?
18	If you've completed that, go to line item 50500010
19	Bravo. Life membership fee should say \$1,500. Right-hand
20	column. Decrease that to \$200. It's a decrease of \$1,300. Is
21	everybody with me.

Bottom line all the way to the end of your budget, 1 it should state the proposed budget of \$3,607,126. Should now 2 read \$3,596,836. That being said, I will now read my Committee 3 Report. 4 MALE SPEAKER: National Convention Committee Budget 5 and Finance, met I Salon Delta of the Delta Hotels, Baltimore, 6 7 hunt Valley, hunt Valley, Maryland, on Thursday, September 21, 2017. That's 0903. 8 In attendance were the Chairman, Past National 9 10 President from Branch 8. Members Past Regional President of the 11 East Coast, W. G. Butler, Branch 141. Past Regional President 12 South East, Gerald, Jerry Butler, or Jerry Brice, Branch 187. 13 Past Regional President Southwest, Michael Fulton, 14 Branch 289. Shipmate Robert Baer, Branch 269 was excused for medical reasons. Past Regional President, West Coast, Nathan 15 Nash, Joe Nash, Branch 192 was excused from unexpected heavy job 16 commitments. 17 The advisors, finance officer, Brian Proctor, 18 visitors, Past National President, George Kay, Branch 254. 19 20 Shipmate George Cleveland, Branch 208. Past Regional President, West Coast, Richard Petro, Branch 101. National Vice President 21

William Starkey, Branch 057. Shipmate S. D. Martin, Branch 166. 1 Regional Treasurer South Central, Nicole Talbot, Branch 159. 2 Junior Past National President, Virgil Courneya, 3 Branch 274. Shipmate Tom Dooley, Branch 136. Past Regional 4 President East Coast, Paul Gunther, Branch 182. 5 As stated, the Committee recommends the following 6 7 changes to the 2018 Proposed Budget. As I read to you line item 57250070 be decreased to \$10. Line item 505000-10 Bravo be 8 reduced to \$200. Our bottom line in Post 2018 Budget to 9 10 \$3,596,836. The Committee also recommends that the Finance 11 12 Officer place the total amount of the account number, as a total 13 of all sub-line item numbers. If you still have your budget open to you, on the first portion where I was talking about, if 14 you go to the Budget Expense items, the first one where we get 15 the 5050, well, it's right above, 505000 cash 10. At the top of 16 that line if you add the items up where it says \$3,200, \$2,800, 17 that comes to a total of \$6,000. 18 We're requesting that they put that total in on all 19 20 of these budgeted line items so that you know what the totals

21

are and you don't have to sit and calculate it on your own as we

1 go down the budget. That is the recommendation from the Budget and 2 Finance Committee. Make it a little easier for our Shipmates. 3 There was no further business with the Shipmates or Committee 4 members, no information, further information or suggestions 5 under the order, and with no further business, the chair 6 7 adjourned the Committee at 10:40. Loyalty, protection, and service, Past National President Gary C. Blackburn, Chairman, 8 Budget and Finance Committee. 9 10 That being said, Shipmates, I make the motion that 11 we accept the 2018 Proposed Budget. VOICE: As amended? 12 13 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: I'm sorry, adopt the 2018 14 Proposed Budget. MR. IPPERT: Ippert, Branch 46, I second the motion 15 as amended. 16 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Shipmate, to the rear mic. 17 MALE SPEAKER: Shipmate National President, 18 Collins, delegate, Branch 161. 19 20 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Yes, Shipmate? (inaudible) 21 MALE SPEAKER:

1	NATIONAL PRESIDENT: I'm sorry?
2	MALE SPEAKER: Income over income, line 11. It has
3	the building, 3rd floor (inaudible) parking.
4	NATIONAL PRESIDENT: I'm hoping it does but wait a
5	minute.
6	MALE SPEAKER: The Finance Officer isn't here.
7	FEMALE SPEAKER: He's saying yes.
8	NATIONAL PRESIDENT: It should be yes on that.
9	FEMALE SPEAKER: Yes, it is.
10	NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Oh there he is. Okay. The
11	answer is yes, Shipmates. Occasionally we have to separate him.
12	FEMALE SPEAKER: Got another question.
13	MALE SPEAKER: Delegate. For discussion do we not
14	change the total income to reflect the changes?
15	NATIONAL PRESIDENT: I'm sorry?
16	MALE SPEAKER: For the total income, should we not
17	change that to reflect the budget?
18	NATIONAL PRESIDENT: That does not change the
19	income, Shipmate. We only change the, what we are proposed to
20	spend. Unfortunately, we cannot add to our income as much as we
21	would like to and I certainly do not want to decrease our

1 income. No, but in the, when you add the 2 MALE SPEAKER: 3 other one, maybe it will be covered. NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Pardon? 4 MALE SPEAKER: The balance (inaudible) 5 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: All on the income side of the 6 7 house, the bottom line. 8 MALE SPEAKER: Does it not have to equal (inaudible) 9 10 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: 3607126 is the income. That 11 was -FEMALE SPEAKER: That doesn't change. 12 13 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: That is the proposed income. 14 That is not the proposed expense, Shipmate. (General conversation.) 15 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Shipmate? 16 Shipmate President, Shipmate MALE SPEAKER: 17 Blackburn, Fulton Delegate, 289. I believe what he's talking 18 about is to make sure that the totals of the income match the 19 20 expenditures on the right-hand column. If that is the case, then the decrease should come 21

out of line item 13 which is your restricted reserve which is 1 the tax liable reserve fund. 2 MALE SPEAKER: Right. It comes out of the reserve 3 fund. Subtracted from the reserve fund. Right. 4 What we would reduce would be the \$80,990 plus the 5 \$1300 are coming out of the restricted funds, no it's coming out 6 7 of, I don't remember, is it coming out of restricted or (inaudible), restricted, yes? 8 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Right. 9 10 MALE SPEAKER: So we would be to decrease and I 11 don't have my calculator. Does my Finance Officer have his calculator running for me? 12 13 409625. (inaudible) 14 Is everybody with me? I apologize 15 MALE SPEAKER: for not updating that portion. 16 FEMALE SPEAKER: Can you repeat that again? 17 MALE SPEAKER: 409625. That's on the reserve fund 18 which would make the bottom line the same as was - turn the 19 20 page. The bottom line on that would be 3596836. \$3,596,836 is the estimated income available. That would be what would be 21

1	drawn. Are we on the same page? Am I on the same page with
2	you?
3	MALE SPEAKER: Shipmate National President,
4	(inaudible) 207. I thank the Chairman of the Budget Planning
5	Committee for making the adjustments to item 13. Just a point
6	for clarification. So the Shipmates understand.
7	On this income page, lines 12 and 13 are being, in
8	effect, borrowed from our own pocket, to make the budget
9	balance. We're borrowing from our investment money so this
10	truly isn't income. The Bylaws allow us to borrow from
11	ourselves. So in reality, we're still three quarters of a
12	million dollars in deficit budget. Thank you.
13	NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Precisely. Thank you for
14	explaining that Shipmate. There's a motion on the floor, it's
15	been seconded and we went immediately into discussion. Any
16	further discussion?
17	On the question. All in favor of adopting the
18	Budget of 2017-2018, the 2018 Budget, please signify by saying
19	yay.
20	GROUP: Yay.
21	NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Opposed? Thank you.

1	(General conversation.)
2	NATIONAL PRESIDENT: All the first-time convention
3	Shipmates, please rise again. First time Shipmates. All right.
4	We didn't lose any, right?
5	(Applause)
6	NATIONAL PRESIDENT: If you weren't at the 101 on
7	Wednesday morning, you did not receive my card. Please see me
8	during the Convention here. I earnestly want your feedback and
9	what you thought of the convention. What was the highlight that
10	you liked or what you were confused on.
11	If you were helped by the Shipmates and what you
12	might have suggestions for us. Your voices, we seriously
13	appreciate it and make sure you come back again next year.
14	Shipmates, there was a National Board resolution
15	that was adopted yesterday and needs ratification. National
16	Board Resolution 37-17, RESOLVED, the National Board of
17	Directors ratifies the Bylaws of the Fleet Reserve Association
18	Veterans Service Foundation by a vote of 12-0. Shipmates now
19	present.
20	Again, the ratification has been read.
21	MALE SPEAKER: Shipmate National President.

1 (inaudible) Branch 18 Delegate, may we have the number. NATIONAL PRESIDENT: 37-17. 37 dash 17. 2 MALE SPEAKER: Thank you. (inaudible). 3 Shipmate National President, MALE SPEAKER: 4 (inaudible) Delegate 269, second. 5 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Thank you, Shipmate. We have 6 7 a motion. We have a second. Discussion? There being none, all in favor of accepting, 8 ratifying the NBR. 9 10 (Inaudible) MALE SPEAKER: Okay. (inaudible) Just an 11 12 announcement. All those who signed up for (inaudible) please be 13 at the lobby by 1730 for those who signed up for the casinos and 14 the baseball game (inaudible). So please be here at 5:30 because we leave very promptly because of the traffic. Thank you. 15 (General conversation.) 16 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Let's take a 15-minute recess. 17 If you have your checks for the Disaster Relief Program, please 18 come forward, get your picture taken and stand by. Okay. Stand 19 20 by. (3 raps) 21

1 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: National Chaplain, please come forward and close the Bible. 2 Shipmate President, the Bible NATIONAL CHAPLAIN: 3 is closed. 4 Thank you, Shipmate Chaplain. NATIONAL PRESIDENT: 5 Now in recess for 10 minutes, 15 minutes. 15 minutes. 6 7 (General conversation.) 8 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: At this time I move that my, the National President's Annual Report 2017 - 2016-2017 be 9 10 received. Can I get a second, please? Give me a second. MALE SPEAKER: (inaudible) Delegate 259, second. 11 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Thank you. Motion to receive 12 13 National President's Report has been seconded. Discussion? All in favor of receiving the report signify by 14 15 saying yay. GROUP: 16 Yay. Opposed? (inaudible) NATIONAL PRESIDENT: 17 (inaudible) 18 NATIONAL PRESIDENT: Is Shipmate Slawinski in the 19 hall? 20 (General conversation.) 21
